### CURRENT TRADE CONDITIONS

J. N. ARIO.

Toronto retailers are said to be buying only for immediate requirements in anticipation of a decline in prices, especially in lower grades. Stocks on the Georgian Bay are believed to be pretty well cleaned out, but it is thought there is still a considerable amount of lumber in the mill yards in the interior. Mill men have enjoyed a couple of years of unexampled prosperity, and if the demand should slacken they should be

in a position to hold their stocks until there comes a revival, rather than by accepting reduced prices, assist to bring about a demoralization of the market. Building operations in Toronto especially are proceeding on an extensive scale—principally house building—which is the class which consumes the most lumber. Notwithstanding Toronto retailers and planing mill owners are said to be complaining that the demand is not equal to last season. Complaints are heard of poor quality of manufacture of hemlock joisting recently shipped to the Toronto market by northern mills. The stock is so very irregular that in some instances heavy discounts have had to be granted by wholesalers to their customers instead of being cut 2x4, most of the material measures 2 1/8 x 4 1/4. Not only is it unsuited to builders' requirements, but the wholesaler is charged a heavy item as freight on the extra weight. As regards hard woods, prices for ash, basswood and oak continue firm. Maple flooring has been purchased in Toronto within the past few days at a reduction of one dollar per M, as compared with prices previously paid. Elm and birch are reported to be in slow demand. Red oak is said to be coming into favor in the United States for furniture, and is displacing birch for this purpose.

### QUEBEC AND NEW BRUNSWICK

The prevailing depression in the British market appears to affect but little the volume of shipments from Quebec and New Brunswick, which continue to go forward week by week. The greater part of these shipments no doubt are to fill contracts entered into early in the year. The exceptionally favorable tonnage rates now procurable, offer an incentive to shippers to fill contracts as speedily as possible. The half-yearly report of the tonnage of the Port of Montreal shows that there was an increase of 81,000 tons above the record of last year, although the relative proportions as regards timber products is not given. The revenue of the Crown Lands Department of Quebec for the fiscal year ending June 30th, was \$16,465,000, a considerable advance on previous years. This in a measure reflects the activity in timber operations. The season's lumber cut in New Brunswick is estimated at 150,-

000,000 feet. The greatest quantity of lumber cut on the River St John and its tributaries in one year was 190,000,000 feet. Some of the largest drives from the head waters of the St. John have already reached Fredericton, but probably one-third are hung up. Quebec and New Brunswick shingle manufacturers may be interested to learn from the United States Consul at Cape Town, South Africa, that the De Beers Explosive Co., of Somerset West, Cape Colony, require a considerable quantity of shingles. Messrs. John Fenderson & Co., of Springfield, Mass., who operate shingle mills on the borders of Quebec and New Brunswick, have addressed a circular letter to the shingle manufacturers in these provinces, urging them in view of the activity of demand and shortage of supply of red cedar shingles to advance their prices to \$3.00. The situation would seem to justify such an advance. Vast damage is being done by forest fires to the timber along the southern side of the Miramichi, where an area fifteen miles long and five miles wide is on fire.

### UNITED STATES.

A Government crop report just issued shows an adverse condition with regard to the corn crop in the South-West. The average is 400,000 or .05 per cent. less than last year, and the average condition of the growing crop 81.3, which is the lowest for many years. This with the depletion in bank reserves, and the great strikes of workmen, naturally tends to unsettle somewhat the exceptionally favorable conditions which have lately prevailed. On the other side, however, is the fact that the harvest of wheat and other agricultural products promises to be more than ordinarily abundant. Already a shortage of cars is being felt, and there is in consequence an active demand for car material, prices of which are firm. The report comes from Minneapolis that the recent advance in prices of white pine by the price list committee has resulted in unusual activity in that market, due to broken assortments and contract demand. Another meeting of the Committee is to be held in a few days, when a further advance may be considered advisable. There is a shortage on Nos. 1 and 2 doors due to the difficulty experienced by manufacturers of securing the proper

quality of raw material. The supply of hardwood is still rather in excess of the demand, notwithstanding that the consumption is large, and prices are therefore unsatisfactory, and the only hope of improvement so far lies in the possibility of stocks giving out. A brisk demand for hemlock is reported from Buffalo and New York, with prices firm at \$13 for base Buffalo reports state that hemlock bark has advanced to \$7.75 on cars at shipping station. Shingles of all kinds are in exceedingly good demand, and a further advance in prices may be looked for.

GREAT BRITAIN.

There is nothing cheering in the latest reports from Great Britain. Stocks are unusually heavy and demand unusually light. Consequently prices are difficult to maintain, and should shipments from abroad not be restricted, a collapse in prices, followed by heavy losses to all concerned would seem to be unavoidable. Canadian shippers are therefore strongly advised to curtail shipments to as great an extent as possible, at least for a time. The condition of things existing in London will be understood when it is stated that stocks of Baltic and spruce deals, battens, ends and prepared boards exceed 1,851,851 pieces those of the same date last year. Buyers at London and Glasgow express dissatisfaction with the culling under the new Ottawa Association rules. The statement is made that the higher grade stuff is scarcely up to what the market has been accustomed to receive. In Glasgow importers are said to be holding back from purchasing in the hope that these rules will be amended.

