# BY-LAWS.

1. The President shall be, *ex-officio*, chairman of all meetings, ordinary and special, when he is present.

2. In the absence of the President, the Vice-President shall preside, but in the absence of both, then the chairman of the Committee or other member of the Association as shall then be nominated by the members present, may preside, and said chairman shall, for the time, be clothed with all the powers of the chairman.

3. In case of two members rising at the same time to address the meeting, the presiding chairman shall decide who has the floor.

4. Any member addressing the meeting shall do so through the presiding chairman, and shall not occupy the floor more than fifteen minutes without permission.

5. At all meetings the chair is to be taken punctually at the hour appointed, and in case thirty minutes elapse without a quorum, the meeting may stand adjourned until such time as the members may name and appoint.

6. It will be the duty of the Secretary to keep the minutes of all meetings of the Association and read them at the next meeting, in order to their correction and confirmation; to conduct all the correspondence of the Association. It will also be the duty of the Secretary to make a full annual report, at the regular or adjourned annual meeting, of the proceedings of the Association for the preceding year.

7. The Treasurer shall take charge of all funds and keep a correct account of the same, disbursing them under the direction of the Association, being prepared at any regular meeting with a statement of the finances and making an annual report at the regular or adjourned annual meeting. A

# CONSTITUTION.

1st. This Association shall be called the "Pioneer and Historical Association of the Province of Ontario, Canada."

2nd. Its objects shall be to unite the various Pioneer and Historical Societies of the Province in one central head or organization, thereby the better to promote intercourse and union of all such societies, for the better preservation of historical and other records and memorials of the Province, for the forming of new societies for such purposes, and for the promoting and extending the influence and benefits thereof. Also, this Association shall publish an annual report, containing the names of all the members of each and every affiliated society, with such other matters as may be required, each such affiliated society to receive copies thereof.

3rd. Its membership shall consist of delegates from all the various Pioneer and Historical Societies of the Frovince, of such as are now in existence, and of those that may in the future be formed.

4th. The affairs of this Association shall be managed by a President, two Vice-Presidents, a Secretary, Treasurer, Corresponding Secretary, and an Executive Committee of five; all of whom shall be appointed from among the regular members of the Association. The officers being, ex-officio, members of the committee, all of whom shall hold office until their successors are regularly appointed.

5th. An annual general meeting of the Association shall be held at such place in Ontario as shall be appointed at each preceding annual or adjourned annual meeting, such annual meeting to be held on the first Wednesday in June in each and every year, to receive the annual reports of the Association, and taking proper action thereon; for the nomination and election of officers, the committee and two auditors, and to transact such other business as may be required. Five members to form a quorum; for the committee, three.

6th. It is not the intention of this Association to exercise any control in governing or directing any of the affiliated societies, or in any way to interfere in their private working; but in case any question is referred to this Association by any of the affiliated societies, then it will be competent for this Association to consider and decide upon any such question or reference.

7th. No portion of the Constitution or By-Laws of the Association may be altered, added to, or repealed, until approved of by two-thirds of the members present at the meeting ; and for such proposed alteration, adding to, or repeal, notice thereof shall be given to the Secretary in writing and signed by such requirer, at least one month before the said meeting ; and the Secretary shall immediately, on reception of said notice, send copies of such proposed alterations, adding to, or repeal, to each member of the Association.

8th. Each and every affiliated society shall pay into the funds of this Association an annual sum, as dues, of ten cents for each and every member of such society; but when the number of members of such society exceeds one hundred, or ten dollars, then no further annual dues, namely, than ten dollars per annum for such affiliated society, will be required; said dues to be due and payable at each annual meeting, and if not paid, the delegates from such society will not have a vote until such arrears are paid.

9th. Honorary members not living in Ontario may be elected on the recommendation of the Executive Committee, but such honorary members shall not vote or hold office except as an auditor. Nor shall such honorary members have a voice in the regular business of the Association, except by permission.

roth. A special meeting of the Association may be called by the chairman upon a requisition signed by three members, which meeting shall be competent to entertain no business except such as it is called for.

