



## VANCOUVER CLUB

## Constitution

- 1. This Association shall be known as "The Van-couver Club."
- 2. The real and personal property of the Club is vested in the Granville Club Company, Limited, in trust for the Club on the terms and conditions and subject to the stipulations set out and contained in a decree of the Supreme Court of British Columbia dated the 5th day of November, 1907, and shall be held or transferred by the said Company in such manner as may be directed by the Committee of Management for the time being, with the authority of a resolution passed by a majority of three-fourths of the members present at a special meeting of the Club, called for the purpose.

## CANDIDATES FOR MEMBERSHIP.

- 3. Each candidate for admission shall be proposed by one member and seconded by another, by a proposal in writing to be inserted in the book of candidates and signed by both mover and seconder. All proposals for membership must be accompanied by letters addressed to the Secretary of the Club from the proposer and seconder stating:
- (a) That he has carefully investigated the social and business position of the candidate;
- (b) A short statement of general grounds for believing him to be eligible;
- (c) A direct declaration by the proposer that he considers the gentleman nominated to be in every way a desirable member of the Club.

- 4. If the said candidate shall be approved of by the Committee he shall be balloted for at any ballot which may take place after the lapse of two weeks from the time of such proposal, provided the names of the candidate and his proposer and seconder have been posted on the Notice Board under the hand of the Secretary at least two weeks before the day of ballot. No resident candidate shall be eligible for election except at the discretion of the Committee, until he has resided in the City of Vancouver at least twelve months. All candidates for admission must be of the full age of twenty-one years.
- 5. Twelve months must elapse before a rejected candidate can again come up for election. A candidate having been rejected twice cannot come up again for election.
- 6. All candidates for admission shall, provided that at the date of the election they appear to be eligible for membership, come up for election in the order in which their names appear in the Candidates' Book: and when there is a waiting list the number of Resident candidates put up for election on any one day shall not, by their election, exceed the number authorized to be elected as Resident members under Section 14.

## BALLOT.

- 7. The ballot shall be held on three successive days commencing at 8 a.m. on the first Wednesday in each month, and shall remain open each day from 8 a.m. until closing time on the following Friday. The decision of the Committee as to whether any candidate has been duly elected or not shall be final.
- 8. No ballot shall be valid unless forty members shall actually ballot in favor of the candidate, and one black ball in six shall exclude, but at least three black balls must be cast to exclude any candidate.

## NEW MEMBERS.

- 9. On the admission of each new member, the Secretary shall notify him and furnish him with a printed copy of the Constitution, Regulations and By-laws, and request him to remit the amount of his entrance fee and subscription to the Secretary.
- 10. The Committeee specially summoned can cancel the election of any member within two months of the day he paid his first subscription and such exmember shall not have the right to not any appeal whatsoever nor to demand the reasons for such cancelling, but his subscription and entrance fee, if any, must be returned to him. The quorum of such Committee shall be six.
- 11. No member shall be admitted to vote on any occasion whatever, or enjoy any of the privileges of the Club, until he shall have paid whatever entrance fee or subscription shall be due by him.

## ENTRANCE FEES.

- 12. The Entrance re for an classes of members—except as otherwise 1 ided—shall be reduced to One Hundred Dollars untrach uch time as one hundred new members are admitted.
- 13. The entrance fee shall constitute a Sinking Fund, and shall be applied, after the first day of January, 1900, to the reduction of the mortgage indebtedness of the Club and interest thereon, and rates, taxes, insurance, and such renewals of furniture, repairs, and alterations as the Committee may deem expedient; and the funds now in hand, held under this clause, shall be applied in liquidation of the indebtedness of the Vancouver Club at the discretion of the Committee.

#### MEMBERSHIP.

- 14. The Club shall consist of not more than 600 Resident and Resident Life Members, in addition to Country, Non-resident, Marine, Supernumerary, Imperial, Privileged, Introduced and Temporary Members.
- 15. The ANNUAL SUBSCRIPTION shall be as follows, but subject to the provisions contained in the clauses specified:

Life Members (Clause 16)—Exempt from payment of subscription.

Resident Members (Clause 17)-\$100 per annum, pay-

able quarterly in advance.

