THE LAKES IN THE OLD COUNTRY.

An Interesting Description of These Famous Lakes by James H. Leamon, of Fredericton.

Aug. 14th, 1886. - There are three famous lake regions in the British Isles, one in each of the three kingdoms. We, that is to say, Roger and I, had made brief visits to the Irish and Scotch lakes and we now resolved to see for ourselves the lakes of Cumberland and Westmorland. We had been very much pleased with Killarney, although perhaps not so much with the scenery as with the novelty of the adventures we passed through while in the neighborhood. We had tramped through the gap of Dunlie, with its bare rocks rising up to a tremendous height on either side of us and the dark stream winding its way at the bottom of a ravine. We had been rowed across the lakes and had been favored with regular Irish weather in the shape of alternate rain and sunshine full forty times a day. We had shot the rapids connecting the lower lake with the two above and had been vividly reminded of a canoe trip made two summers ago in Arrowstock County, when we paddled down the Fish River from Eagle Lake to Fort Kent. We had seen the wild Trossasside and had inspected the ivy covered ruins of Ross and Muchness Abbey. The picturesque wildness of the whole scenery was accounted for by one of our guides in this way: When the giants had finished making the other counties of Ireland, they had a lot of rough material left, which they threw into one corner thus forming the County Killarney. The scenery along the lakes much resembled the scenery on the island of Mount Desert. This kind of scenery, while very beautiful, is not so interesting to an American, as we have very much in our own country in the same style but on a far grander scale. It is the coloring, however, that especially attracts the American eye, it is so much more varied than anything we have on the other side of the Atlantic. The bright green of the grass and foliage and the vivid yellow of the furs are sights which impress themselves on the unaccustomed observer in a way never to be forgotten.

On many of the Scotch lakes small steamers ply backwards and forwards and give an added pleasure to the visitor, such as cannot be had at Killarney. The scenery is of the same rugged mountain character, but instead of grass and forest, the land is in most places covered with a growth of brown heather. It is very unattractive to the eye this time of the year, but in the autumn when it is all covered with purple bloom it is said to be very beautiful. The principal charm of the Scotch lakes lies in their associations with the poetry and fiction of Sir Walter Scott. We sailed along one bright sunny morning over the surface of Loch Katrine, and as the tiny steamer was winding in and out among the islands, had pointed out to us the Silver Strand, Ellen's Isle and the pathway up its steep side, along which the led Pitt James, the "aged oak" and the spot where Pitt James would be high born, and lowering up on both sides of the lake we could see the lofty mountains of which Scott speaks.

"Mountains, which like giants stand, To sentinel enchanted land."

To a lover of Scott all this would have been an interest to the spot, even if the scenery of the lake had been possessed of no charm in itself. But I must hasten on to the English lakes. Roger and I had not much time to devote to them, but we made up our minds to see as much as we possibly could in the course of four or five days. Now there are different ways of seeing a country, one may speed along in a railway train at the rate of forty miles an hour, and if he chooses this way of travelling in England he will not see much of the country, for the trains are continually running through deep cuttings and diving into dark tunnels which effectually shut out all sight of the outer world. This mode of travel however

ing towns, are built in a peculiar fashion, the stately stones, with which they are made being placed on one another with out any mortar between them. This is as far as the outside appearance goes, but I doubt not there is plenty of mortar out of sight on the inside of the walls. After tea we walked out in the cool of the evening, noticing many an unfamiliar sight and sound as we passed along. On one street we observed three young fellows, "toughs" we would call them, walking along arm-in-arm very leisurely and singing "There is a fountain filled with blood," to an old familiar tune, the hymn being sung in painfully slow time and with a pause of ten seconds or so between each line; the whole thing had a most peculiar effect and we did not know whether to be mystified or amused by it. When we came back we asked our landlady what it all meant and she told us she supposed it was only some of the boys imitating the manner of singing among the Primitive Methodists who had a chapel near by. The river Greta flows past Kewick, its memory calling to mind Scott's poem—

"Oh! Greta banks are fair and gay,
And Greta woods are green."

It is only a narrow stream and we crossed it by an old stone bridge and proceeded up the road about a quarter of a mile to visit Crosshollow churchyard, where Southey is buried. We found the poet's grave covered only with a plain slab of slate and in no wise different from any of its neighbors. Coming out we walked for some distance farther along the road, catching every now and then a glimpse of Derwentwater through the trees. Walking along these well-made hard English country roads, on a fine day, is really a delight to all the senses; the fragrance of the woods and trees is borne towards you; the singing of birds fills the air, and the eye is charmed as well by the cottages, nestled amongst the trees, as by the natural beauties which meet its gaze. We returned to our hotel by a short cut through the fields, England being famous for its wonderful set of paths intersecting the whole country. As we came into the town we noticed a crowd in the market-place and stopped to listen to the words of a temperance evangelist, who was preaching on the parable of the good Samaritan; he was only a Lancashire working man as he told us, but his language and illustrations were capital. I remember he was speaking in a place about how money makes money and that the man who has a large capital has a much greater chance to accumulate than the man who starts with a small capital. To illustrate his point he quoted two passages from the Bible in a manner which I think would be novel to most of the commentators. In one verse it says "For not two sparrows sold for a farthing" and in another verse, "are not five sparrows sold for two farthings?" It being thus plain that the man who has sufficient capital to buy five sparrows gets a discount of twenty per cent. from retail prices.

