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#### CONSTITUTION AND BY-LAWS

OF THE

# PROVINCE OF QUEBEC RIFLE ASSOCIATION.

## CONSTITUTION.

As Revised August, 1881.

- 1. That this Association be called the "PROVINCE OF QUEBEC RIFLE ASSOCIATION," and shall have for its object the encouragement of rifle shooting in the Province.
- 2. Any person subscribing Two dollars to the funds of the Association shall be a member thereof for the year in which such subscription shall be made.
- 3. A donation of Twenty dollars in cash, at any one time, for that express purpose, or of a prize of not less value than Forty dollars, to be competed for at the Annual Prize Meeting, shall make the donor eligible for election as a Life Member at next Annual Meeting of Council.
- 4. Any regularly constituted Rifle Association or Corps subscribing Ten dollars or upwards, per annum, to the funds of the Association shall be considered as being in connection with it, and shall be entitled to a number of memberships, for competition only, in proportion of one for every dollar so subscribed. The Association thus affiliating is to select from its members the persons to hold such memberships.
- 5. There shall be a Patron and Vice-Patrons, named by the Council. (The Lieutenant-Governor of the Province of Quebec for the time being shall be respectfully requested to become "Patron.")

- 6. There shall be a President, to be elected at the Annual Business Meeting of the Association.
- 7. There shall be four Vice-Presidents—one for each Brigade-Major's Division—to be elected in the same manner as the President.
  - 8. There shall be a Council composed as follows, viz:
    - 1st. Eight members to be elected annually at the Business Meeting.
    - 2nd. One representative member from each affiliated Association or Corps in this Province.
- 9. The President, Vice-Presidents, the District Deputy Adjutants-General of Militia and Brigade-Majors of the Province of Quebec, shall be members ex-officio of the Council. Five members of Council shall form a quorum; and in the event of vacancies occurring in the elective members, from any cause whatever, the remaining members of the Council shall have the power of filling such vacancies. All members of Council, excepting representatives of affiliated Associations, must be Individual members of the Association.
- 10. Representatives to the Council shall be chosen by the Associations they represent, and the names of delegates when changed shall be sent to the Secretary at least one month prior to the Annual Meeting.
- 11. The Council shall, at its first meeting, choose from its members a Chairman.
- 12. There shall be a Secretary and a Treasurer, both to be appointed annually by the Council, and holding office during pleasure.
- 13. The Council shall have the sole management of the income and funds of the Association, rendering an account to the yearly meeting, such account having been previously audited by a person or persons, not members of the Council, who shall be annually named by the Council for that purpose. The Council shall also have

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Asso on th the entire management and superintendence of the affairs and concerns of the Association, and shall or may do all such acts or deeds as shall appear to them necessary or essential to be done for the purpose of carrying into effect the object and views of the Association.

- 14. The Council shall be regulated in their proceedings by such By-laws as may from time to time be enacted by them; no by-law being in any case altered, or new one proposed, without at least one month's notice of such intention being given to each member of Council.
- 15. The Annual Prize Meeting shall be held at such time and place as may be determined on by the Council; and the prizes shall be competed for in accordance with such regulations as may be passed from time to time by the Council.
- 16. An Annual Report, embracing an audited account of the finances, shall be drawn up by the Secretary, and shall (having been previously submitted to the Council) be published as soon after the Prize Meeting as may be found practicable.
- 17. An Annual Business Meeting of the members of the Association, for the election of Officers and Council, who shall assume office on first day of succeeding January, and the transaction of other business, shall be held at such time and place as may be determined on by the By-Laws.
- resolution duly passed at the Annual Business Meeting, or some adjournment thereof, and no such resolution shall be proposed unless a notice in writing of the terms of such resolution, signed by two members as proposer and seconder thereof, shall have been given to the Secretary one month, at least, previous to the Annual Business Meeting at which the same is to be proposed; and it shall be the duty of the Secretary to immediately notify all members of the Association of such proposed amendments, and also to post them on the bulletin-board at the opening of the Annual Matches.

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#### BY-LAWS.

As Revised 5th May, 1881.

- 1. The Annual Business Meeting of the Association shall be held on the second day of the Annual Matches.
- 2. There shall be two Ordinary Meetings of the Council, the first of which shall be held immediately after the Annual Business Meeting of the Association, and the second at such other time as the Council may then determine upon.
- 3. Extraordinary Meetings shall be summoned by the Secretary, if required by any six members of the Council, notification being sent to each member of Council at least ten days previous to such meeting; and the requisition for the meeting, and the notices to the members, must state the object or objects of such Extraordinary Meetings.