Absentee Members (Clause 18)—\$10 per annum or portion thereof, payable in advance.

Privileged Members (Clause 19)-\$100 per annum,

payable quarterly in advance.

Country Members (Clause 20)-\$30 per annum, pay-

able quarterly in advance.

Non-resident Members (Clause 21)—\$10 per annum, payable annually in advance on the 1st day of February.

Marine Members (Clause 22)—\$24 per annum, payable annually in advance on the 1st day of February.

Supernumerary Members (Clause 23)—\$10 per annum, payable annually in advance on the 1st day of February.

Imperial Members (Clause 24)—\$10 per month, pay-

able in advance.

Temporary Members (Clauses 25 and 26)-\$10 per

month, payable in advance.

Introduced Members (Clause 27)—\$10 per month, payable in advance.

#### Life Members.

16. Any member in good standing may, upon his assigning to the Club six debentures of the Granville Club Company, Limited, become a Life Member. The number of such life memberships to be granted in any

one year to be regulated by the Committee of the Club. Applications for the same to be filed in the order they are received from time to time.

#### Resident Members.

17. On and after the first day of February, 1914, the yearly subscription for Resident Members shall be ONE HUNDRED DOLLARS, and be payable quarterly in advance on the first day of February, May, August and November in each year. All future members shall commence paying their subscription for the unexpired period of the current quarter from the date they are balloted for. A member shall be deemed a resident member who has his fixed place of abode within a radius of twenty-five miles of the Club premises. When the Committee are in doubt as to the residence of any member, they may apply to such member for a statement setting forth where he claims his residence to be. In the event of such member claiming a residence outside such radius, the Committee may accept the same as proof without any further enquiry. In the case of a member's name being transferred from another list, any portion of a month shall be considered as one month.

#### Absentee Members.

18. Any RESIDENT Member who intends to be absent temporarily from the Province of British Columbia for six months or more, may be considered as an Absentee Member, and shall pay \$10.00 for each year, or portion of a year, during the continuance of such absence; but any member availing himself of this privilege must notify the same by letter to the Secretary, who shall insert his name in the book of the Absentee Members, such privilege to become effective on the first of the month following his departure, and upon his return to the City he shall be liable for the proportion of his dues as a Resident Member for the then current quarter. Any portion of a month in which such member returns to the Province shall, for the purpose of this rule, be considered as one month.

### Privileged Members.

Officers (other than Managers) of chartered banks having branches or agencies in Vancouver, and who are not settled residents thereof; also such persons not having a permanent residence in Vancouver. as the Committee shall decide upon, may, during their temporary residence in Vancouver, be admitted to the privileges of the Club, after having been balloted for and elected in the same manner as ordinary members. Such members shall be called "Privileged Members," and shall pay the ordinary dues, and twenty per cent. of the entrance fee then existing annually in advance, but shall not be entitled to vote or have any voice in the management of the Club, and shall not claim any interest in the property of the Club upon its dissolution; but such members, after having paid five annual instalments, shall become full members, or may at any time, on obtaining the consent of the Committee, become ordinary members on payment of the balance required to complete the amount of entrance fee. If at any time the Committee shall be of opinion that the residence of any such Privileged Member is no longer temporary, they shall call upon him for payment of the balance of his entrance fee.

## Country Members.

20. On and after the first day of February, 1917, members who have paid the full entrance fee and whose permanent place of residence is situated within a radius of 300 miles from the City of Vancouver and at a distance within said radius of not less than 25 miles from said City, and who have no place of business in Vancouver, may have their names placed upon a list of Country Members, and shall have all the rights and privileges of the Club on payment of a yearly subscription of THIRTY DOLLARS, payable quarterly in advance on the first day of February, May, August and November; each year; but in the event of any Country Member making use of the Club for a longer period

than 25 days, consecutively or otherwise in any one quarter, he shall for that quarter pay a subscription equal to that of a Resident Member. In the case of a member's name being transferred from another list, any portion of a month, for the purpose of this rule, shall be considered as one month.

