REPORT.

IT is with satisfaction and thankfulness that the Board of Management of "The Toronto Home for Incurables" have to present their third Annual Report.

This Institution was established for the purpose of providing a home for the maintenance and care of those who are, in the providence of God, suffering under incurable disease, and at the same time destitute of means for their own support, and of friends able and willing to care for them. Owing to the limited accommodation of the house presently occupied as "The Home," the anxiety of the Board has been to admit such as appear to be the most needy and fitting subjects for reception into it. They have, consequently, sought to make such inquiries regarding all cases of application as would enable them to select the most deserving, and thus to carry out more effectually the benevolent design of the Institution. If, in some cases, applications were declined, it has been generally with the unanimous sentiment of the Board, that either they were not of the class of persons intended to be benefited, or that there were others who seemed more entitled, from helplessness and want of means and friends, to the favourable consideration of the Board.

It is matter of congratulation that the subscriptions have been hitherto sufficient to meet all expenses, and for such liberal support the Board of Management desire to express their hearty thanks. It was in the confidence of such being supplied that "The Home" was established, and as they have not been disappointed therein they take encouragement to go forward in the work of endeavoring to alleviate the distress of a class of poor and afflicted, who peculiarly call forth our feelings of sympathy, assured that by the blessing of God they shall be enabled still farther to extend the benefits of "The Home."

Since the opening of "The Home" thirty patients have been admitted afflicted with various diseases. Of these six have died and eight

have left—two of them having been taken to the General Hospital—and the others having been removed by friends who appeared willing to attend to them.

There are at present 16 in "The Home"—10 females and 6 males. Several applications are under consideration to fill up the vacancies which have been recently made by death and removal.

At the last annual meeting it was stated that the managers had been seriously considering the necessity of securing more commodious premises. They considered themselves fortunate at first in having found a house so suitable as the present one, with grounds attached for the use of the inmates. The only fault is the insufficient size of the building.

The experience of the past year has impressed the Board more deeply with the conviction that larger accommodation is urgently required. Applications from other places are constantly made from month to month, which cannot be entertained. The plain intimation to them, therefore, is to go forward, believing that what is necessary for gradually extending the benefits of the Institution will, in the Divine goodness, be supplied.

Enquiries have accordingly been made with the view of obtaining a site sufficiently large for commodious buildings, and for ground to provide the means of wholesome exercise for the patients, in so far as they may be able to take it. The lease of the present house does not expire for two years, still it is desirable to secure a proper site, and to be ready to take action, as circumstances may direct.

Divine service is conducted every Sabbath afternoon with the inmates of "The Home." The Board of Management desire to express their grateful acknowledgments to ministers, students of divinity, and others who have cheerfully complied with the request to hold such service. The privilege is highly appreciated by the patients, deprived, as they are, of access to the public ordinances of the sanctuary.

To the medical staff of the institution, the managers are under special obligations. Each of them undertakes the care of "The Home" for a week in succession, visiting during his own week, as often as he can, or as may be necessary. From the condition of the inmates, they fre-

quently require the aid of medical skill. The friends of the Institution, therefore, cannot but feel grateful for the kindly interest which the physicians have shown in the welfare of "The Home," and for the valuable services which they have gratuitously rendered.

The superintendent and matron, Mr. Thomas McKenny and Mrs. McKenny, have shown themselves capable of keeping "The Home" in good order and efficiency. The Board of Management have reason to be satisfied with the manner in which they have discharged their duties and attended to the wants of the inmates.

The Board cannot present this report without adverting to the great loss "The Home" has sustained in the removal by death of Mr. C. S. Ross, who has in the origination and since the establishment of the Institution taken the deepest interest in its welfare, and spared himself no trouble or exertion for that end. His wise counsels and active labors will be much missed. May the Lord raise up others of similar spirit to work in the same cause!

In closing this report the managers desire to acknowledge the good hand of God in enabling them not only to carry on, through the liberality of the citizens of Toronto, and the grants from the Government, and the city, the benevolent work entrusted to them, but to entertain the hope of greater things in the future. It is only, as it were, now the day of small things. But the Lord does not despise such. The history of similar institutions furnishes evidence of this. Wherever they have been set up, they have gradually gathered around them the sympathies of the charitable and the humane, till they have become the means of extensively alleviating the distress and cheering the hearts of many, who would otherwise have dragged out a miserable existence, aggravated by bodily suffering and hopelessness of recovery. May this be, by God's blessing, the future of the "Toronto Home for Incurables."