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- 4. The Council shall keep minutes of its proceedings at all meetings, which shall be entered in a book kept for that purpose by the Secretary, open to the inspection of all members of the Council, and published with the Annual Report.
- 5. There shall be a Finance Committee, consisting of three members of the Council, to be chosen at their first meeting.
- 6. The Treasurer shall deposit from time to time, in such chartered Bank as the Finance Committee may direct, all sums of money received by him on behalf of the Association.
- 7. All expenditure for current expenses, which may be required by the Secretary, must be authorized by the signature of a member of the Finance Committee, and the Treasurer shall pay all orders duly signed in such manner. Other expenditures of a general nature are to be made only upon the authority of the Council of the Association.
- 8. A detailed statement of all Receipts and Expenditures shall be rendered annually to the Council by the Treasurer.

The thanks of the Association are also due to the Canadian Pacific Telegraph Company, for placing an office and operator on the grounds during the Matches, for the convenience of the competitors.

#### RANGES.

The new Ranges at Cote St. Luc being still in an incomplete state, your Council had to consider whether it was possible to hold the Annual Matches on these Ranges or not. They visited the grounds, in company with the Engineer of the Militia Department, Mr. F. White, and on his promising that certain necessary work should be completed, your Council decided to hold the Annual Prize Meeting on these Ranges.

At present there are in position 20 second and third-class targets, with the necessary firing points, but no marking discs; also a portion of a long range butt for 800 or 900 yards, with incomplete target frame and no discs. The drainage of the target pits in the short range butt is still defective, as is also the drainage of the whole Range.

#### PERMANENT WORK.

Owing to the inconvenience of obtaining meals for the competitors during the Matches, your Council decided to build a cookhouse on the grounds, which was done at a cost of \$183.67, and a cooking range was donated by Messrs. William Clendinneng & Son, to whom the warm thanks of the Association are due. A Caterer was arranged with, and the Council believe the meals furnished by him were most satisfactory. At the close of the Matches a large

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quantity of the moveable property of the Association was stored away in the cook-house, thus saving an annual charge for cartage, which had to be incurred each time the property was moved. It is to be regretted, however, that some evil-disposed persons have already broken the staple of the door, with what intention it is hard to say, as none of the property seems to have been touched.

A permanent telephone line down the Range was also built, but was not quite satisfactory; and your Council would suggest that next year the poles should be altered to go down the centre of the Range, instead of down the sides.

A suggestion has been made to the Council that the different Regimental Rifle Associations would be glad to pay the Association a small rental for the use of the telephone line during their Annual Matches. This would certainly enable the line to be kept in proper repair, and is a matter that ought to receive consideration.

#### PRIZE MEETING.

The programme was drawn up pretty much on the lines of last year, with the following additions: A Nursery Series was added to the Frontier Match, with the object of encouraging young shots. Also a Nursery Aggregate Team Match, in which the beautiful shield presented by Messrs. John Martin & Co. was offered as First Team Prize. And your Council would suggest adding still further attractions to the Prize List for the competitors, who, while not Nursery men, are still but Intermediate shots.

A Battalion Team Match also, for special Prizes, might be added to the present Active Militia Match, in which the teams would be 15 to 20 men each, which, while not discouraging those Battalions who at present send to compete just about the number required for the present Battalion Teams, would encourage those Battalions who are ready to put in Teams of 15 or 20 men each.

The railway facilities for reaching the Ranges were all that could be desired, and the thanks of the Association are due to the Canadian Pacific Railway for the kind and considerate manner in which they met the desires of your Council.

The distance of the Ranges from the city induced the Council to provide more than the usual camping accommodation, which was taken advantage of by the competitors to a certain extent, and no doubt many more will in future avail themselves of the privileges accorded.

The Entries were very satisfactory, when it is taken into consideration that the Range was entirely new to all the competitors outside the city of Montreal, and that it could not be expected that all the details would be in as thorough working order as in the old Ranges. There were 33 Team and 1,826 Individual Entries as against 33 Teams and 1,944 Individual Entries last year, the largest number of entries in any regular Match being 153 in the Frontier as against 152 in the Association last year, and 503 in the Extra Series, 600 yards, as against 413 in the same Match last year.

