Junction Public School Board is Seeking a Site for a New School.

MR. BROOM'S UNIQUE POSITION.

In Connection With Premises of Farmers' Loan Co.—North Toronto School Board.

Toronto Junction, March 7.—A special meeting of the Public School Board was held in the Town Hall to-night to consider the purchase of a site for the new school in Ward 2. A block between Western and Ontario-avenue was thought to be the most suitable, but a committee, consisting of Messrs. J. J. Gilbert and Rice, will report on other lots before a purchase is made.

The National Landmarks Club has reorganized with President, Dr. Perfect; Secretary, W. Carter; Treasurer, Mr. Greenaway; Field Captain, Percy Wright; Team Committee, Messrs. Greenaway, Gilbert, Stacey, Savage and Lewis.

Four attempts have been made during the present week to effect an entrance into the premises adjoining those occupied by Mr. Broom on Dundas-street, the right and title to which has for several months given rise to much litigation.

The first attempt was made on Monday, when a gentleman in a brown coat began to pry up some boards. He was ordered off and later Mr. Willis, an agent of the company, and with the other man, improved a battering ram and made another attempt.

Today an inspector of the company came out and was refused admittance, and a litigious report, which caused several days' work, was sent to the Board of Trade.

Whereas the application is now pending before the Dominion Parliament for a railway charter running south from the Crow's Nest coal fields to the international boundary, with a view of obtaining railway communication between the Crow's Nest coal fields and the American railway system.

Whereas, it appears from the report of the Geological Survey of Canada that there is an extensive supply of coal in the Crow's Nest district.

Whereas, coal and coke are both finished products, and labor being expended on them in the country, and every dollar that comes into the country in return for coal or coke exported makes the country just that much richer, and the farmer, rancher, or miller, the merchant and the manufacturer all profit thereby.

Whereas the Crow's Nest Coal Company, as appears by the statement of the president of the said company, is prepared, provided the said railway charter is granted, to greatly extend its operations in the said district, and to proceed with the development of the coal areas of the said district, involving an immense additional capital expenditure of over \$800,000, and in the near future an annual wage bill of between two and three millions of dollars.

Whereas such development will mean the establishment of new towns and the building up of large and important business communities in British Columbia, which will be greatly to the advantage of the people of Canada.

Whereas the merchants, manufacturers and other dealers in supplies in Toronto, as appears with those of other eastern cities, have greatly benefited by the present development in the Crow's Nest district, and would derive still larger benefits from an increased development in the future.

Whereas we believe that the construction of the said railway would promote the development of our country, improve its material prosperity, increase the comfort and convenience of its citizens, and directly benefit the merchants, manufacturers and dealers of Toronto, as well as other cities in Ontario.

Whereas it therefore resolved, that we most respectfully and strongly urge upon the Parliament of Canada that the application for the said charter be granted, and that a copy of this resolution be forwarded to the Minister of Railways.

Amendment Voted Down. Mr. C. W. Band introduced the following amendment, which was voted down: "A resolution having been referred to this committee dealing with the application for a charter for a railway in the interests of the Crow's Nest Coal Company."

GROW'S NEST COAL FOR U.S.

Access to American Markets Favored by Board of Trade Transportation Committee.

CHARTER SHOULD BE GRANTED FOR A RAILWAY RUNNING SOUTH FROM THE COAL FIELDS TO INTERNATIONAL BOUNDARY.

The Transportation Committee of the Toronto Board of Trade met yesterday afternoon and passed a resolution to the effect that the Dominion Parliament should grant an application for a charter for a railroad to run from the Crow's Nest Coal fields to the boundary of the United States.

Resolved, that this committee refer the resolution back to the council, giving as the reason therefor that it is not an opportune time to come to a decided conclusion in the matter until more fully informed as to the full effect, which such legislation would have on the development of mining and smelting interests in our own country.

Supported the Resolution. The committee was addressed by Mr. Elias Rogers, who by the aid of a map showed the committee where the road would be.

Mr. G. M. Hyman, a gentleman who has large smelting interests in Montreal, and who is said to possess the Crow's Nest coal fields in British Columbia, strongly urged that the railway be constructed.

With the exception of Mr. Band, the committee voted in favor of the resolution calling for the construction of the railway, and when the Council meets next Monday Mr. Band's amendment can be brought up.