A considerable quantity of timber in London warehouses was destroyed by a fire which took place at the West India dock on the 12th inst.

Lord Strathcona has forwarded to the Department of Trade and Commerce at Ottawa a copy of correspondence with the War Office on the matter of utilization of Canadian timber in the construction of the new barracks on Salisbury Plain, showing that maple has been specified for the

floors of two of the eight barracks. With reference to the timber to be used in the other barracks, Mr. Brodick regrets that, as the bills of quantities are already in the hands of contractors, he does not see his way to now make any alteration in the specification, but in the preparation of specifications for future war departmental buildings at Salisbury and elsewhere the claims of Canadian timber will not be lost sight of.

STOCKS AND PRICES

The Conger Lumber Co's new mill at Parry Sound is expected to go into operation on the 10th of August.

The Parry Sound Lumber Company is engaged in cutting timber under contract for the Saginaw Salt & Lumber Company.

A report received by the Ontario Crown Lands Department places the season's output of timber from the Whitefish River district at 35,000,000 feet.

A well-known Puget Sound log driver prophesies that within five years cedar stumpage will be worth \$4 per thousand feet. The prediction is based upon the enormous consumption of timber in the shingle industry.

FOREIGN MARKETS.

Messrs. Clairmonte, Man & Co., in their Barbadoes market report of date June 22nd, say with reference to timber products: There is still a fair enquiry for white pine lumber, but the demand for spruce has fallen off. There has been one arrival each of white pine and spruce during the fortnight. Latest sales for local use are White pine, to arrive, \$24 for merchantable and \$19 for second quality, and another cargo has been sold to arrive, at same rates—the previ-

ous spot sale was made at \$25.77 for merchantable; spruce, last sale \$16.87 for merchantable, and \$12.87 for second quality. Pitch pine, no recent arrival, a well assorted cargo would now find ready sale. Gaspe cedar shingles are in supply; we note the sale of about 150 M ex store, at \$2.90 per M. Cedar laying, last sale \$2.10, since then 1500 M have been offered to arrive, but we have not heard of any sale; spruce laying, last sale \$1.74. June 13th: Schr. "Herbert Rice," from Meteghan, N.S., with 148 M spruce, sold at \$16.37 for merchantable, and \$12.87 for second quality. Planters are now putting a very large proportion of their sugar into bags, thus lessening the demand for staves and shooks.

Messrs. Calder, Henderson & Co., of Glasgow, in their Quarterly Report, dated July 1st, say regarding the prevailing hand-to-mouth rule of buying: Several factors have been at work to account for this, chief among them being the drop in price of pitch pine and spruce, and the new standard of culling of Ottawa pine deals. The new standard of culling of Ottawa pine deals has occasioned much discussion, and meantime buyers are standing still, with the result that the bulk of this season's import has had to be stored. Until all are convinced that nothing better is to be had, and a mutual basis of values arrived at, little business will be done. With the exception of sawn pitch pine stocks are in a healthy condition. General trade is good and important contracts have been fixed by our shipbuilders, so that, barring an excessive import, the outlook may be considered satisfactory.

Regarding Canadian woods, Messrs. Dobell, Beckett & Co.'s trade circular, dated Liverpool, July 1st, says: The arrivals during the past month have been too heavy for the demand, and prices of most articles have weakened. Waney board pine.—There is a fair demand for first-class wood, and prices of such continue firm. The bulk of the import of square pine has gone direct into consumption at steady prices. The demand for oak,

first-class wood, is good, but the inferior grades continue neglected. Elm, if of good sizes, is in fair request, but small wood is over-stocked. For birch logs there has been fair inquiry at steady prices. Planks have arrived much too freely, the stock has increased and values rule low. Of pine deals and boards there has been a moderate import, but the demand is slow and prices are barely steady. The stock of New Brunswick and Nova Scotia spruce deals is too heavy and sales are difficult.

BUSINESS NOTES.

The death is announced of S. Willard, saw mill owner, Dudswell Centre, Quebec.

The Nova Scotia Lumber Company, of Sherbrooke, N.S., has recently been sold to New York parties.

Messrs. Smith & Lariviere, lumber manufacturers, St. Anne du Sau t, Que., are reported to have assigned.

The assets of V. E. Traversy & Co., lumber merchants, of Montreal, are announced to be sold on the 22nd inst.

Smith & Lariviere, lumbermen, Riviere Savage, Que., lately reported in trouble, show liabilities of \$18,000 with apparent assets of \$8,000.

Joseph Morneau, saw mill owner, Notre Dame du Lac, Que., is reported to be offering to compromise with his creditors at 40 cents on the dollar.

The Cassiar Power & Industrial Company, Limited, of Cassiar, B.C., has been incorporated with a capital of \$25,000 to manufacture pulp and paper.

The British Columbia Timber & Trading Company are closing out their retail business in Winnipeg and will hereafter devote themselves exclusively to the wholesale trade.