We have 27 Individual Members and 19 Affiliated Associations, having lost since last year the Ottawa County R. A., and the No. 6 Company, 43rd Battalion, R. A., and gained the 85th Battalion R. A., Hemmingford R. A., 52nd Battalion R. A., and "B" Battery R. A., the latter being the first of the permanent corps to affiliate, and send a team to compete at our Matches. We trust that "B" Company, Infantry School, will follow suit.

The conduct of the Matches was under the direction of Lt.-Col. Mattice, Executive Officer, with Major Radiger and Capt. Winters as Range Officers, and everything ran smoothly. Next year it would be advisable to have three Range Officers, instead of two, as the work is too much for two to do efficiently. The Marking was done by men brought from Ottawa for that purpose, no qualified men being obtainable here at a reasonable charge, and was not as satisfactory as it should have been. Your Council are of opinion that some means should be taken by the Association to train Markers during the season, who would be available for the Matches, and have some experience. There should be no difficulty about this, provided the different Battalions would co-operate with the Association. It would also be well if Regimental Rifle Associations would endeavour to induce the non-commissioned officers to attend the regular Satur-

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day afternoon practice, and qualify themselves as Register Keepers, as it is very difficult to obtain experienced men for the Matches. Is there no possibility of "B" Infantry School being induced to supply a certain proportion of men for this work; also "B" Battery, R. C. A.?

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The change of the manner of deducting points for bad volleys in the Skirmishing Match seems to have been satisfactory.

#### MEDALS, CUPS, &c.

The Governor-General's Silver Medal was won by Staff-Sergt. McAdam, Victoria Rifles, with 77 points.

The Governor General's Bronze Medal was won by Pvt. J. Waters, 6th Fusiliers, with 77 points.

The Lieutenant-Governor's Medal was won by Pvt. McMartin, Royal Scots, with 91 points.

The Dolan Cup was won by Staff-Sergt. McAdam, Victoria Rifles, with 92 points.

The "City of Montreal" Jubilee Challenge Cup was won by the Royal Scots, with 462 points.

The "Association" Cup was won by the Victoria Rifle Club, of Hamilton, with 253 points.

The Aggregate Cup was won by the Victoria Rifle Club, of Hamilton, with 906 points.

The N. R. A. Medal and P. Q. R. A. Championship Badge was won by Pvt. McMartin, Royal Scots, with 195 points.

The D. R. A. Silver Medal was won by Staff-Sergt. McAdam, Victoria Rifles, with 192 points.

The D. R. A. Bronze Medal was won by Pvt. Pope, Victoria Rifles, with 217 points.

The Martin Nursery Challenge Shield was won by the Victoria Rifles, with 870 points.

#### FINANCES.

The extra expenses incidental to opening a new Range have run away with the most of our cash balance, o the Council trust that all members will endeavour to increase the interest of the general public in the work of the Association, so that increased subscriptions will follow.

#### PUBLIC PRESENTATION OF PRIZES.

No presentation of Prizes took place this year, but in place of it a Reception was held by the Honourable the Minister of Militia, who came to Montreal especially for the purpose. A Band was engaged, and special trains ran; but, unfortunately, the weather proved unpropitious. However, quite a number of ladies and gentlemen attended, and took great interest in examining the targets, &c.

#### CONSTITUTION.

Attention is called to the change in the Constitution, which now enables members of Council to be elected irrespective of the Brigade Division in which they reside.

#### PROPERTY.

A list of property is attached, nearly all the articles being stored in the cook-house on the Range.

#### D. R. A. MEETING.

The Province was well represented at the Dominion Matches, winning a large proportion of the principal Prizes, Pvt. Burns, of the Victorias, being especially fortunate in carrying off the first place in the Governor-General's and 250.

In the Provincial Contest for the London Merchants' Cup, Quebec only took 5th place, about the worst showing ever made by the Province; and your Council would strongly advocate the changing of the cast-iron rule, which obliged the Secretary to choose the team from the highest aggregate in the Martini Matches at Ottawa, and would suggest that in future the mode followed by Ontario should be adopted, and that the Secretary, with those members of Council present in Ottawa at the Matches, should pick the Team which, in their judgment, would best represent the Province, irrespective of scores made in Ottawa.

#### ONTARIO MATCHES.

Our representatives in the O. R. A. Matches did fairly well this year, winning two Team Prizes, besides a number of Individual Prizes, viz.:—

2nd Team Prize in the Walker, by the Montreal Rifle Association.

