with Italy, Spain and Switzerland expire in 1876. Negotiations will, in the first in-stance, be undertaken from Paris, probably, with Italy. It is probable that an exten-sion of their present treaty to 1886 may be proposed to the Italians if they will adopt the modifications accepted by England now; bat there is nothing decided upon the point, and in the meantime, under the "favored nation" clause, the Italian tariff may be used by England. In regard to Spain it is not probable that France will experience much difficulty. It will be one of the main objects of the French govern-ment to obtain the favorable entry for their wines into England which the former treaty obtained for them, and with that point lost the Spanish government have no particular reason for standing out against the new twiff. 