## Non-Resident Members.

On and after the first day of February, 1917, members residing permanently outside of a radius of 300 miles from the City of Vancouver, and who have no place of business in the City of Vancouver, may have their names placed upon a list of Non-Resident Members, and shall have all the rights and privileges of the Club on payment of a yearly subscription of TEN DOL-LARS, payable in advance on the first day of February in each year; but in the event of any Non-Resident Member making use of the Club for a longer period than 25 days, consecutively or otherwise, in any one quarter, he shall for that quarter pay a subscription equal to that of a Resident Member. In the case of a member's name being transferred from another list, any portion of a month, for the purpose of this rule, shall be considered as one month.

## Marine Members.

22. Officers attached to the Royal Mail Steamers on the China and Australian routes, or any permanent trans-Pacific line of ocean steamers which hereafter may be established with this port, not being members, shall be eligible for election, without entrance fee, as Marine Members of the Club, but subject to the payment of an annual subscription of twenty-four dollars (\$24), payable yearly in advance on the first day of February in each year, subscriptions to be due to the Club from the date of election. Any portion of a month, for the purpose of this rule, shall be considered as one month. Members so elected shall, subject to Rule 28, enjoy all the advantages of the Club, and in

### Supernumerary Members.

23. Any member who, by reason of disability through natural causes or from wounds received while on Active Service, is permanently unable to avail himself of all the privileges of the Club, may, by unanimous vote of the Committee, have his name transferred to the Supernumerary list, and thereafter be subject to a subscription of Ten Dollars per annum, payable in advance on the first day of February in each year. Any portion of a month, for the purpose of this rule, shall be considered as one month.

### Imperial Members.

24. Officers in His Majesty's Army and Navy and persons holding military and civil appointments under the Imperial Government, and properly accredited representatives of Allied Nations, who may be stationed in Canada for an indefinite period, shall be eligible for election as members without the payment of entrance fee, but subject to the payment of \$10.00 per month, payable in advance, and to the Constitution and Regulations of the Club generally, such members to be designated "Imperial" Members, and to enjoy all the advantages of the Club except that of being elected members of the Committee, or voting in any way in the affairs of the Club. Every candidate proposed as an Imperial Member shall be stated to be so on the list of candidates for election.

## Temporary Members.

25. Any ordinary member shall have the privilege of introducing a friend resident elsewhere than in Vancouver, and whose permanent place of residence is at least twenty-five miles from Vancouver, for a period of

fourteen days in all, during the year, or when the party resides not less than twenty-five miles from Vancouver such visitor shall be eligible for one or more months longer at the discretion of the Committee, on payment of \$10.00 per month in advance, providing the name of such member be submitted with the written recommendation of two ordinary members, after the expiry of the period for which he was so admitted to the privileges of the Club.

26. Officers in His Majesty's Army and Navy stationed out of Vancouver are eligible for introduction under this Article, and any person so admitted shall thereafter be a Temporary Member for two weeks, and for one month longer on the payment of \$10.00, and may again be introduced for a further period of one month, subject to such regulations as the Committee of Management may from time to time prescribe.

## Introduced Members.

27. That the following and any other club or clubs which the Committee may decide upon, so long as reciprocal arrangements are maintained, shall be included in the list of those exchanging privileges with the Vancouver Club:

City Club, of Halifax.
Garrison Club, of Quebec.
St. James's Club, of Montreal.
Rideau Club, of Ottawa.
Toronto Club, of Toronto.
Hamilton Club, of Hamilton.
Manitoba Club, of Winnipeg.
British Empire Club, of London, England.
Isthmian Club, of London, England.

Any ordinary member of a club herein specified, who shall present from the secretary of the second an official letter of introduction to the Second, and whose usual place of residence shall be omside the Province of British Columbia, may be extended the

privileges of the Club as an INTRODUCED MEMBER for a period of fourteen days in all during the year. Such visitor shall be eligible for one or more months longer, at the discretion of the Committee, on payment of TEN DOLLARS per month in advance. The name and residence of such visitor shall be entered in the Visitors' Book in the name of the Committee.

28. Privileged, Marine Imperial, Introduced, and Temporary Members shall be entitled to all the benefits and privileges of membership, except that they shall not be qualified to be officers or members of the Committee, or to vote as members or to claim any share in the property of the Club upon its dissolution.

