## ANNUAL MEETING, JUNE 1st., 1880.

---

The Annual Meeting of the friends and supporters of the Orphans' Home was held at the Institution on Sullivan Street. The attendance was large, and the majority of those present were ladies. Taking part in the proceedings were his Lordship the Bishop of Toronto, Ven. Archdeacon Whitaker, Rev. J. D. Cayley, Rev. A. J. Broughall, Rev. John Pearson, Rev. Mr. Parsons, Rev. Septimus Jones, his Worship the Mayor, Ald. McMurrich, Ald. McMurray, Major Bennett, Messrs. Andrew Fleming, A. R. Boswell, Huson W. Murray, Arnoldi, &c. Letters expressing regret at inability to attend were read from Rev. Dr. Potts, Rev. D. J. Macdounell, Rev. John Smith and Rev. H. D. Powis. His Worship the Mayor was called to the chair.

After devotional exercises Ex-Ald. Boswell read the Annual Report of the Managers of the Home. In moving its adoption he made reference to the labours of the ladies connected with the Institution, praising them for their indefatigable efforts to make the finances of the "Home" meet the requirements.

Rev. J. D. Cayley said that before the Report was adopted he wished to make the only remarks he would make that evening. There were some members of the City Council present, and he would just point out to them that the water supply of the Institution cost more than the fuel and light. He hoped that at some time in the future the item of water would be as free to the children as air.

Ald. McMurray seconded the adoption of the Report, which was carried.

Mr. Rev. Whitaker spoke in the highest praise of the Home, and of the cleanly, orderly manner in which the children were brought up.

Rev. Mr. Pearson in seconding the motion pointed out that the Report showed that about 100 children had been reared in this Home during the past year, at an

expense of \$5,000. That was, that each child had received food, clothing, schooling, and all the other necessities of life at the rate of \$50 per annum.

Rev. Septimus Jones spoke of the care and attention and even affection that were lavished by people on flowers, and sometimes on pet dogs, and remarked that, innocent as these hobbies might be, he would like to see such attention directed to such institutions as this. Where could they see a flower garden which would stir in them emotions equal to the scene presented by these immortal little ones who were seated before them that night. He moved, "That the thanks of the meeting be tendered to the officers and ladies who had so well attended to the Institution, more especially Miss Winn, the retiring Treasurer.

Major Bennett seconded the motion, which was carried unanimously.

Rev. Mr. Broughall moved the next resolution, to the effect that the thanks of the meeting were due to the Orangemen of Ontario for their liberal contributions to the funds of the Home,

The resolution was seconded by Mr. Arnoldi.

Mr. Andrew Fleming echoed the sentiments of the other speakers.

The Mayor said that he would like to make a few remarks before the meeting closed. Toronto was often called the city of Churches, and to this ought to be added, "and charities." The people of Toronto made grants through the Council to twenty-two charitable institutions in the city, and among all the grants they made, not one was, he believed, given to a more deserving charity than this "Orphan's Home. He had at one time held the opinion that the only charitable grants that the city should make were those to the General Hospital and the House of Industry, but that was in his callow days as a public man. Further observation had caused him to entirely alter that opinion, he now holding that no money spent in the civic service was fruitful of better results than these same grants.

The Bishop of Toronto said he had been invited to perform a task of a very pleasing character, and that was to convey to Mrs. Vankoughnet, who had been for twenty-nine years on the Board of Management, the thanks of the managers of the Institution and of the children for her labours. This expression of thanks was accompanied by a mark of gratitude in the shape of an album, within which was the following inscription :

"Presented to Mrs. Vankoughnet by the Matron, Children and Servants of the Orphans' Home, in affectionate recognition of her unvarying kindness and of her loving, zealous interest in their welfare."

The tribute, his Lordship said, though handsome and valuable, was small indeed compared with the reward which was in store for those who made the orphans their care.

Rev. J. D. Cayley briefly returned thanks on behalf of Mrs. Vankoughnet.

The customary vote of thanks was passed to the chairman.

The children during the evening sang some Kindergarten songs, and finished up by rendering the National Anthem. After prayer by the Rev. J. D. Cayley, the Bishop of Toronto pronounced the benediction, and the proceedings closed.

