HISTORIC SKETCH



OT least amongst the many features of natural beauty of which Owen Sound may reasonably congratulate herself, are the magnificent double-tiered hills, at the base and on the first terrace of which is built the splendidly substantial metropolis of the south shores of the Georgian Bay. Those who chose the site of this embryo city may have had some conception in their minds of the magnificent possibilities, even when the dense forest covered the area. When the first white settlers came nearly three-quarters of a century ago, and descended into the valley, they

may have been more concerned for their personal safety and sustenance than for the future possibilities of the little hamlet which grew on the banks of the silvery stream; but could they have seen the transformation of a half dozen decades, with the advancement from the tallow dip and the pine knot to the electric light, from the slowly conveyed missive by ox team to the latest long distance phone equipment, from the rudely constructed ox-jumper to the parlor car of the great railways, they might have grasped the meaning of the advancement from the crude home nursing of the log-cabin and the early science of the pioneer physician, to the splendidly equipped bospital and an efficient trained staff and the present day skilled surgeon and learned medical practitioner. The association of these magnificent surroundings, which have given the town a wide reputation for its natural beauty, with the great modern medical institution, the Owen Sound General and Marine Hospital, is natural, for one of the most superb locations






on the foot hills was wisely chosen as the site. In the division of the town by the surveyors, a triangular piece of ground was formed in the effort to supply the arteries of local travel, the base of which was on Scott Street, named after one of the early distinguished citizens, the late ex-Mayor and Member of the Legislature, Thomas Scott. The land formed only one part of a large area, which for some time beckoned the growing population to seek sites for cozy homes. Paynter Street, another thoroughfare named after an early prominent resident, Charles Paynter, now of London, Eng., was opened up, and with its easy grade intersected Scott Street about the centre of the base of the triangle. In the year 1885, after the citizens had been aroused by a threatened invasion of an infectious disease, the question of supplying the growing town with modern quarters for the reception of the sick and injured, which a rapidly increasing population accentuated, was first seriously discussed, and the Board of Health, then under the chairmanship of the late Venerable Archdeacon Mulholland, took up the matter of the erection of an hospital. Many sites and buildings were given prominence, but finally the triangle at the head of Paynter Street was suggested. Such opposition as was manifested at the inception soon gave place to the recognition that up on the green slope, far from the noise of traffic of vehicle, train, or boat, with a splendid view-point of the beautiful broadening expanse of the Owen Sound bay and portions of the growing town, an ideal site had been found for the institution which had become so apparent a need. Although the danger of the first infection passed, as the years went by another epidemic of as serious a character threatened the town with increasing virulence and consequent mortality. President Allan Cameron, M. D., in his most recent report, referring to the conditions which existed, says: "To render the condition more serious, nurses were scarce, and for want of that constant attention required to be given in an intelligent manner, n any lost their lives," Under those distressing circumstances the question arose, "What is to be done to relieve the misery under which the people are suffering?" As it was evident that something must be done, and as the Board of Health had no treasury from which to draw funds, it was a serious question to face, and one to which for a time the members felt unable to give an answer, as it was beyond a doubt that a hospital and nurses were the requisites the situation demanded.

In this dilemma it was asked at one of the meetings: "Who was there that would give one hundred dollars toward the proposed hospital?" and the late Frederick D'Orr LePan took the initiative and placed his name on the subscription

list for one hundred dollars. The money was deposited in the bank to the credit of the Hospital Fund. After the selection of the property, Dr. Cameron and Mr. Forster were directed to visit the hospitals at Guelph, Galt. Brantford. Stratford, Collingwood, and other points, if necessary, with a view to deciding upon plans for the proposed buildings, From that time the work was kept prominently before the people of the county and town, and about the end of Sentember, 1891, Drs. Barnhart, McCullough and Cameron were appointed a committee to confer with the architect and advertise for tenders. In July of the succeeding year, funds to the amount of \$7006.88 having been subscribed. the tender of Mr. Alex, Green for \$7197 was accepted, with Messrs, Christie & Agar as sub-contractors for the heating and plumbing. In March the building was commenced, and on June 16th following, the corner stone was laid with Masonic honors by Most Worshipful Grand Master John Ross Robertson, the event being one of the most imposing ever witnessed in Owen Sound. The building progressed rapidly, and on June 21st, 1903, it was opened with appropriate ceremonies. In the opening address, President S. J. Parker gave a most interesting review of the movement leading up to the establishment of the hospital, and urged the necessity of the broadest liberality in supporting the institution. The late Mr. William Roy, who had heen the President of the Board for a considerable period after the inception of the movement, and who had been made Honorary President, prefaced his address by handing to the President a cheque for five hundred dollars, and expressed the hope that the full financial requirements of the hosnital would be met by a generous public. Warden Rogers was pleased that among the residents of the county of which he had the honor to be Warden, there were those who had the courage and perseverance to carry to a successful completion the noble and philanthropic work. Other addresses concluded a most auspicious opening ceremony. The first year was sufficient to demonstrate the great usefulness of the existence of the hospital, and thirty-seven patients were admitted. Each succeeding year the number has grown steadily, until during the past hospital year, from September 1903 to September 1904, no less than three hundred and nineteen patients were admitted. In the management under each succeeding lady superintendent, the efficiency has been unquestioned, and the excellent results have given the Owen Sound Hospital a reputation high in the list of such institutions in the Province. Following President Parker, during whose incumbency the building was erected and the business procedure established with the retiring President's recognized executive ability, the position of chief executive officer of the Trust Board fell on the
