General Offensive Movement By The French Along a Front of 150 Miles

Paris, April 6—All the way from Rheims to the Mosle river the French are hammering away at the German lines in a great offensive movement stretching over a front approximately 150 miles long. Heavy rains and banks of thick fog have hampered artillery operations, but infantry combats have been fought in the downpour over fields of thick mud.

If the allies suceed in dislodging the Germans from their present positions in the Champagne district, the Argonne forest along the heights of the Meuse and in the Woevre district, full credit must go to the French, for there are no British soldiers operating in those areas. At Ailly and Regnieville the Germans have made ineffectual attempts to dislodge the French from captured ground, and in the Argonne near Varennes and Boure-Uilles the trenches at some points are only 500 feet apart.

The Germans are reported to be cutting dykes in northern Belgium in order to flood the country northwest of Antwerp.

Wounded Canadians On Hospital Ship **Chased by Submarine**

Escaped After 45 Minutes Run in English Channel — Remarkable Cases Among Dominion Wounded — Again in the Trenches

Toronto, April 6—The Mail and Empire has the following from its correspondent in London:
While crossing the channel on Saturday, the British Hospital ship Navarra, with several hundred wounded soldiers including some thirty Canadians, was chased for forty-five minutes by a German submarine. When the pirate was sighted, the Navarra fied, developing a speed of twenty knots, and thus escaped. Wounded men tell the story, which is vouched for by officers who talked with the crew.

Several remarkable cases are among the latest batch of wounded. Private J. Gilk of Hamilton, 4th Battalion, was shot through the body while bringing up rations. The bullet pierced his liver, but his life was saved and he now is rapidly recovering.

The most important construction work was the building of a thirty-six inch masonry sewer along the shore of Marble Cove, a distance of about 1,800 feet, at a cost of \$14,000.

The total cost of new main sewers for 1914 was \$19,009.45; main pipe extensions, maintenance account, \$6,840, construction account \$7,384.43.

Water Reserve Account.

Water Reserve Account.

Following the practice of former years the sum of \$18,066.57 was set apart from last year's surplus for the renewal of old and small sized mains. The sum of \$12,323.03 was spent and 7,001 feet of pipe laid from this account, leaving \$5,743.54, plus \$4,237.38 from this year's surplus, for next year's operations.

The water maintenance account shows expenditures of \$199,431.64, including interest \$80,493.07, and sinking fund, \$31,448.58. The receipts were \$209,669.02, including assessment \$160,373.34, meter customers, \$40,220.99, and steamship supplies, \$6,590.95, leaving an unexpended balance of \$20,237.38.







Washington, April 5—The United States government today made public its rote to Great Britain, announcing that it "could not admit," either the right of the Allies or their claims for justification in placing an embargo on all commer-

cial intercourse between Germany and neutral countries.

"To admit it," says the communication, "would be to assume the attitude of unneutrality toward the present enemies of Great Britain, which would be obviously inconsistent with the solemn obligations of this government in the present circumstances, and for Great Britain to make such a claim would be for her to abandon and set at naught the principles for which she has consistently and earnestly contended in other times and circumstances."