3rd Team Prize in the Tait Brassey, by the Royal Scots.

#### SUGGESTIONS.

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Whilst we certainly have reason to be pleased with the progress made during the past season, we think it would be well for the new Council to profit by this year's experience, and endeavour to have the defects remedied. As has been stated, we require some first-class targets, as we have none at present, and we also need more second-class targets. The drainage of the target-pits should be attended to. The grass on the Range should be kept short during the whole shooting season. This would make the ground behind the firing points drier, and more comfortable for those waiting their turn to shoot. The firing points themselves need re-sodding and levelling.

We certainly require more experienced and obliging Markers, if possible trained during the practice season. The prospect seems to be that the Ranges will be very largely usedthis coming year.

All this will require the expenditure of money; and we trust the Departmental assistance will be freely supplemented by our numerous friends who have helped us in the past.

The whole is respectfully submitted for your consideration.

## REGULATIONS.

#### MEMBERSHIP.

Individual membership, \$2 00.

Affiliating Associations are entitled to ten (10) Members' Tickets and one Badge on payment of \$10.

The above subscriptions must be paid on or before the 8th August. Twenty per cent. additional will be charged after that date.

Firing shall commence each day at 9 o'clock precisely.

All firing shall be conducted under officers or persons appointed for the duty by the Executive Committee, and all competitors shall be under their authority.

## NOTICE TO COMPETITORS.

- 1. Competitors must make themselves acquainted with the Regulations, as also with the conditions of the match for which they have entered, as in neither case will the plea of ignorance be entertained.
- 2. The Range Officers will decide disputes on the ground. Appeal from their decision may be made in writing to the Executive Committee, whose decision will be final and without recourse. Their decision to be given in writing to the Secretary.
- 3. When at the firing point they must comply with all orders given by the Range Officer, or officer in charge,

#### 1.—GENERAL REGULATIONS.

- I.—No Active Militiaman shall shoot as a member of more than one corps.
- II.—No non-commissioned officer or private employed by the P.Q.R.A. for duty at the firing points or in the butts, shall shoot either for a prize or for practice during the meeting.
- III.—In all competitions restricted to Active Militiamen, or in which they shoot as such, the uniform of their corps shall be worn, and in accordance with the R. and O. of M., viz:

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- 1. Tunic, patrol or regulation fatigue jacket.
- 2. Trousers,
- 3. Regimental head dress, or a cap cover, with or without a cap under it.

All officers of the same corps must appear in the same order, as must also all non-commissioned officers and privates; but where a duly authorized undress for officers exists they may appear in it, although the non-commissioned officers and privates may be in full dress. Cross-belts need not be worn.

4. In competitions not restricted to Active Militia, competitors must appear in complete uniform or wholly in plain clothes. Any objections on the score of a competitor's dress must be made *before* he takes up his position to shoot, or while he is shooting.

N.B.—Cap covers or puggarees may be worn over the regimental full or undress cap, and great coats or waterproofs over uniform

IV.—Competitors must submit their rifles and ammunition for inspection whenever required.

V .- Fixed artificial rests will not be allowed, except in the Skirmishing Match.

VI.—Competitors may use a waterproof sheet, mat, or great coat, not folded up, but laid flat on the ground; but no cork beds or elbow rests will be allowed, except those furnished by the Association.

VII.—No wiping out between shots will be permitted.

VIII.—No competitor shall load until he has taken his position at the firing point, and the Register Keeper has given the word "All c ear."

IX.—Competitors are allowed to fire "fouling" shots only in the pits provided, and on presentation of a "fouling" ticket.

X.—Slings of Government pattern, white or black, may be used as an assistance in shooting.

#### IN INDIVIDUAL COMPETITIONS.

XI.—(a) A competitor may use a binocular or telescope, not mounted on any kind of stand, provided his doing so causes no delay to the shooting.

(b) After a competitor has taken his place at the firing point, no person except the Register Keeper or any officer on duty will be permitted to speak to him.

(c) No coaching of any kind will be permitted in any match.

Any violation of this rule, or any part of it, must be at once reported by the Register Keeper to the officer in charge, who will caution the offender, and on any repetition of the offence shall report the same to the Range Officer, to be dealt with by the Executive Committee, as laid down under the head of "penalties," and the person or persons offending may be removed from the firing points.