#### ASSESSMENT OF MEMBERS.

29. The Committee of the Club is authorized to assess the RESIDENT members in a sum not exceeding Three Dollars (\$3.00) per month, as a temporary measure only, until such time as the members in General Meeting are in a position to know from the Committee how much will be required to pay normal running expenses. Such assessment to be treated in all respects as regular quarterly dues payable under Clause Seventeen.

LADIES.

30. The Committee is empowered to arrange for the use of the Ladies' Dining and Reception Rooms by the wives, unmarried daughters and unmarried sisters of members of this Club for luncheon, afternoom tea and dinner, during regulation hours. Any or all of these privileges to be extended at the discretion of the Committee; and an annual fee to be charged as the Committee may see fit to impose, such fee to be not less than \$10.00 per annum each, and should be payable by the male relative. Ladies availing themselves of these facilities to have the right to include amongst their guests, ladies non-resident in Vancouver. Any lady under the age of eighteen years not to be admitted of entertained.

#### GUESTS.

31. Any member shall have the privilege of introducing to the Club a friend who does not reside within a radius of TEN miles of the Club premises, provided the name of such friend shall have been previously inscribed in the book to be kept for that purpose, it being understood that no more than eight persons be admitted to the Club on the part of any one member under this rule on any one day, and no other person, not a member, shall be admitted at any time, unless to view the house, and then accompanied by a member; provided always that the Committee may, in their discretion, relax the rigor of this rule as regards the number of persons which a single member may introduce.

#### CITIZENS.

- 32. The privilege of bringing a citizen into the Club by a member is extended to every day for dinner, and he may have the privilege of the Club after 5 p.m. for the remainder of the day while accompanied by the member who introduced him, but this privilege is limited to four days per month for any one citizen. At the discretion of the Committee refreshments may be served to members or their guests in the Strangers' Room.
- 33. The guest to have the privilege of the use of the billiard room, card and reading rooms; all expenses incurred by the guest to be defrayed by the introducer. Guest's name with the introducer's to be inserted in a book to be kept for that purpose; provided, however, that no person shall be entitled to any of the privileges herein set forth if he be under the age of eighteen years or shall have been at any time an unsuccessful candidate for election to membership.
- 34. No temporary or introduce member shall be allowed to have his cheque cashed c give an I. O. U.
- 35. A member introducing any friend shall be responsible for any debt incurred by him in the Club.

#### PAYMENTS.

- 36. All members are to pay their bills for every expense they incur in the Club before they leave the House.
- 37. All entrance fees, subscriptions and dues shall be paid either to the Secretary at the Club, or by cheque or draft to the order of the Club.
- 38. If any member fails to pay his entrance fee or subscription within six weeks after his admission, the Secretary shall report to the Committee, who shall cause his name to be erased from the list of members unless the delay can be justified to the satisfaction of the Committee.
- 39. The name of every member failing to pay his subscription, or any dues whatever, shall be posted on the fifteenth of the following month, and if the subscription or any dues be not paid within one month thereafter the Secretary shall report to the Committee, who shall cause his name to be erased from the list of members, but he may be re-admitted by the Committee upon assigning to them reasons which they shall consider satisfactory for his failure of payment. Any member so posted shall not be permitted to incur any further liability to the Club, except his subscription, until his indebtedness has been liquidated.

#### RESIGNATIONS.

40. Any member whose dues are all paid shall be at liberty to withdraw from the Club on his written application to that effect, sent in to the Committee before the first day of February, May, August or November.

#### INFRACTIONS.

41. Any member infringing the Constitution or any of the Regulations of the Club, or being guilty of conduct either inside the Club or elsewhere, which in the

opinion of the Committee is detrimental to the character or interests of the Club, shall be liable to suspension or expulsion by a vote of two-thirds of the Committee present at any meeting specially held for that purpose, reasonable notice of such meeting being previously given to such member. If any member be guilty of conduct either inside the Club or elsewhere, which, in the opinion of any ten members who shall certify the same in writing, is detrimental to the character or interests of the Club, the Committee shall call an extraordinary meeting of the Club to consider the matter, and it shall be competent at such meeting by a vote of two-thirds of the members present thereat to suspend or to expel such member from the Club.

