A EUROPEAN SENSATION. TERSE TELEGRAMS.

The Result of Crispien's Speech at Palermo. Wired From Every Quarter of the World. A Large Influx of Russian-Hebrew Refugees Into Canada Threatened.

THE CONCISSION OF RIBOT AND CAPRIVI'S UTERANCES A WELCOME EVENT. London, Sept. 29.—Signor Crispien's recent speech at Palermo has caused a sensation throughout Europe, as it virtually proclaims an Anglo-Italian alliance as an alliance.

BRITAIN, Sept. 29.—Except among the military party the coincidence of the speeches of M. Ribot and Chancellor Von Caprivi in favor of peace is a welcome event. Jingoism, as Crispien's speech on the Franco-Russian alliance, which they argue gives England the balance of power in Europe, a preponderance out of all proportion to her small military and economic burdens.

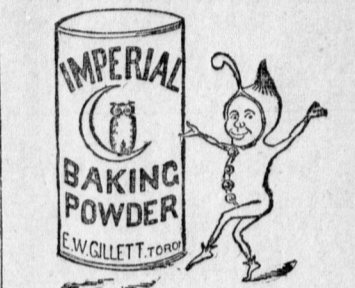

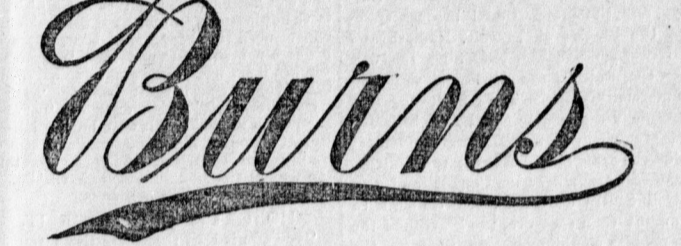

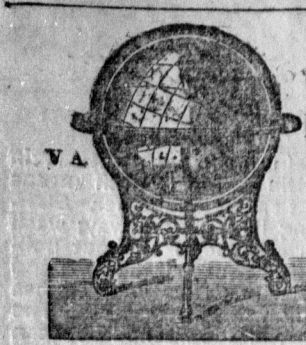
