END OF LEGISLATURE NO TIME FOR PRAYERS

Recent Session Was the Busiest Yet, and Work Was Continued Up Till the Last.

Yesterday the first session of the 12th legislature of Ontario was protracted by Lieut.-Gov. Gibson. In all 166 bills were assented to, which is the largest number passed at any single session since Confederation, 146 having been passed in 1908, and 126 in 1907.

Prayers were omitted in order that his honor should not be kept waiting, and the house passed a bill amending section 17 of the Statute Amendment Act, 1909.

Occupying members seats were Chief Justice Sir William R. Meredith, Justice Hiddell, Justice Pringle, and Justice Falcouner and Hon. R. Sutherland, Speaker of the house of commons.

A guard of honor was provided by the Queen's Own Rifles and the 8th Field Battery fired the usual salute of 13 guns.

His honor was met by Sir James Whitney and was preceded to the legislative chamber by Lt.-Col. Seppings, who acted as chief of staff.

"Recent events have made it again clear the constant watchfulness is necessary to prevent interference with the jurisdiction of this and the other provinces thru the medium of federal legislation, and it is to be hoped that a permanent understanding will be reached by means of which this danger may be removed."

Hon. Dr. Payne then pronounced the legislature prorogued.