## 2.—PENALTIES—DISQUALIFICATION.

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- (a) Who shall fire in a name other than his own; or
- (b) Who shall fire twice for the same prize, unless permitted by the conditions of the competition to do so; or
  - (c) Who shall intentionally discharge his rifle at the wrong target; or
- (d) Who shall offer money, or a bribe of any kind, to any employee of the Association, under any pretence whatever; or

- (e) Who shall be guilty of any conduct which the Executive Committee may consider discreditable; or
- (f) Who shall be reported to the Council or Executive Committee as having been elsewhere guilty of such conduct of the aforesaid offences; or

(g) Who shall directly or indirectly make any arrangements with any other competitor for pooling or dividing any prize,—

Shall, upon the occurrence being proved to the satisfaction of the Council or Committee, or on the receipt of such report from any affiliated or duly recognized Association, forfeit all his entrance fees and prizes, and be forever disqualified from competing at any Prize Meeting of the Association,

# EXCLUSION FROM FURTHER COMPETITION DURING THE MEETING.

XIII.—Any competitor—

(a) Who shall fire when the danger signal is up; or

(b) Who shall discharge his rifle on the range except in accordance with the regulations for shooting; or

(c) Who shall be found with a loaded rifle except when at his proper firing point and engaged in competing; or

(d) Who, from a proper want of care, discharges his rifle accidentally (if such discharge is due to a defect in his rifle, an ample and satisfactory explanation must be given); or

(e) Who shall fire a pool shot before delivering his ticket to the Register Keeper; or

(f) Who shall alter or make any erasure on his firing ticket; or

(g) Who shall act in any way that might prove dangerous,—

Shall, upon the occurrence being proved to the satisfaction of the Executive Committee, be excluded from all further competition at the meeting, and shall forfeit all his entrance fees.

## DISALLOWANCE OF SCORE,

XIV,—Any competitor—

- (a) Who shall fail to comply with the conditions laid down for any particular prize; or
- (b) Who shall infringe on any of the instructions and regulations for the conduct of the meeting while shooting for any particular prize; or
- (c) Who, when competing for an Aggregate Prize, shall omit to enter, or shall enter incorrectly, his previous score or scores on the register or ticket provided for that purpose; or

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(d) Who shall shoot dressed partly in uniform and partly in plain clothes—(See Reg. III, Sec. 4.),—

Shall on the occurrence being proved to the satisfaction of the Executive Committee, have his score for that particular prize disallowed.

#### FINES.

XV.—Any competitor—

Who shall fire a fouling shot, except at the places provided, or who shall accidentally fire at the wrong target, shall be fined one dollar, to be paid forthwith to the Range Officer.

In cases where a competitor is excluded from "further competition," or where his score is disallowed, for any particular prize, the circumstances only under which the penalty was incurred shall be posted on the notice board, as a warning to others, without the name of the individual implicated.

In cases of "disqualification," the names of the offenders, as well as the particulars of the case, shall be posted on the notice board.

#### MITIGATION OF PENALTIES.

XVI.—The Executive Committee shall have power to mitigate or remit any of the above penalties.

#### 3.—PRIZE WINNERS.

XVII,—Unless otherwise specified, no one will be allowed to take more than one prize in any competition.

XVIII.—Winners of prizes must apply for their certificates at the Statistical Office, and, on signing the receipt attached thereto, will receive the amount or amounts due to them from the Treasurer of the P.Q.R.A. If a formal presentation takes place, winners, being Active Militiamen, must parade in the full dress uniform of their corps, and the three highest prize winners in each match must be prepared to receive their prizes in public, otherwise their prizes will be held over till next year.