11th. No subjects involving differences in religion or politics will on any account be considered proper for discussion.

12th. Each and every affiliated society may send to this Association not more than five delegates, but as soon as nine different societies are represented, this section of the Constitution will be null and void, and section 12 will read as follows, viz. :

Each and every affiliated society will be represented in this Association by one delegate regularly appointed by such affiliated society, the Secretary of this Association being notified in writing by the Secretary of such socie: y of the appointment, with name and address of same. TH

## THE PIONEER AND HISTORICAL ASSOCIATION OF THE PROVINCE OF ONTARIO, CANADA.

The Annual General Meeting of the Association was held in the Canadian Institute, Toronto, Wednesday, June 1st, 1892. The President, Rev. Dr. Scadding, in the chair.

The following delegates of affiliated societies were present : W. H. Doel and Wm. Rennie, from York Pioneer and Historical Society ; Eli Crawford and R. H. Hodgson, from Peel Pioneer and Historical Society ; Rev. Canon Bull, from Lundy's Lane Historical Society, and D. B. Read, Q. C., Grenville Pioneer and Historical Society.

The Minutes of the last Meeting were read and adopted.

Reports of Secretary and Treasurer were read and adopted.

On motion of Rev. Canon Bull, it was resolved to have two Vice-Presidents and a Corresponding Secretary.

The following officers were elected for the ensuing year : Rev. Dr. Scadding, President; Rev. Canon Bull and W. H. Doel, Vice-Presidents; Wm. Rennie, Secretary and Treasurer; Committee, F. W. Fearman, Eli Crawford, D. B. Read, Q. C., John A. Orchard.

Moved by Mr. Bull, seconded by Mr. Doel, That this Association urge upon the Ontario Government the necessity of granting a yearly amount sufficient for the purpose of a publication, viz., an Historical Fund for the Province.

Mr. Read addressed the meeting, urging that we endeavor to get all Pioneer and Historical Societies to become affiliated through the Provincial Association.

Rev. Canon Bull called attention to the neglected state of Brock's Monument, and that the attention of the Ontario Government be called to the same.

Meeting adjourned.

Dr. Scadding, was read before a large audience. The address traced back at length, memories of old York, and historic events associated with the careers of our ancestors to the close of the last century.

Mrs. S. A. Curzon and Capt. Blain, of the Peel Society; F. F. Fearman, of Hamilton; Sheriff McKellar, of Wentworth, and the Rev. Canon Bull, of Niagara, each addressed the assembly, going over a large amount of historical matter.

The following papers were read by members at the monthly meetings:—"The Life and Times of Hamilton Merritt, the Elder," by Mr. Chas. Durand; "The Maple Leaf as an Emblem of Canada," by the Rev. Dr. Scadding; "History from Odd Corner," by Mrs. S. A. Curzon; "A Patriotic Poem on the Battle of Queenston Heights," by E. M. Morphy; "The Life and Times of Robert Gourley," by Chas. Durand; "Echoes of the Past," by D. B. Read, Q. C.

The Lundy's Lane Historical Society was organized about five years ago, and enjoys a goodly list of zealous members.

The old battle ground of July 25th, 1814, is loyally regarded by the Society and receives much care. Very few memorials of the brave dead of 1812-'14, are standing. The Society has petitioned the two Govern-

ments more than once for aid to erect suitable memorials, one *in memory* of those who fell at the famous Battle of Lundy's Lane, and another *in memory* of Mrs. Laura Secord, of 1813 fame.

The re-interment of eleven soldiers, killed at the battle and found at a distance, was largely witnessed Oct. 17th last.

