

ALD. BOSTEAD STEPS OUT

THE CHAIRMAN OF THE EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE RESIGNS HIS SEAT.

The first question that is discussed in this important matter is the question of the mayoralty, especially since Ald. Bostead has resigned his seat in the council.
