London, Oct. 26.—The Bucharest, Rumanian, and the Times sends the following: "The Serbian troops have withdrawn from the neighborhood of the Danube and the Austrians have crossed the river.

Protected by their artillery, the Austro Germans crossed the Danube in boats and installed five batteries on the Serbian shore.

In the evening the Russian steamer Tiraspal bombed Orsova.
