Household Hints.

If you clean your mirror with a soft paper instead of a cloth, time and trouble will both be saved, as there will be no lint, and the glass will have a better polish.

A little powdered borax put in the water in which laces, muslins, and lawns are washed will improve their appearance greatly: use just as little soap as you possibly can.

An ingenious way to make a pair of vases appear to be larger than they really are is to get two blocks of wood, in size and shape about like a quarter-bowl, leaving a space large enough to set the vase in and have a little margin; cover them with plush and put one at each end of the mantle. FARM RENTED.—Mr. Thos. Notz has rented lot 12, con. 12, for a term of from Mr. E. Lear.

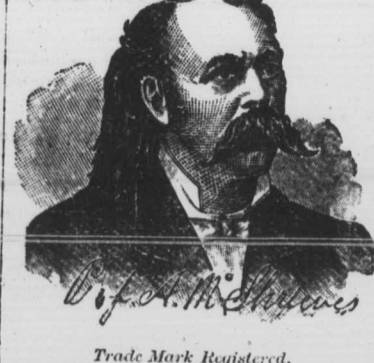
