Thoughts that Help.

The Mission of the Church is to save the souls of men. That is its true mission. It is the only mission of the church. That should be its only thought. The moment any church admits a singer who does not sing to save souls; the moment a church calls a Pastor who does not preach to save souls; the moment a church elects a Deacon who does not work to save souls; the moment a church gives a supper or entertainment of any kind not for the purpose of saving souls, it ceases in so much to be a church, and to fulfil the magnificent mission that God gave it. Every concert, every choir service, every preaching service, every Lord's Supper, every agency used by the church must have the great mission plainly before its eyes. We are here to save the souls of dying sinners; we are here for no other purpose; and the mission of the church being so clear, that is the only test of a real church."

These are the words of Dr. Russell Conwell, our Baptist Brother, pastor of the largest church in America. Dr Lorrimer, pastor of the largest church in New England, recently in this city, emphasized the same thought. The church is not a Soup Kitchen, philanthropic society, or socialistic club. Its work is spiritual; and the more spiritual the more powerful. Men need the simple gospel applied to the times.

Dr. Lorrimer's Visit was a great blessing to the city, and Pastor Robinson deserves our thanks for bringing him here.

Where **Some Good Plan** for church work is proposed, do not throw cold water on it. Hundreds of excellent plans have not succeeded because some well-meaning people have doused the warm enthusiast with a shower of cold discouragement. Encourage every christian worker if you can see any possible good in his plan. Water carts are good for the streets but not for the church. Let us have sunshine there.