- 42. It shall be the duty of the Committee to take immediate cognizance of any infractions of the constitution or regulations of the Club.
- 43. Any member who shall withdraw, resign or be expelled or whose name shall be erased from the list of members shall cease to be a member of the Club, and shall forfeit ipso facto all rights or claims thereon, or in, or to, its property or funds, and any member who shall be expelled shall forever thereafter be ineligible to be re-admitted a member of the Club.

## CLUB MEETINGS.

44. The annual general meeting of the Club shall be held on the second Wednesday in March, previous to which meeting it shall be the duty of the Committee to present a report and abstract of the state of accounts and general concerns of the Club, for the past year, made up to the thirty-first day of January, together with an estimate of the receipts and disbursements of the current year. Fourteen days' notice shall be given of any motion intended to be brought up at such meeting by posting a copy of such motion on the notice board of the Club. The Chair shall be taken at all meetings at such time as the Committee may appoint.

- 45. The Committee shall have the power at all times to convene an extraordinary meeting of the Club on giving fourteen days' notice, to be posted up during that period in the Club, specifying the object of such meeting in the form of a resolution, at which meeting no subject shall be discussed beyond that specified in the notice.
- 46. Upon the written request of twenty members of the Club, the Committee shall call a special meeting to consider a specific subject.
- 47. Fifteen qualified members shall constitute a quorum at any annual or special meeting of the Club.
- 48. The President, and in his absence the Vice-President, shall preside at all meetings of the Club. and Committee, and in their absence the Club or Committee may elect its presiding officer. The Chairman, in case of equal voting, shall have a ca .ing vote.

## OFFICERS AND COMMITTEE.

- 49. The Committee shall consist of a President, Vice-President and seven members, all of whom shall be elected annually by ballot. The Committee shall have full power to make such rules and regulations from time to time as they may think fit, not inconsistent with the Constitution.
- 50. Any two or more members desiring to nominate members to fill the offices of President, Vice-President or membership on the Committee, shall send such name or names to the Secretary at least seven days before the election, and the Secretary shall then post the name or names so nominated. In the event of the members failing to nominate sufficient to fill the Committee, those elected shall forthwith elect members to fill such vacancies. In the event of no nominations being handed to the Secretary, the President, Vice-President and Committee shall continue in office until the next annual general meeting.

- 51. The President, Vice-President and members of the Committee shall be appointed by ballot on the day of the annual general meeting and the polls shall remain open from 9 a.m. until the adjournment of the meeting.
- 52 If the President, Vice-President or any member elected to serve on the Committee shall resign, or should a death or vacancy occur, or should any member of the Committee have ceased to attend the regular meetings of the general Committee for a period of three months consecutively, the Committee shall have power to choose a qualified member to act in his stead until the annual meeting next ensuing, when the member so chosen shall retire, but shall be eligible for reelection.
- 53. The Committee shall meet monthly on a stated day to transact current business and to receive and pass the accounts of the preceding month. Three members of the Committee shall form a quorum. Special meetings may be called by the President, or in his absence by the Vice-President.
- 54. The Committee shall have power to appoint a Secretary or to determine his engagement upon such terms as they think proper, and they may, if they think it expedient, confer upon such Secretary the privilege of an honorary member, ex-officio, subject to such limitations as may be imposed.
- 55. In case it should be necessary to bring or defend any legal proceedings on behalf of or in the interests of the Club for any purpose whatever, the Committee shall have power to bring or defend the same in the name of the Secretary. The Committee and the Secretary shall be fully idemnified by the Club against all personal liability or loss incurred in respect to their so bringing or defending such proceedings, and from all costs and damages incurred in relation thereto or occasioned thereby.

#### HOURS.

56. The Club shall be open every day for the recep tion of members at 7 o'clock a.m. in the summer, and a 8 a.m. in the winter, and shall be closed and the light extinguished at 1 a.m., except on Sundays, when the hour of closing shall be midnight. But the Committee shall have power to relax this rule on special occasion on such terms as they may deem fit. It shall be the duty of the waiters in attendance to announce the hour at 11.30 p. m. on Sundays, and at 12.30 o'clock or all other days, in each room then occupied by members and all such members shall be required to leave the Club before the time fixed for putting out the light under a penalty of \$10.00 per member. This rule shal apply to members sleeping in the house so far as the public rooms are concerned. The servants on duty a the time of closing the Club must, on pain of instan dismissal, report to the Secretary the names of mem bers remaining in the Club after such time.

