The law of primogeniture decreed the empire to Constantine, who was a perfect Seythian, having the external appearance, the rudeness the fire, and the bravery of a barbarian, with the simplicity of a child, the devotion of a myrmidon, the fidelity of a slave, and the sensibility of a woman. He drewled so much the stormy nature of his heart, and the transport of his temper on an ab solute throne, where his passions which now agitated his own mind, would agitate a whole Empire, that he would, by a voluntary act, anticipate his own deposition; and kneeling at the feet of his mother. the domestic divinity of the Russians, he took and oath that he never would ascend the throne. Afrantic and virtuous love for a beautiful Polonese, the Princese Lowietz, the possession of whose heart and person he preferred to all the thrones in the world, had contributed to this anticipated abdication. 




