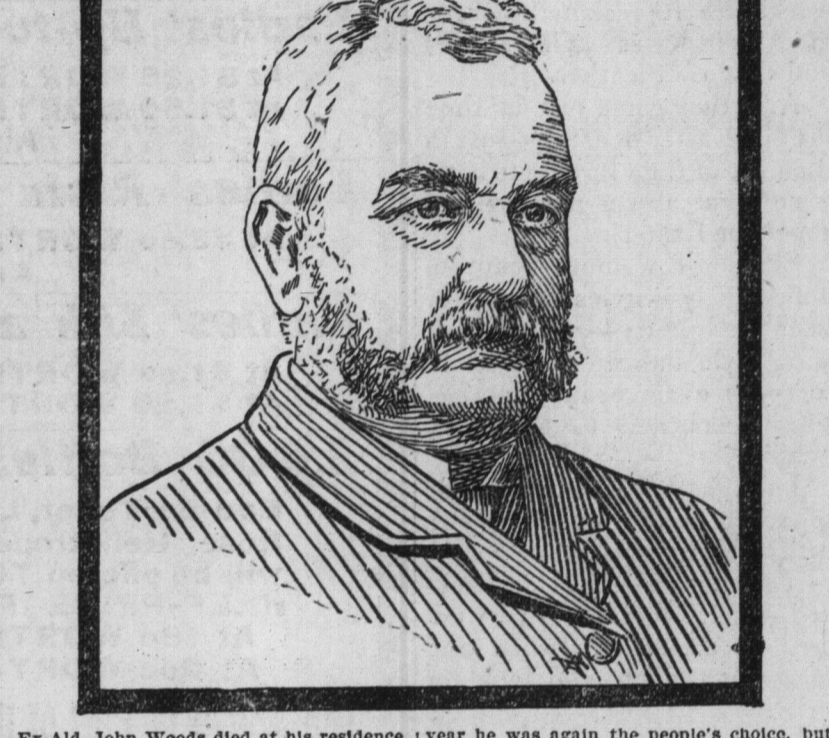

FORT STEELE SMELTER SITE.

Activity in East Kootenay—Machinery For Seine River—On Mining Exchange.

Now that East Kootenay has been opened up by the Crow's Nest Pass Railway the question of the erection of a smelter for the treatment of ores mined in that district comes to the front, and the Fort Steele smelter site is being discussed.

Its main arguments are that Fort Steele is centrally located for the mines of the district; that it is as near as possible to the place where coke and coal can be obtained; as near as possible to where the necessary fueling ore is abundant, and also where there is lots of water at hand.

The controlling interest in the "Giant" mine at Rossland has been secured by Montreal people. The controlling interest has been secured in a party of Spokane men, with A. D. Coplen as president.