#### CAMES.

- 57. No game of hazard shall be played in the Club Whist shall not be played for any higher stakes that one quarter of a dollar points; other games may be played for limited stakes, the limit of stakes to be fixed by the Committee. No bet any game of cards of billiards shall exceed one dol. 7.
- 58. All liabilities incurred in the card rooms of billiard room must be settled within forty-eight hours. Should any case of default in settlement be reported to the Committee they shall proceed at their next meeting to consider the case and take action thereon. No member shall be allowed to play who is in default.

#### GENERAL.

59. No smoking shall be permitted in the dining room before 1 p.m.

- 60. No member shall take away from the Club upon any pretence whatever any newspaper, pamphlet, book, map or other article, the property of the Club.
- 61. Members must inscribe in a book to be kept in the office, a mail address for notices prescribed or directed by the Constitution or Rules. In the absence of such inscription by a member, such notices shall be served by depositing them in the Club letter box addressed to him, and he shall be held to have received them ten days after they are so mailed or deposited.
- 62. No member is on any account to bring a dog into the Club House or premises.
- 63. Any complaint or suggestion must be made in writing in the Suggestion Book, and signed by the member, or by letter to the Secretary, which complaint must be specially noticed by the Committee at the next meeting. The Committee shall not be called upon to take notice of any verbal suggestion or complaint.
- 64. No member shall give any money or gratuity to any of the servants of the establishment under any pretence what iver.
- 65. Members shall have the privilege of subscribing to the Servants' Christmas Fund by signing a chit for the amount they wish to subscribe, said chit to be deposited in a box provided for that purpose.
- 66. No member shall engage or take into his employ any servant of the Club without the consent of the Committee until such servant shall have left the Club employ at least three months.
- 67. No servant of the Club (the messenger excepted) shall be sent out of the House upon any errand on any pretence whatever.
- 68. The conduct of a servant shall in no instance be made a subject of personal reprimand by any member.

Any article in this Constitution may be altered, amended or suspended for any range of time, or any new article may be added by consent of two-thirds of the members voting at the Annual General Meeting or any extraordinary or special meeting convened for that purpose, provided that such alteration, amendment or suspension shall in the case of an extraordinary or special meeting have been specified in the notice summoning such meeting.
- 70. The foregoing rules shall be printed and distributed to each member.

HOUSE RULES

### COMMITTEES.

- 1. The ordinary general committee meetings are held, unless otherwise arranged, on the third Thursday of each month at 1 p.m., at which three shall form a quorum.
- 2. The House Committee meetings, at which the Club accounts are approved or recommended for payment, are held, unless otherwise arranged, at 12.45 p.m. on the third Thursday of each month, at which two shall form a quorum.
- 3. If the minutes be objected to by the majority of the members present, the objection will be reserved for consideration either at an extraordinary meeting or the next ordinary meeting as may be decided upon, and if not objected to, then the Chairman will affix his signature thereto.
- 4. After the disposal of the minutes of the previous meeting, all such matters as require the consideration of the Committee are brought before it and discussed and decided upon.

## MANAGER AND SECRETARY.

- 5. The Secretary acts as Manager, and as such has the general control and superintendency of the establishment under the Committee.
- 6. As Secretary he attends all meetings of the Committee and House Committee, notes their resolutions and minutes them in the book of their proceedings. In all his written official communications he will state expressly that they are made by the direction of the

Committee. Besides his attendance upon the Committee he conducts, with the aid of the bookkeeper, the offici correspondence of the Club, draws up reports, ar keeps regular accounts of the official concerns of the Club and account of the wines and other stores in the stock cellars; accounts with the steward, barmen ar housekeeper for wines and stores delivered for the consumption of the members and for the use of the establishment; examines the accounts of the tradesmen privious to their being submitted for final adjustment, ar pays the same when passed by the Committee. Hascertains that all goods and provisions delivered a in strict accordance with orders given and are conrectly charged in the tradesmen's books, and lexamines such books.

- 7. He receives information upon all subjects connected with the busin of the Club, and particular of all matters relating to the members thereof.
- 8. He submits to the Committee a monthly statement of receipts and disbursements of the Club.

