TWENTY-FIFTH ANNUAL REPORT
OF
THE TORONTO MAGDALENE ASYLUM
OR
INDUSTRIAL HOUSE OF REFUGE.

In presenting our Twenty-Fifth Annual Report, we feel there is nothing especially new to present. We can see results of our work, but we cannot tell of the reflex good which our own hearts have received. The longer we work among the poor and sinful, the more do we realize the great need for wisdom and patience in trying to benefit them, the more do we prove that we need to be partakers of the gentleness and love of God; for rarely can we do good to those hardened in sin, unless we can make them know that we realize their temptations. The strongest power Christ has with us, is that He is touched with us in all our sorrows and temptations. And our strongest hold upon those less blessed than ourselves is still the same common bond of sorrow and trial.

All our gifts come from the Royal Treasury. Some, by His grace, He permits to hand these to others. If this privilege is given to us, let us not make the gift less precious because of our clumsy hands. But may we be so lost in the brightness of the Royal presence that His grace alone is seen and felt.

On the 1st of January, 1879, there were 40 inmates of the Home, 87 have been received since, making 127 in all. Of these 25 have been sent to service, 10 ran away, 15 went away before their year expired (some of these to service also), 15 were sent to the Burnside Hospital, 4 were sent home to friends, 3 allowed to look for situations, 1 to General Hospital, 2 have died, 2 were allowed to go on account of weakness of intellect, leaving 40 in the Home on the 1st of January, 1880. It will be seen that, in spite of the fact that it is a rule of this Institution that no one shall be admitted except those who promise to stay a year, 15 have been taken who had to be sent to the Burnside Hospital. These cases were all received under protest, but they were all cases of such extreme necessity, humanity demanded that, for the time, rules should become elastic. It is from no

want of sympathy that the Committee protests against receiving such cases, but because of their great sympathy. Our Home is for fallen women. These cases, of which we are speaking, are many of them very young girls who have heretofore lived respectable lives, and have been led to take one false step on the downward way. If right influences can at this point be thrown about them, there seems more hope that they may be led back to a virtuous life than there is in the other cases. Their very helplessness and dread of the future make them extremely susceptible to kindness. Assuming that they would receive no moral contamination from associating with those who have gone much further in the downward path, or even assuming that we could so arrange that we could keep this class entirely by themselves, our chief objection is this:—We are constantly receiving girls who have no sincere desire for reformation, for they leave us in a short time. A quiet, industrious life is too tame. These girls have seen this other class in the Home, they meet them again outside, perhaps living honest lives, and point at them as being "no better than we." And often, in spite of every effort, they become discouraged, and at last become in reality no better than the others. The greatest good can often be done by individual effort. We appeal to ladies, mistresses of servants—make your servants feel that you are their friends; make it your duty to know something of their friends, and of how they spend their hours of recreation. And if they fall, help them to rise again. Do not think it will soil your hands to give them a helping hand. If our Lord in His spotless purity could stoop to such as these, are we to hold aloof?

There often comes a crisis in the history of a human soul when an encouraging word will turn the scale towards the right. We never know when that time is, so the best way to be sure of saying these words at the right time is to say them always. Not in a spirit of sentimentalism which condones the sin and makes it too easy for the sinner, but let these know that there is such a thing as "leaving the things which are behind." The more we have of the spirit of Christ the deeper compassion we feel for those who make such sad use of this precious gift of life.

One of the two who died here during the year through long months of illness showed that she was trusting in Christ, feebly and falteringly, but He understands. The other had had every advantage of religious instruction, both before and after her entrance to the Home. She died suddenly, and we cannot feel sure of her state. We must leave her with Him also.

One case of flagrant insubordination occurred during the year. A number of the managers were summoned early one evening, as one of the inmates, an elderly woman, had been indulging in language and conduct which were insulting to the whole house. It was summer, and she was well supplied with clothes, but it was with feelings of great pain that we

sent her out. Had there been a shadow of softening or penitence we could not have done so, for we felt that perhaps she was throwing away her last opportunity.

We keep watch as much as possible over those who leave us from time to time, holding them still by all the cords within our reach. Some come back for the Sabbath services, others to tell of any joy or sorrow that comes to them, feeling that this is really their home where they look for sympathy.

We were obliged during the year to part with our Assistant-Matron, who had identified herself heartily with the Home, and only left to be nearer her own children. But her place is well filled by Miss Drennan, who was here in the same capacity several years ago, and so came among friends. Mrs. Spence, the Matron, continues to show her peculiar fitness for her position, and retains the respect and confidence of both Managers and inmates.

The religious services Sabbath mornings and evenings are still conducted by the same friends who have had them in charge so many years. The afternoon services have been conducted by ministers of different denominations, who have kindly consented to take them again this year.

The singing on Sabbath afternoon is taken in charge by a young lady who shows great interest in the work.

Dr. Britton has discharged his duties as medical counsellor and physician most faithfully.

The inmates have earned during the year the sum of \$1,249 07.

Through these years of commercial depression the Managers acknowledge with thankfulness the continued support from the friends of the Home. They have always had enough to carry on their work.

We never know our own powerlessness as when dealing with those who have no moral strength in themselves. We can make no appeal to their higher nature, for that is in the dust. We can only intercede with God to send His Spirit to enlighten the dark minds and to give strength for weakness. If there were many sick unhealed in Jerusalem on that day when His human feet took their last weary way through its streets, was it not because they had no faith in His healing power? Do you think the weakest hand was ever stretched out to Him in vain?

Let us all remember that "The Christ of God knows the footfall of them who seek Him, and for every step they take He takes ten to meet them."
