The habit of sending money through the postffice or by another system of transmission and neglecting to take a receipt therefor is a very careless and improper one. It is an injustice to the sender as well as to the government or company to which the money i paid to: transmission or through which it is sent. For example, a person secures a money order for the outside Will Sail Tonight With Large BON VOYAGE and takes no receipt for money paid, or fails to take a receipt for a regis tered letter and it miscarries, the fact that he has no receipt to show at the postoffice to which he entrusted the money makes the work of hunting over the records extremely slow and difficult. It may take valuable time to issue receipts, but in case of the miscarriage of a letter it is nothing compared to the valuable time it takes to search the records in order that a tracer may be sent out. It is a good business principle to take, receipts for all money paid
