Washington, Dec. 1.—Commissioner Coleman of the Department of Agriculture in his report alludes to the spread of pleuro pneumonia: Every effort possible under existing laws, says the report, has been made to locate the diseased animals and isolate all that have been exposed. It would have been most fortunate if every animal exposed to the disease and liable to contract it could have been summarily slaughtered and the contagion thus eradicated. The experience of all countries has been that the malady may be thoroughly and completely stamped out in this way, and there is no other means by which the bovine species can be protected from its ravages. 


