
The telotype, or electrical typewriter, has been designed to meet the require-ments of a rapid and reliable printing telegraph instrument, which has long been needed. This instrument is man. "For God and Home and Native Land." ipulated very much in the same way a the typewriter. The transmitter as well as the receiver makes a copy of the mes-age, and the Hability of mistakes is thus largely decreased. The instruments work in unision, and it is impossible to send a message from one machine unless the corresponding machine at the end of the distant line is properly receiving. The record is plainly pointed on the strip of moving paper in front of the oper-ator. The fact that the message is print-ed at the other end of the line without any personal attention makes the arrange-ments exceedingly valuable. As will be readily seen, it will be of special benefit to business hcuese where rapid and ac-curate communication is desired with their factories and distant places; for the typewriter.
