



UNSTEADINESS FEATURE OF

New York, N. Y., Nov. 11.—The spetty and uneven fluctuations of prices in today's stock market testified to the unsettled and uncertain opinions held over the speculative outlook. These doubts were the effects of the violent reversal of the decline which occurred late yesterday and which gave warning of the ever extension of the short interest. The caution thus engendered in the bear party protected the market from the raiding tacties which had begun to make rapid inroads on prices before they were checked. At the same time, the rapid covering of short contracts which went on in the course of yesterday's late raily, left that interest so much reduced as to deprive the market of a potential support in the uccessities of the shorts. The demand oatside that element was not urgent or widespread. The advances, which were general at one time, were converted into small declines at the last. In favor of the recovery was the decided easing in the tone of the money market both on call and time.

The preliminery estimates of the week's-currency movement showed a relaxation in the interior demand on New York which promised relief from the drain of that account. A more effective influence on the easing of the money market is the liquidating to the inferences drawn regarding the market opinions of wealthy capitalists from the fact of their beding free lenders of money and, presumably hoiders of reduced amounts of stock. Current rumors of the extent of its command of liquid capital in consequence, argued an attitude of indifference in supporting prices which discouraged hopes of co-operation in an advance.