## 4.—DISTANCE AND TARGETS.

#### 5.-MARKING.

- I. The marking will be as follows:-
- a. Bull's Eye..... White Disc,
- b. Inner..... Red Disc.
- c. Magpie ...... Black and White Disc.
- d. Outer..... Black Disc.
- e. Misses will not be signalled; but if a target has been lowered under the impression that it had been hit, and if no hit is found on it, after raising it the Marker will wave a red flag, which will signify a miss.
- 2. When two shots strike a target simultaneously, that which has the highest value will alone be marked with the marking disc, and the competitor whose proper turn it was to fire at the target will be credited with that shot, provided he has fired.
- 3. On a target being lowered, the position of a hit, if any, and its value will be shown by the spotting disc, when the target is again raised.
- 4. The marking when signalled shall not be questioned; but if a shot is not signalled, and the officer in charge of the firing points be satisfied that a reasonable doubt exists as to whether the shot may not have struck the target, he may ask the officer at the butt to examine the target. The result of this examination as signalled shall be final. Any competitor challenging a shot shall deposit the sum of twenty-five cents with the officer in charge at the firing points, which shall be forfeited in case no hit is found on the target.
- 5, All alterations of the registers must be initialed by the Register Keeper making them, but no alteration, except in the case of a clerical error, shall be made without having first signalled to the butt.
- 6. No person will be permitted to go and examine a target during the meeting except the Range Officer, or such person or persons as he may duly authorize to do so in his behalf.

#### Military Match Targets.

(4 feet by 2 feet 6 in. high; 3 Divisions.)

- I. Lower belt 15 in. high, score-value 5 points.
- 2. Middle belt 10 in. high, score-value 3 "
- 3. Upper belt 5 in, high, score-value 2 "

#### In Skirmishing.

When the number of hits counted on the target exceeds the number of shots allowed in the competition, three marks shall be deducted for every such hit in excess of the number of shots, unless it be proved that such hit on the target in excess of the number of shots allowed could only have been made by competitors in the squad firing more than their usual number of rounds, in which case the squad shall be disqualified.

#### 6.-RIFLES.

The rifles shall be Snider and Martini Henry rifles, either of Government issue or of bona fide Government pattern, and bearing the Government Viewer's mark.

- I. Weight of Snider not to exceed, without bayonet, 9 lbs. 12 oz. Weight of Martini-Henry, without bayonet, not to exceed 9 lbs.
  - 2. No pad or shoe for the heel plate of the butt will be allowed.
  - 3. Minimum pull of trigger, 6 lbs.

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- 4. Sights to be strictly in accordance with those of the Government issue. Filed sights will not be allowed.
- (a) All sights may be temporarily blackened or whitened, but no application of a permanent nature will be allowed. No shading of sights will be permitted.
- (b) The back sight may be tilted forward or backward, or supported at an angle by any extemporized means.
- (c) The sliding bar may be reversed, and used on either side of the uprights. One permanent centre line for the Snider and three for the Martini-Henry will be allowed, and temporary marks or lines of any kind, removable at pleasure, may be used.

#### 7.—AMMUNITION,

Competitors must use the ammunition provided by the Association, the cost of which is included in the entrance fee.

#### 8.—POSITION.

Unless otherwise specified, the shooting at all ranges shall be from the firing points, and may be in any position with the head to the target.

## 9.—ORDER OF SHOOTING.

I. When a competitor has joined a squad he shall not leave it, until he has retired or completed his firing, without leave from the Register Keeper; any competitor losing his turn, or being absent without leave, or who does not hand his scoring ticket to the Register Keeper at the firing point to which he is squadded at the time detailed on his ticket, will be disqualified for the match, and lose his entrance fee. Time will be regulated by the Association clock in the Secretary's Office.

- 2. In all competitions, except those open to "Any Rifles," computitors shall, when possible, be formed up by files, and fire shot and shot alternately.
- 3. Where but one competitor is present, he shall fire his shots without undue delay, but the officer in charge of the firing point, or some person named by him, must witness the shooting, and countersign the register. Failing such verification, the score will be invalidated.
- 4. No two competitors shall shoot in any competition with the same rifle, excepting with Martini-Henry; nor shall a competitor change his rifle at any range, during a competition, unless his first rifle should become unserviceable through an accident, which must be verified through the officer in charge.
- 5. In the case of unreasonable delay in firing on the part of any competitor, or of such delay as the Range Officer may consider likely to prolong the firing beyond the time allowed, the Range Officer shall have the right to caution and time the competitor by a sand glass, purporting to run one minute, more or less, and if after such caution the competitor does not fire before the sand glass has run out, the Range Officer shall declare the score forfeited, and call on the next competitor to proceed with his firing.
- 6. The competitor must, after delivering each shot, pay attention to the score called out by the Register Keeper, and himself see that such score is correctly entered on the register, so that any objection to the score recorded may be investigated b fore the next shot is fired.

