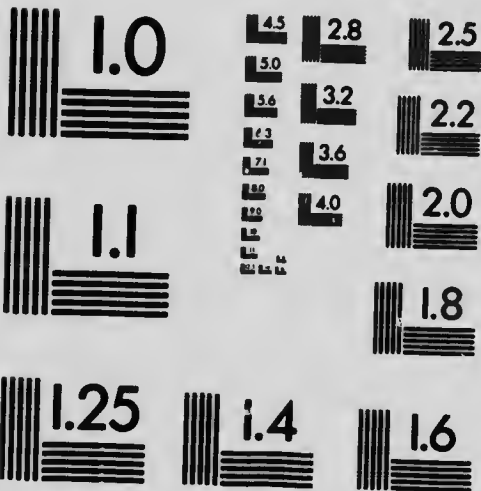

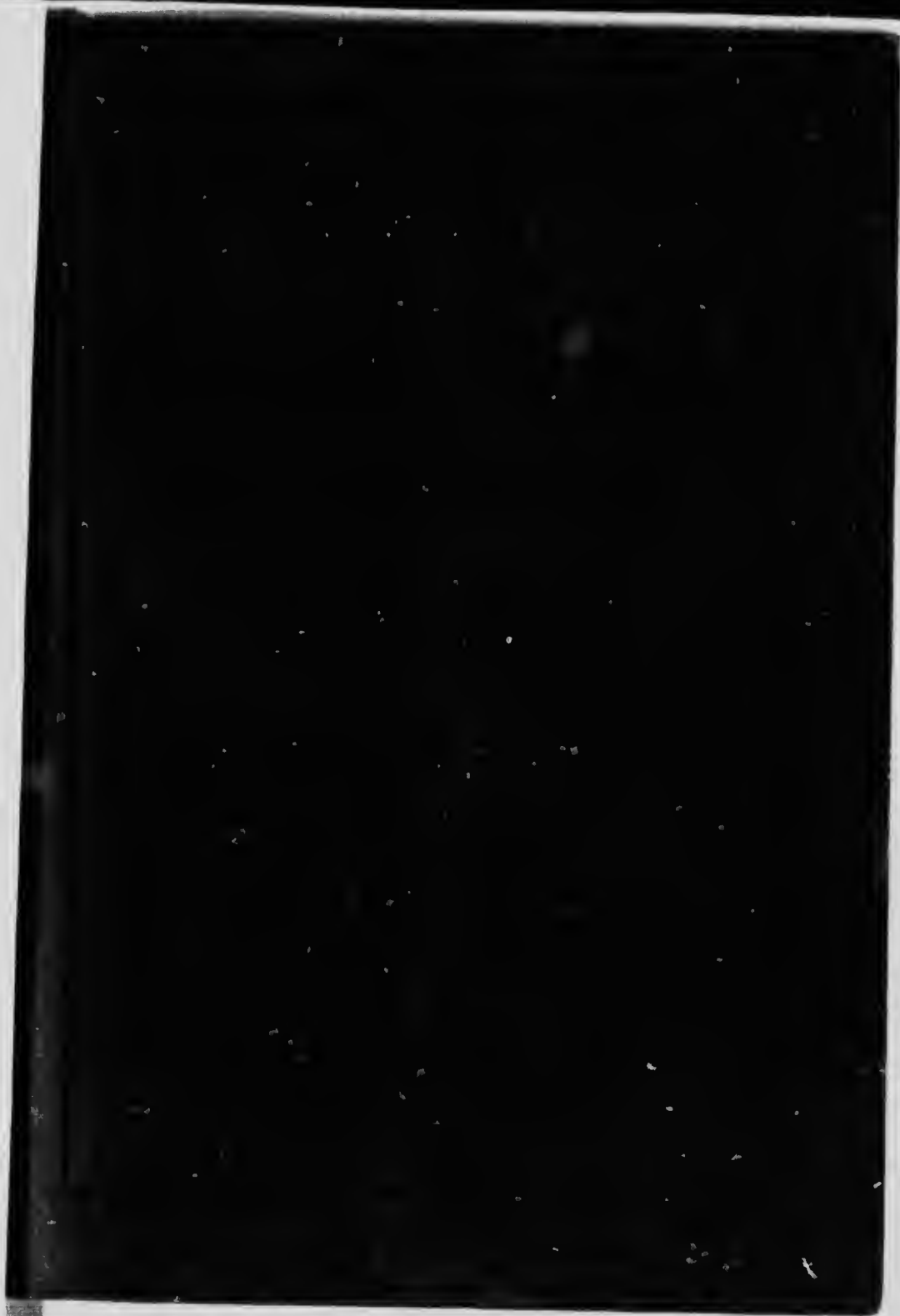
MICROCOPY RESOLUTION TEST CHART
