## THE FORM OF PRAYER

## FOR THE

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> II The Bishop, with his Chaplains, is received at the door of the Cathedral by the Dean, the Chirch-vardens, and Members of Select Vestry. The Dean presents to the Bishop the Petition praying him to consecrate the Cathedral. Then the Bishop, with the Dean and Chaplains, and other accompanying Clergy, enters the Cathedral in procession, saying the the 24th Psalm:

## Psaln xxiv.

THE earth is the Lord's, and all that therein is; the compass of the world; and they that dwell therein.
2. For he hath founded it upon the seas, and prepared it upon the floods.
3. Who shall ascend into the hill of the Lord, or who shall rise up in his holy place!-
4. Even he that hath clean hands, and a pure heart; and that hath not lift up his mind unto vanity, nor sworn to deceive his neighbour.
5. He shall receive the blessing from the Lord, and righteousness from the God of his salvation.
6. This is the generation of them that seek him, even of them that seek thy face, O Jacob.
7. Lift up your heads, 0 ye gates ; and be ye lift up, ye everlasting doors: and the King of Glory shall come in.
8. Who is the King of Glory? It is the Lord, strong and mighty, even the Lord mighty in battle.
-9. Lift up your heads, 0 ye gates; and be ye lift up, ye everlasting doors : and the King of Glory shall come in.
10. Who is the King of Glory? Even the Lord of Hosts, He is the King of Glory.

Glory be to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Ghost ;

I When they come to the Lord's Table, the Bishop, taking his seat in a chair on the North side thereaf, the Deed of Conveyance is presented to him by the Dean; the Bishop lays it on

- the table, and standing on the North side, turns to the Corrgregation, and says :

DEARLY beloved in the Lord; forasmuch as devout and holy men, as well under the Law as under the Gospel, moved either by the secret inspiration of the Holy Spirit, or by the express command of God; or by their own reason and sense of order and decency, have erected houses for the public worship of God, and separated them from all. profane and common uses; which godly practice hath a manifest tendency to adyance the honour of God's holy name, and to enliven the devotion of those who are engaged in his service: let us humbly hope, that our heavenly Father will favourably approve our present purpose, of setting apart this place in solemn manner, for the performance of the several offices of religious worship; and let us faithfully and devoutly pray for his blessing on this our,undertaking.
TThen the Bishop, kneeling doom, says the following Prayer:

0ETERNAL God, mighty in power, of majesty incomprehensible, whom the heaven of heavens cannot contain, much less the walls of temples made
with hands, who yet hast been gracionsly pleased to promise thine especial presence in whatever place even two or three of thy faithful servants shall assemble in thy name to offer up their supplications and their praises to thee; vouchsafe, $\mathbf{O}$ Lord, to be present with us who are here gathered together, to consecrate this place, with all humility and realiness of heart, to the honour of thy great Name ; separating it henceforth from all unhallowed, ordinary, and common uses, and dedicating it entirely to thy service, for reading therein thy most IIoly Word, for celebrating thy Holy Sacraments, for offeriitig to thy glorious Majesty the sacrifices of prayer and tlianksgiving, for blessing thy people in thy naine, and for jerforming all other holy Ordinances which may be lawfully solemnised therein. Accept, 0 Lord, this service at our hands, and bless it with such success, as may tend most to thy glory, and the salvation of thy people, through Jesus Chist our Lord and Saviour. Amen.

> II Then the Bishup, strumlin! up, turns towards the Conyreyur tioil (uoho contime kinecliny), and stass the following Proyer:

REGARD, $O$ Lord, the supplications of thy scrvants ; and grant that whosoever shall be dedicated to thee in this houso by Baptism, may be sanctified ly the IIoly Ghost, delivered from thy wrath and eternal death, and being made a living member of Chist's Church, may ever remain in the number of thy faithful and elect children. Amen.

GRANT, 0 Lord, that they who in this place shall $U$ in their own persons renew the promises and vows male for them by their sureties at their Baptism, and thereupon be confirmed by the Bishop, may continue thine for ever ; and being preserved in
the unity of thy Church, may daily increase in thy Holy Spinit more and more, until they come to thine èverlasting kingdom. Amen.

