Astronomical Notices for the Year 1897

On the left hand page of each month are given the rising and setting of the Sun, and the length of the day, also the data required for Solar observations, namely, the Equation of Time (that is the difference between variable Sun Time and uniform Clock Time to be added or subtracted according as one is behind or ahead of the other) also the Sun's Declination, at the instant of Mean Noon, Greenwich Time, and the Sun's apparent semi-diameter to the nearest tenth of a second. With these exceptions all the calculations are reduced to the nearest minute of Local Mean Time at Charlottetown (Latitude 46° 13' 55" N., Longitude 63° 7' 33" W; giving 4hs. 12min. 29.5sec. difference slow on Greenwich time).

The Meridian Altitude of the Sun (or Moon) for any day of the year by applying the Declination to the co-Latitude of the place adding the Declination if North, subtracting if South. For example—To find the Mer. Alt. of the Sun at Charlottetown on the longest and shortest day of the year:

From the Sun's apparent semi-diameter, the Sun's Horizontal Parallax (that is the Sun's apparent semi-diameter as seen from the Sun's distance) may be found dividing by 107.44 the proportion the Sun's actual diameter bears to that of the Earth. Thus we find for July, when the Sun's distance is greatest, $\frac{15' 45'' 3}{107.44} = 9'.45.3 = 8'.791$. Also on Dec. 31, when the sun is nearest the Semi-diameter $16' 17''.5$ gives $9''.077$ for Parallax.

On the right hand page for each month are given the Phases of the Moon, with its Rising, Southing and Setting, with the time of High Water at Charlottetown to the nearest full minute of local mean time.

To assist in weather forecasts are added the Moon's Perigee and Apogee, the time of crossing the Equator and of reaching its greatest North and South Declination, these periods being found to be accompanied by atmospheric changes, more or less marked as they agree with the Moon's changes and Perigee. When two or more of these influences concur within the space of 48 hours, it is indicated by ** or *** accordingly.

ECLIPSES

There will be two Eclipses of the Sun during the year, both annular, the latter only being partially visible at Charlottetown. They are,—

(I.) An Annular Eclipse of the Sun. February 1, Greenwich mean time of conjunction Feb. 1st, Sh. 6m. 41.6 sec. The central line of the Moon's shadow passing from the north point of New Zealand, across the Pacific Ocean, New Granada, Venezuela, to the island of Trinidad. Visible as a partial eclipse to the greater part of South America, Mexico, the south part of the United States, as far as New York.


(II.) An Annular Eclipse of the Sun July 29, Greenwich mean time of conjunction in Right Ascension 3h. 59m. 50.5sec., mean time Charlottetown, 11h. 45m. 21sec. a. m. The central line of Moon's shadow passes across Mexico, the north coast of Cuba, Porto Rico, Guadalupe to Cape St. Roque. Visible as a partial eclipse to the greater part of South America and North America, as far as the south coast of Hudson Bay, Labrador, Newfoundland, to the West Coast of Africa.

LUNAR OCCULTATIONS

There will be two occultations of Mars by the Moon, but neither favorable for observation here. They will

(I.) April 9th, Charlottetown, mean time of Conjunction in Right Ascension, 5h. 15m. 46sec. a. m. Moon below the horizon.

(II.) May 7, Charlottetown, mean time 5h. 30.37 p. m., broad daylight.

THE PLANETS

Mercury will commence the year with alternate direct and retrograde motion between the dates January 12, February 2nd, May 9th, June 2nd, September 8th and 30th, and December 27th, coming in conjunction with the Sun, Inferior, January 22nd, Superior, April 1st, Inferior, May 20th, Superior, July 15th, Inferior, September 22nd, Superior, November 7th. His conjunction with the other planets will be with Venus, April 16th; Neptune, June 29th; Jupiter, August 12th, September 24th and October 5th; Mars, November 12th, Saturn, November 13th and Uranus, November 21st.

Venus commences the year as an evening star with direct motion till April 7th, retrograde till May 17th, and direct till the end of the year; coming to inferior conjunction with the Sun, afterward reappearing as a morning star to the year's end. Her planetary conjunction will be with Mercury, April 16th; Neptune, July 28th; Jupiter, October 19th; Uranus, December 8th; Saturn, December 12th; Mars, December 30th.

Mars will be an evening star with retrograde motion till April 15th, afterwards direct till the end of the year, coming in conjunction with the Sun November 20th, afterward reappearing as a morning star. In conjunction with Neptune February 19th; with Jupiter, July 25th; Uranus, November 20th; Saturn, November 27th.

Jupiter will be a morning star till his opposition to the sun February 23rd; an evening star till his conjunction, September 12th. He comes in conjunction with Mars July 25th; with Mercury, August 12th, September 25th, and October 5th; and Venus, October 19th.

Saturn and Uranus are still close companions, the latter falling behind about 25 minutes right ascension in the course of the year. Commence as morning stars till their opposition to the sun in May, and as evening stars till November. Have no intercourse with the other planets except the conjunctions with Mars, Venus and Mercury, as noted above.