#### OFFICE.

- 9. The Bookkeeper has control of the office under the Secretary, and shall attend to all work appertaining to the office. He shall, if the Secretary desired attend to the receiving of wines and cigars and giving out of the same to the bar, as well as performing other duties which may from time to time be conferred to him by the Secretary.
- 10. Office hours shall be, from 1st April to 30 September, 9 a.m. to 5 p.m., and 1st October to 31 March, 9 a.m. to 5.30 p.m., or later if necessary. Saturdays the hours shall be from 9 a.m. to 1 p.m.

#### STEWARD.

11. The Steward has general control under the Se retary of all servants. He purchases the fish, veg tables and meat, etc., required for the Club, and make

12. He accounts daily with the Secretary for all moneys received by him.

## HOUSEKEEPER.

13. The Housekeeper is responsible for the cleanliness and order of the bedrooms, the care of the linen, and checks the same both on its delivery to and return from the laundry.

## HALL PORTER.

- 14. The Hall Porter has charge of the library, together with the periodicals and newspapers, and sees that the rooms are kept regularly supplied with paper, pens, etc.
- 15. He keeps a list of the addresses of all the members of the Club.

## EMPLOYEES.

- 16. No officers or servants shall receive any present whatever from the members of the Club; and any tradesmen detected giving presents will lose the custom of the Club.
- 17. The Waiters and all other servants in the establishment are subject to the orders of the Secretary and under him to the heads of the different departments and perform such duties as he or they may prescribe.
- 18. No servant shall absent himself from the Club House without leave from the Secretary.
- 19. Servants on duty in the dining-room must not leave it, unless sent by the Head Waiter or a member.

- 20. Servants while on duty must not talk to each other except on matters connected with their work, and then in a low tone; and no servant is permitted to address members in the house on matters either personal or relative to the concerns of the Club. All communications of the latter kind should be made to the Secretary for the information of the Committee.
- 21. If any money or articles are found in the Club they are to be delivered to the Secretary.
- 22. No stranger will be admitted into the Clu House except on business, and the servants are strictl prohibited from receiving visitors or followers.
- 23 No application for the reinstatement of a servant who may have been dismissed on the representation of a member will be read or taken into consideration, unless it comes through and is recommended by the member on whose representation he or she was dismissed.
- 24. The elevator attendant is not allowed to leave his post.

#### BEDROOMS.

- 25. Applications for bedrooms and notices of vacating same shall be respectively made and given to the Hall Porter, with whom also arrangements as to disposition of baggage shall be made.
- 26. A bedroom engaged on a monthly basis shall be charged for pro rata to the end of the current month any other broken period to be calculated at the dail rate.
- 27. No bedroom can be retained for more than four teen consecutive nights, except at the discretion of the Committee. A notice placed in the room shall be considered as having been delivered to the person occupying it.

- 28. Rooms must be vacated before 6 p.m. and baggage, etc., removed, otherwise an extra day will be charged. A bedroom reserved but unoccupied must be paid for.
- 29. Members are requested to lock their doors, and on departure to leave their key with the Hall Porter.
- 30. Two bedrooms shall always be reserved for non-resident members.
- 31. The charges for bedrooms shall be regulated by the Committee.
- 32. Only the servants of the Club, specially appointed for those duties, are to be employed to clean clothes, boots or shoes.
- 33. A bedroom may be used as a dressing-room only, at a charge of 50c, but if used as a bedroom the full charge must be paid.
- 34. No heavy baggage is allowed to be brought into the entrance hall. Hand baggage may be left in of the Hall Porter.

## DINING - ROOM.

- 35. Breakfast may be served from 8 to 11 a.m.
- 36. Luncheon from 12.30 to 3 p.m.
- 37. Dinner from 6 to 8 p.m. Orders not to be taken after 8 p.m. Lights to be extinguished at 8.30 p.m.
- 38. Members ordering meals will fill up their diningroom orders themselves and not employ the waiters to do so.
- 39. No table or seat can be reserved for any member.
- 40. Members are requested to vacate their seats within reasonable time after they have lunched or dined.

