Assessment of Guelph for 1873 The Assessors have completed their labors, and handed to the Town Clerk the Assessment Roll for 1873, The return are as follows: Total valne of real property \$1,993,500; non-resident lands \$45,080; personal property and income \$361,980—grand total \$2,100,560. The total assessment for the year 1872 was \$1,806,710 shewing an increase this year of \$293,850. The population this year as returned by the assessors is 7798. For 1872 it was 7189-shewing an increase in one year of 609. The increase of population in 1872 over that of 1871 was 300, shewing that last year the increase in our population is double what it was the previous year. This is a most gratifying exhibit, and affords the surest evidence of the continued growth and prosperity of the Town. We doubt very much whether any town in the Province can show a similar increase, whether as regards population or property, real or personal.







Terrible Explosion.

About half-past twelve o'clock on Wednesday the boiler in the foundry of Merrit & Bargov (late Barr's), situate on Marks ret, N w h, nx folled, with terrific force, instantly killing two men, named Hance Stevenson, the engineer, and Allan McLeod, the fireman, being all the men in the foundry at the time, with the exception of a stranger looking for some hands, who mysteriously escaped serious, if not fatal injury, by standing on the opposite side of the smoke-stack at the time of the explosion. The appearance of the ruins beggars description, the building being a complete wreck. The fright eccasioned by the crash accompanying the explosion was great, men, women and children running into the streets, believing an earth-quake had visited the village. The cause of the accident can, of course, only be conjectured. Stevenson and McLeod are married, with young families, and the greatest sympathy is felt by the inhabitants for the distressed wives, mothers and children. An inquest was convened by Coroner Carrol, at three o'clock, p. m., to investigate the cause of the disaster, and after the jury had viewed the bodies, adjourned till Thursday evening, at seven, p. m. The estimated loss is between two and three thousand dollars.