#### THE SECRETARY'S REPORT.

Secretary John H. Land presented his annual report, which was adopted unanimously. The report is as follows :---

"In presenting my third annual report I have to express regret at the unfortunate circumstances that the grippe epidemic during the year has prevented the Society from carrying out the work arranged for at the last annual meeting. The papers read before the Society were : Historical Societies and Their Influences, by Mrs. Curzon, Nov. 18, 1891 ; On Canadian History (No. 2 of his series), by Hon. D. MacInnes, Dec.

1, 1891; U. E. Loyalists as Imperial Federationists of the Eighteenth Century, by Rev. E. J. Fessenden, Dec. 15, 1891.

"Petitions have been forwarded to the Minister of Militia, urging upon the government the desirability of providing for the erection of monuments at Stony Creek and Burlington Heights. To these petitions and accompanying correspondence favorable replies have been received, and it is probable that this year may see the commencement of the work. Search has been instituted among our old families for uniforms and equipments used in 1812, with the view of supplying the designer or sculptor with historical information for the work on the proposed monuments. From replies received it is hoped that a complete outfit will be gathered together for that purpose.

"The proposed celebration of the centennial of the province by the Historical Societies, at old Niagara, in July next, has received the hearty endorsation of this Society, and its President and Vice-Presidents have been placed on committees to make the necessary arrangements for the event.

"The Society is indebted to Dr. Bourinot for copies of the various blue books and reports issued by the government and parliament, and for copies of the debates and proceedings of the House of Commons and Senate; also for copies of the reports of the Dominion archivist as published.

"The Society has to mourn the loss of two of its valued members by death—Very Rev. J. G. Geddes, Dean of Niagara, who died in November last, and T. C. Mewburn, Inspector of Customs, who died on March 7.

"As a means of making the canvass for members easier and to enable us to retain the members we have, I would recommend the appointment of a committee to edit, arrange and publish the papers that have been read before the Society; a copy to be handed to each member on payment of his annual fee."

The financial statement for the year was affixed to the Secretary's report. It showed that the receipts were \$83.05, and the disbursements \$39.10, leaving a balance on hand of \$43.95.

In moving the adoption of the report, Mr. Geo. H. Mills said that the feeling of patriotism was spreading over the country, and that Historical Societies were being formed in various parts of the Dominion. He also gave considerable information about the centennial of Upper

Canada, now the Province of Ontario, which will be celebrated on July 16th, at Niagara. Bronze medals, commemorative of the centennial year, are being struck. On one side of the medal will be a head of Lieut.-Governor Simcoe, designed from the medallion on his monument in the cathedral at Exeter, Devonshire, surrounded by the words : "John Graves Simcoe, Lieut.-Governor, A. D. 1791—A. D. 1796." On the obverse, near the edge of the medal, are the words : "Upper Canada, since 1867 Ontario." Within these words and in horizontal lines across the medals, are the three following inscriptions ; Representative system proclaimed, Kingston, July 16, A. D. 1792." "First parliament opened, Niagara, September 17, A. D. 1792." "Centennial celebrated A. D. 1892."

Lieut.-Governor Kirkpatrick will open the proceedings at Niagara, and they will be continued at Toronto on September 17th.

Mr. Justus Griffin seconded the adoption of the report, which was carried.

The election of the Officers and Executive Council resulted in only two changes in last year's Officers and Council. Hon. J. M. Gibson and Alex. McKay, M. P., were elected members of the Executive Council in place of George M. Barton and the late T. C. Mewburn.

#### MISCELLANEOUS BUSINESS.

President Mills, Hon. A. McKellar, Hon. J. M. Gibson and Alex. McKay, M. P., were appointed a committee to represent the Society at the centennial celebration at Niagara next month. Other members may also be appointed by the Executive Committee.

The Executive Committee will carry out the recommendation of the Secretary in regard to having the papers read before the Society last year printed in pamphlet form.

James Ferres was elected a member of the Society. The usual votes of thanks to the officers were passed and suitably acknowledged.