MRAN'I, O Lord, that whosoever shall receive in U this place the blessed Sacrament of the Body and Blood of Christ, may come to that holy ordinance with a true penitent heart, lively faith, and perfect charity ; and being filted with thy grace and heavenly benediction, may, to their great and enlless comfort, obtain remission of their sims, and all other bencfits of : Ilis passion. Ane'm.

$G$RANI, O Lord, that whosoever shall be joined U together in this place in the holy estate of Matrimony, may faithfully perform and keep' the vow and covenant betwixt them male, and remain in ferfect ,love and peace together unto their lives' end. Wimen.

$G$RANT, O Lord, that by thy IIoly Word which shall U be read and preached in this place, the hearers thereof may both perceive and know what things they ought to do, and also may have grace and power faithfully to fulfil the same. Amen.

$G$RAN'T, O Lord, that whosoever shall confess their sins, and offer up their prayers and praises unt, thy Divine Majesty in this place, may draw near unt: thee with such stedfastness of faith, and with such seriousness, sincerity, and devout affection of mind, that they may be graciously accepted in thy sight: : 0 Lard, pardon their sins, compassionate their infirmatics, enlighten and sanctify them by the Holy Spirit, so to serve and worship thee here below, that finally they may be received into thy presence, to praise and
onlorify thee for evermore. Grant this, o Lord, for Jesus Christ's sake, nur only Meiliator and Alvocate. Amen.

## Commanior Serbice.

IT The Bishop reads the Commiunion Scrvice; and instead of the Collect for the day, says the following Prayer :
(). MOST glorious God, we acknowledge that we are not worthy to offer unto thee any thing belonging to us; yet we besech thee, of thy great goodness, graciously to accept the Dedication of this Place to thy worship and service, and to prosper this our undertaking: Receive the prayers and inter cessions of us, and all other thy servants, who, either now or hereafter, entering into this thine. house, shall call upon thee ; and by thy grace prepare our hearts
to serve theo with reverence and godly fear. Affect us with an awful apprehension of thy Divine Majesty, and with a deep sense of our own unworthiness; that so, approaching thy sanctuary with lowliness and devotion, with purity and sincerity of heart, we may be acceptable in thy sight, through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

The Epistle. Eph ii. 13.
NOW in Christ Jesus, ye who sometimes were far off are made nigh by the blood of Christ. For he is our peace, who hath made both one, and hath broken down the middle wall of partition between us; having abolished in his flesh the enmity, even the law of commandments contained in ordinances, for to make in himself of twain one new man, so making peace; and that he might reconcile both unto God in one body by the cross, having slain the enmity thereby; and came and preached peace to you which were afar off, and to them that were nigh. For through him we both have access by one Spirit unto the Father. Now, therefore, ye are no more strangers and foreigners, but fellow-citizens with the Saints, and of the household of God; and are built upon the foundation of the apostles and prophets, Jesus Christ himself being the chief corner-stone; in whom all the building fitly framed together groweth unto an holy temple in the Lord; in whom ye also are builded together, for an habitation of God through the Spirit.

## The Gospel. St. John, ii. 13-18.

ND the Jews' passover was at hand, and Jesus went up to Jerusalem; and found in the temple those that sold oxen, and sheep, and doves, and the changers of money sitting. And when he had made

## The Serman.

TT Then follow the Offertory and the Prayer for the Church Militant; and immediately before the final blessing, the Bishop says the following prayers.
RLESSED be thy name, 0 Lord God, for that it pleaseth thee to have thy habitation among the sons of men upon earth, and to dwell in the midst of

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the assembly of the saints upon earth; bless, we beseech thee, the religious solemnity of this day; and grant that in this place, now set apart to thy service, thy holy Name may be worshipped in truth and purity to all generations, through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

0GOD, the Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, our only Saviour, the Prince of Peace; we beseech thee to take away from us all pride and prejudice, and whatsoever else may hinder us from godly union and concord; that as there is but one body and one spirit, and one hope of our calling, one Lord, one faith, one baptism, one God and Father of us all, so we may henceforth be all of one heart and of one soul, united in one holy bond of truth and peace, of faith and charity, and may with one mind and one mouth glorify thee ; through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.
