



Local railroad men take exception the statements that are being made in parliament in connection with the move to ask to make an investigation with a view of reducing the hours of

with a view of reducing the hours of railway employees.

"Our men do not work more than from ten to twelve hours," said Superintendent Bowker, of the Grand Trunk. "If we are very busy, as we are now, we put on more men instead of asking those we have to work more hours. We have 40 more men on now than is usual owing to the heavy traffic. The enginemen and trainmen have the longest hours of anybody, and sometimes they are out for 15 hours, but this is only in case of emergency or bad weather. About the longest run we have on this division is that from Sarnla to Mimico, which occupies about ten hours."

Superintendent McNeillie was away today, but inquiry at the C. P. R. offices elicited the information that the men never work more than 12 hours, and as a rule only 10.

"We are instructed to arrange our work so that the men will not have to work more than 19 hours," said an






