

THE MONTREAL COLLECTORSHIP.-It is mid that Mr. Tancred Bouthillier, of the Crown Lands Office, is appointed Collector of Customs at this Port, vice Mr. Hall. The "argane" will, of course, defend the appointment on the ground of qualification, as they did that of Jean Chabot, who was asserted to be "eminently qualified," though we should think, in our simplicity, that some slight sequinintance with commercial affairs was necessary to the proper discharge of the duties of the Collectorship of Customs.