THE POLITICAL OUTLOOK.
Our exchanges from the upper provinces continue to discuss the Hamilton election. The liberal papers are in high feather of course and the Tory journals are very much depressed. The so-called independent papers predict the defeat of the government. A fair sample of the latter class is the Toronto News, which thinks that the reign of Toryism is about to end. Most of the Quebec French papers take a very calm and sensible view of the matter, regarding the defeat of the Tory candidate as an indication that harmony can be restored between the two factions of our population, and that the last has been heard of French domination or the reconquest of Quebec. The Toronto Globe thinks that the general elections will be brought on this fall notwithstanding the liberal victory, but its reasons for holding this opinion don't appear at all conclusive. If the Tory premier thinks he stands a better chance to win now than next summer he will bring on the elections and that is all there is of it. The Quebec local elections will be over in a month and it is not probable that if these go against the local government, Sir John Macdonald will risk a dissolution this fall, unless it be that seeing the end approaching he will hasten to meet it. Personally he would probably be glad to get rid of his responsibility, but to many of his followers another seasonal allowance is a consideration while to the whole army of

corruptionists every mouth of plunder is valuable. If Sir John wishes to dissolve the commons he has an excellent pretext in the fact that the new electoral lists have just been prepared and it is a matter of constitutional usage to dissolve parliament immediately after any important change in the franchise in order that the new voters may have the earliest possible opportunity of being represented.

AGRICULTURAL SHOWS.

To continue the discussion of this subject, we wish to point out that there are two principal ways in which local agricultural shows may be beneficial. They may stimulate a healthy rivalry in the production of articles, or they may act as a sort of object lesson for inferior farmers by demonstrating what the more skillful are able to do. Owing to the limited area and the limited number of individuals to which competition is confined and also to the trifling nature of the premiums offered, the idea that the production of a good class of articles is stimulated to any great extent by the shows seems rather absurd. To a limited extent, and in a few localities, this effect may be produced, but we do not think that the result is the development of any better system of farming or the keeping of any better stock. It may be that the second effect named is accomplished to a considerable extent; but inasmuch as the best farmers do not always belong to the societies, and comparatively speaking only a very few people attend the shows, we can scarcely agree that the effect of the shows as popular educators is very great. This is the direction in which we look for the greatest benefit from shows. If by their means the best produce is brought together so that all may see it, and sufficient particulars as to yield and cultivation were given in each case a great deal of good might result. But in the great majority of shows we see something like the following: A bag of oats with a number on it, so that the judges may be supposed not to know whom it belongs to. There is nothing to tell whether it is a new variety or an old one, what system of cultivation was adopted, what the yield was, when the grain was sowed or harvested, or what they weigh. The judges come along, some of the grain is emptied into a peck measure; it is weighed, measure and all, and the result noted down and on they pass to the next sample, and the harvest gets the prize. Let us suppose that this plan were adopted instead; above every sample of oats or other grain or article of produce let there be a card in this form: name of article, variety, yield per acre, time of sowing, time of harvesting, cultivation, character of soil. If such a form as this, varied to suit each article, were adopted, an agricultural show would be indeed an object lesson; but as things are now conducted we fear that the only manner in which they are conducted and not to the show themselves. In several parts of the province there is a strong feeling in favor of the consolidation of all the agricultural societies in a county or a district embracing two or more counties, and the holding of extensive annual shows with large premiums in order to general competition. Under the law, as it now stands, at least \$5,000 of the provincial grant may be expended in premiums in any one year, provided all the societies hold shows, or a larger sum may be used for that purpose, provided the local subscriptions are increased for an amount that may be taken out of the grant equal to the subscriptions and donations of no more. Now let us suppose that the subscriptions and donations reach \$6,000, and they come pretty well up to it, this gives under the present law \$12,000 available for premiums every year, or enough, if put in one fund, to provide a premium list of \$3,000 for four shows. In view of this it has been suggested that the province might be divided into four districts and four shows be held every year, and not always at the same point in the district, if it was thought desirable to change the locality. We do not desire to be understood as being committed to this idea, but we are quite satisfied that unless the agricultural society shows can be rendered of more general utility a strong agitation will arise for their abolition.