Neptune will be an evening star till his conjunction with the Sun, June 10th, the other conjunctions have been noted above.

This minute planet requires the aid of a powerful telescope to be observed. The best guide to his position will be as last year, his conjunction with Mars, February 19th, when he will be 4° south of that planet.

2. The phases happening from 4 to 10 p. m. may be followed by fair weather, but this chiefly depends upon the direction of the wind.
3. If a storm arises from the east on or immediately preceding the Spring Equinox, or a week after, the following Spring or Summer will be wet four times out of five; if from the West, North or South-west, the Spring and Summer will be dry five times out of six.

The Queen

Her Majesty Victoria, by the Grace of God, of the United Kingdom of Great Britain, and Ireland, Queen, Defender of the Faith, Empress of India (in India *Kaisar-i-Hind*), born 24th May, 1819, succeeded to the throne 20th June, 1837, on the death of her uncle, King William IV; crowned 28th June, 1838, married 10th February, 1840, to His late Royal Highness, Francis Albert Augustus Charles Emmanuel, Prince Consort, Duke of Saxony, Prince of Cobourg and Gotha.

The Royal Lineage

Tracing Her Majesty's claim to the throne back to her decent from the Tudors, it is seen that it arises from the marriage of Margaret Tudor, eldest daughter of Henry VII, with James IV, King of Scotland; their son became James V of Scotland, who left an only child, Mary, Queen of Scots. Her marriage with Lord Darnley resulted in the birth of James VI of Scotland, and I. of England. Upon the death of Queen Anne, daughter of James II, without issue, the succession to the Crown devolved upon the House of Hanover.

The Prince and Princess of Wales

His Royal Highness Albert Edward, Prince of Wales, Duke of Saxony, Cornwall and Rothesay, Earl of Dublin, &c.; born 9th November, 1841; married 10th March, 1863, to the Princess Alexandra Caroline Mary Charlotte Louise Julia, (born 1st December, 1844), eldest daughter of the King of Denmark.

Children of Queen Victoria

I. Princess Victoria (Empress Dowager of Germany), born Nov. 21, 1840; married Jan. 25, 1858, to Prince Frederick Wilhelm (Frederick III, Emperor of Germany), eldest son of Wilhelm I, German Emperor and King of Prussia; widow June 15, 1888.

II. Albert Edward, Prince of Wales, born Nov. 9, 1841. (See Prince of Wales).

III. Princess Alice Maud Mary, born April 23, 1843; married July 1, 1862, to H. R. H. Louis IV, Grand Duke of Hesse. Five children: Alfred Victoria Alberta, born April 5, 1863; Elizabeth, born Nov. 1, 1864; Irene, born July 11, 1866; Ernest Louis, born Nov. 25, 1868; Alexandra Victoria, born June 6, 1872. Princess Alice died Dec. 14, 1878.

IV. Prince Alfred, Duke of Edinburgh, born Aug. 6, 1844; married Jan. 21, 1874, to Grand Duchess Marie of Russia, only daughter of Emperor Alexander II. Five children: Alfred born October 15, 1874; Marie, born Oct. 29, 1875; Victoria, born Nov. 25, 1876; Alexandra, born Sept. 1, 1878; Beatrice, born April 30, 1884. In August, 1893, upon the death of his uncle, Duke Ernest, brother to the Prince Consort, the Duke of Edinburgh succeeded to the title and estates of the hereditary Dukedom of Coburg and Gotha, and is now known as H. R. H. Duke Alfred of Cobourg-Gotha.

V. Princess Helena, born May 25, 1846; married July 5, 1860, to Prince Christian of Schleswig-Holstein. Four children: Christian, born April 14, 1867; Albert John, born Feb. 26, 1869; Victoria, born May 3, 1870; Louise, born August 12, 1872.

VI. Princess Louise, born March 18, 1848; married March 21, 1871, to John, Marquis of Lorne, eldest son of the Duke of Argyll.

VII. Prince Arthur, Duke of Connaught, born May 1, 1850; married March 13, 1879, to Princess Louise of Prussia, born July 25, 1860. Three children: Margaret Victoria, born Jan. 15, 1882; Arthur, born Jan. 13, 1883; Victoria, born March 17, 1886.

VIII. Prince Leopold, Duke of Albany, born April 7, 1853; married April 27, 1882, to Princess Helen, daughter of the Prince of Waldeck. Two children: Alice Mary, born Feb. 25, 1883; Leopold Charles Edward George, Duke of Albany, posthumous, born July 19, 1884. Prince Leopold died March 28, 1894.

IX. Princess Beatrice, born April 14, 1857; married July 29, 1885, to Prince Henry, third son of Alexander of Battenburg, uncle of Ludwig IV, Grand Duke of Hesse. Four children: Alexander Albert, born Nov. 23, 1886; Victoria Eugenie, born Oct. 24, 1887; Leopold Arthur Louis, born May 21, 1889; Maurice Victor Donald, born Oct. 3, 1891.
