CONFESSED TO KILLING FOUR

ST. LOUIS Mo, Jan. 19.—That Mrs. Belle Guinness, alleged perpetrator of the Guinness "murder farm" horrors, was chloroformed and killed with her three children by Ray Lamphere, is the startling assertion in a copyrighted article published today in the St. Louis Post Dispatch.

The story is based on a confession said to have been made by Ray Lamphere, who recently died in the Indiana penitentiary. The confession was made to a man whose name is withheld, but whose character and truthfulness, the article declares, are beyond question.

The confession is said to have been written by Lamphere, although no copy of it has been found among his effects after his death.

His confession, in substance, is as follows:

Mrs. Guinness and her children were chloroformed by Ray Lamphere, who was robbing the house, which he set fire to, burning them to death.

This confession of Lamphere, it was stated, is not the confession he

was reported to have made to the Rev. A. E. Schell of Mount Pleasant Iowa. The article asserts, however, that the facts, according to the man who supplied the details, are the same as those in the confession made to Schell, which the minister could confirm if he chose.

Lamphere is reported to have stated in the confession that he had no intention of killing Mrs. Guinness and her children. He intended only to rob the woman, but the first start of accident and he could not distinguish it.

Explaining Mrs. Guinness' method of killing her victims Lamphere declared she gave them a powerful drug. If the three was not killed, he said, she severed their heads with an axe.

A MAP OF CANADA IN STAINED GLASS

An excellent specimen of the stained glassworkers' handicraft is afforded by a novel map that has been prepared for the west end office of the Grand Trunk Railway System on Cooks' street, London, S. W. On a solid sheet of glass, 14-1/2 inches thick, measuring 12 feet in length and 6 feet broad is a faithful reproduction of the map of the Dominion of Canada has been executed. The names of places in great numbers, the rivers, the lakes and the mountains are clearly shown, while the distinct five colors for the various Provinces comprising the Dominion and adjacent territories of the United States have been traced in to ensure clarity. Stretching across the continent from the Atlantic to the Pacific may be easily followed the route of Canada's great trunk line, the Grand Trunk Pacific by means of which millions of square miles of new grain producing territory are being opened up to the settler. The work not only affords a graphic view of the vastness of the great Dominion, but also gives an impression of this \$200 million of new road. The preparation of the map was a delicate task, since it is the largest piece of stained glass work that has ever been attempted. It required the combined services of eight expert operators continuously for five months and it is one of the most costly reproductions of a map that has ever been undertaken. In its manufacture the great difficulty was to obtain a result which would be quite legible in daylight, and which would yet be sufficiently transparent to allow of illumination by means of twenty four 25 candle power lamps by night. The delicate blending of the various tints, the definition of the finest hair like lines, and the distinctness of the names renders it a work of artistic and educational value. Owing to its fragile character and large size, combined with its great weight of one ton three hundred and eighty pounds, its transportation from Birmingham, where it was manufactured, to London, had to be carried off by special means.—*Canada* London Dec. 4, 1909.