#### 10.—TIES.

Ties shall be decided as follows:-

#### A.—In Individual Competitions for a Series of Prizes:—

- I. If at more than one distance, by the range totals in inverse order.
- 2. By the fewest outers.
- 3. By the fewest magpies.
- 4. By the fewest inners.
- 5. By the value of each shot in inverse order.
- 6. FOR MONEY PRIZES, by division.
- 7. FOR PRIZES IN KIND, by shooting off, as in Clause B.
- 8. In the case of a Prize part in Kind and part in Money, by shooting off for the Prize in Kind and dividing the Money.

N.B.—In all competitions the *order* of the winners shall be decided by the foregoing rules, if possib'e, but in the case of absolute ties the names shall be arranged alphabetically and bracketed.

#### B.—Individual Competition for a Single Prize:—

- 1. By the aggregate score in three rounds at the longest distance.
- 2. By firing single shots until decided.

Absentees shall forfeit their claim to shoot.

C .- In Team Competitions :-

- I. If at more than one distance, by the aggregate range totals in inverse order.
- 2. By the fewest outers.
- 3. By the fewest magpies.
- 4. By the fewest inners.
- 5. By the highest scorers in each team shooting off, as in Clause B.

D.—Aggregate:—

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Ties for the first place to be shot off, as in Clause B.

For other places:-

By the aggregate total of each range in inverse order, viz. :-

- I. By the total score at 600 yards.
- 2. By the total score at 500 yards.

E .- In Military Skirmishing and Volley Firing, by the largest number of hits.

F.—In cases not met by the foregoing—

- I. By any special rules attached to the conditions.
- 2. By the fiat of the Executive.

#### 11.—ENTRIES.

- 1. Entries, accompanied by the fees for the first seven matches, must be made on or before Thursday, 8th August, addressed to the Secretary, P. O. Box 1367, Montreal. After that date, 20 per cent. extra will be charged.
- 2. Every competitor shall enter and shoot under his own name, and not oftener than once for any prize, unless specially allowed by the terms of competition.
- 3. To meet the case where the difficulty may be experienced in selecting the actual competitors in sufficient time to make the required entries by the 8th August, Officers commanding corps, and Secretaries of Local Associations, will be permitted to send in their applications for (state number of competitors), accompanying such application with the amount of the entrance fees, and to postpone the rendering of the actual names of those for whom they make the entries until the selection of the competitors is definitely made. In such case the Register Tickets shall not be issued before the final return is handed to the Secretary. Any payment made for entries in excess of the number of competitors nominated will be returned in full, as provided for under paragraph 12 (a), Return Entrance Fees,
  - 4. Entrance Fees must be paid at the time when entries are made.

The Register Tickets will be issued on application at the Secretary's Office, on the Range.

The Executive Committee reserve to themselves the power of refusing any entry either for Volunteer or All Comers' Prizes, or of cancelling, at any moment, any entry that may have been previously accepted.

#### 12.—RETURN OF ENTRANCE FEES.

- 1. Entrance Fees in full will be returned to those—
- (a) Who are prevented from being present at the meeting; or
- (b) Who attended the meeting, but who are incapacitated from illness or accident; or
  - (c) Whose entries the Executive Committee may have cancelled.
- 2. Claims based on other considerations than the above will, if allowed, be subjected to a penalty of half forfeit.

#### 1 .- SQUADDING.

1. In the case of competitors classified as ordinary entries, arrangements will be made and details published, on the Range, of the day and target of which each competitor will be required to attend to fulfil his engagements.

In cases of post entries, competitors must await the squadding of ordinary competitors before being assigned to any target.

## 14.—ALTERATION OF SQUADDING.

Any alteration which the Executive Officer may find it necessary to make will be duly notified on the notice board, and such notice shall be a sufficient authority for the change. In the absence of such notice, tickets will be available only for the target for which they were originally issued, and any erasure or alteration will cancel the ticket, unless verified by the initials of the Executive Officer.

#### 15.—REGISTER TICKETS.

- 1. Should a competitor lose his ticket, or omit to take it to the firing point, or fail to attend at the hour detailed, or give a wrong ticket, and so, by his own neglect, miss the opportunity of competing for the prize for which his ticket was issued, he shall forfeit his claim on the Association, and no duplicate ticket shall be issued to him except under special circumstances.
  - 2. Any erasure or substitution of one name for another shall invalidate the ticket.

#### 16.—SIGHTING AND FOULING.

No sighting shots allowed during the matches.

The Executive Committee reserves the right to alter, amend or rescind any of the foregoing Regulations, as circumstances require.