# ORPHANS' HOME

## ANNUAL REPORT 1880.

---

In presenting to their friends and the public the 29th Annual Report of the Orphans' Home and Female Aid Society, the Managers feel deeply sensible of the great blessing vouchsafed to the Home by a kind and overruling Providence throughout another year.

During that period it has been almost entirely free from any serious illness with the exception of measles, which appeared in the beginning of April; but which, under the Divine blessing, was attended with no fatal results.

Since the last Annual Meeting forty-three children have been admitted, fourteen girls and twenty-nine boys—the average number for the year being one hundred. Of these seven have been apprenticed, two adopted, twenty-eight removed by relatives and two absconded.

On the 13th of September last, at the request of the Lady Managers, H. R. Highness the Princess Louise, accompanied by Major DeWinton and Col. Gzowski, was pleased to honor the Home with a visit. H. R. Highness upon her arrival was received by Rev. J. D. Cayley and the first and second Directresses, and was greeted with the National Anthem sung by the children. At the conclusion of the singing of God Save the Queen, the Princess was presented with a basket of flowers by the youngest child in the Home; after which she was conducted over the Institution by the Lady Directresses, and upon her return to the Board Room expressed great satisfaction with what she had seen, and complimented the Matron upon the happy, healthy appearance of her little charges.

There had been in contemplation a purchase of land, with a view to the future erection of a Home with larger accommodation and more extensive grounds. Several advantageous offers were made, among others a site at Mimico, the property of the Ontario Government, which could have been procured at a reasonable rate; but before making a final decision the Committee of Council strongly urged the Board to seriously consider all the disadvantages, as well as supposed benefits accruing from the proposed change, and the idea was abandoned.

The Managers have much pleasure in acknowledging their appreciation of the Matron's unwearied efforts and interest in the Home and its inmates. From the proceeds of a concert entirely due to her exertions, a sum of \$39.00 was realized, and that together with a bequest of \$100.00 from the late Mr. Moon, enabled them to add a verandah to the north-eastern side of the House, which affords shelter to the little ones in unpleasant weather.

Miss Sheppard too, who for the past thirteen years has been employed as seamstress for the Home, and is now about to resign, deserves much credit for the faithful and efficient manner in which she has discharged her duties. The Mayor and Corporation at the request of the Board paid a visit to the Home, and expressed

much satisfaction with the internal arrangements and domestic management, as well as the progress of the children in the school-room under the present system. At the suggestion of Mrs. Riches, their teacher, the Managers provided drawing books for those of the children who evinced a decided taste, not only for copying designs but originating them, and under her able instructions they have made rapid progress.

It is possible that this graceful, and at the same time useful study, may be the means of developing a talent which in the future may afford to those who are capable, a lucrative profession.

A fire which might have been attended with very serious results, occurred in March in the Matron's room, the origin of which is unknown; fortunately it was discovered and subdued by the inmates before much damage had been done.

The children's annual picnic was held on the 22nd of August, at Lorne Park, and that with the kindly consideration shown by the captains of the various ferry boats, who in some instances gave the Matron *carte blanche* to bring the children at any time, disposed of the summer holidays pleasantly and healthfully.

Again the Home has received from the Orangemen of Toronto a substantial proof of their untiring interest in the orphan. The L.O.L. of Toronto contributed the handsome sum of \$100.00, the proceeds of an entertainment given by J. L. Morrison, in Shaftesbury Hall, April 12th, under the auspices of the above Lodge. This together with a bequest of \$200.00 from the late Mrs. Oliver Macklem, and \$40.00 from Miss Paterson, of Blantyre Park, the result of theatricals at Albert Hall, the Managers beg gratefully to acknowledge.

The Board takes this opportunity of thanking Mr. Huson Murray, their solicitor, for his unremitting attention to the affairs of the Institution; Dr. Ogden for his consideration to those who have required his care, and to the kind friends, who every Sunday devote a portion of their time to the religious instructions of the children.

To the tradesmen who have as usual thoughtfully contributed to the comforts of the children, the Managers feel much indebted.

It is with deep regret that the Committee have to record the retirement of Miss Winn from the position of Treasurer, which she has most ably and energetically filled for the past four years; and also of Mrs. C. H. Mockridge, who unweariedly devoted herself to the religious instruction of the little ones, until her removal from the City compelled a severance from the Home, when she was presented by the children with an appropriate address and present.

Annexed will be found the Treasurer's Report, giving an account of the financial affairs of the Home.