#### PRIVATE DINING - ROOMS.

- 41. The private dining-rooms may be engaged for special dinners or lunches if not less than five covers Reasonable notice must be given to the Steward beforehand.
- 42. The charge for using the private dining-rooms for LUNCHEON shall be 25 cents per head, with a minimum charge of \$2.50 and a maximum of \$12.50.
- 43. The charge for using the private dining-room for DINNER shall be 50 cents per head, with a mini mum charge of \$5 and a maximum charge of \$25.
- 44. No game of CARDS shall be played in the private dining-rooms excepting after a private dinner and then only by consent of the Committee. The Committee may delegate their powers to the House Committee, which shall have power to stipulate the conditions upon which the privilege may be granted.

### LADIFS' DINING - ROOM.

- 45. The ladies' dining-room shall be available fo dinner any evening except Sundays, by giving twenty four hours' notice to the Secretary or Steward.
- 46. Exclusive use of the room is not permissible except under special circumstances, and shall be subject to consent of the House Committee.
- 47. No additional charge will be made to smal parties dining during the usual dinner hours.
- 48. Under no circumstances may ladies be taken into any part of the Club but the rooms reserved for thei use.
- 49. Members shall pay for any article they may order before leaving the room in which it has been supplied.

## MAIL AND ADDRESSES.

- 51. The Hall Porter is expressly ordered not to take in any letters addressed to initials only, nor on any account to give up the address for letters or parcels of a member without written instructions from the member so to do, or on the instructions of the Committee through the Secretary.
- 52. If a letter for an absent member be applied for by another who wishes to forward it, the latter will be required to pay the postage, if any, and to sign an acknowledgement in the Porter's book of having received the letter, in case of future questions. But this must only be done with the authorization of the absent member.
- 53. The address book is not to be inspected by any person but the Committee and the Secretary.
- 54. No letter or communication for any newspaper shall be dated from the Club, nor shall the address of the Club be used for business purposes in any document or advertisement.

## BOOKS AND NEWSPAPERS.

- 55. Newspapers fixed to a frame may not be removed therefrom except by the servants appointed for that purpose.
- 56. Books and newspapers are not expected to be removed from the room in which they are kept.
- 57. A incomber is not allowed on any pretext to appropriate more than one newspaper or periodical at a time.

- 58. No pamphlet livertisement or advice of any kind will be laid not not tables or put in the Club by a member, bu pamphlet, etc., which it may be wished to make kind with the Club shall be sent to the Secretary to be said before the Committee for approval.
- 59. Strict silence must be observed in the Silent Reading Room.

#### TELEPHONES.

- 60. The telephones are for the personal use of members, and the servants are not allowed to use the instruments on their behalf.
- 61. Members calling up a party outside the Telephone Company's city limits must give the call through the Club's operator.

#### GENERAL.

- 62. A table of Auction Bridge shall consist of five players between the hours of 4 and 7 p.m.
- 63. The rooms of the Club shall be kept at a temperature of 65 degrees, and members are requested to aid in carrying out this rule.
- 64. A member may not place his feet upon the furniture unless it is specially provided for that purpose
- 65. Wearing apparel, umbrellas, etc., must be placed in the cloak-room and must not be left lying about the Club.
- 66. Any Club property which may be broken or injured by members is to be paid for by them.
- 67. Any member cutting the billiard cloth or spilling liquid thereon, will be fined \$5.00; and no member shall place a glass or cup on any part of the billiard table.

- 69. No subscriptions shall be solicited other than those pertaining to Club affairs, except by the consent of the Committee.
- 70. No canvessing in connection with the election of any candidate shall be permitted on the Club premises.
- 71. No refreshments shall be served in the front part of the hall.

#### GUESTS AND STRANGERS.

- 72. Fortnightly guests may not entertain guests other than members, nor shall temporary members be allowed to invite guests other than members into the Club.
- 73. Strangers calling to see members are to be shown into the reception rooms by the Hall Porter, and intimation of their arrival is immediately sent by him to the member inquired for.
- 74. No stranger will be permitted to view the house unless accompanied by a member.
- 75. Chauffeurs and messengers shall not be allowed to loiter on the Club premises.
- 76. The Committee may add to or alter any of the foregoing regulations as occasion may arise.
