Mr. Berry [B.A., (Honours), Economics and Political Science,
University McGill, 1961; graduate studies in international relations, University
McGill, 1964] joined the Department of External Affairs in 1964. He served
abroad in Berlin; as Counsellor (Economic) in London from 1971 to 1975 and as
High Commissioner in Singapore from 1979 to 1982. In Ottawa, he was Director,
Commercial and General Economic Policy from 1977 to 1979; Director General,
International Energy Relations with the Department of Energy, Mines and
Resources from 1982 to 1983 and Director General, Economic Policy from 1983 to
1985. He has been Director General, Asia Pacific South since 1985. He is
married to Linda Kathleen Randal. They have three children. Mr. Berry replaces
Mr. William J. Jenkins.

Mr. Marc A. Brault born in Montreal, Quebec, as Ambassador to the Arab Republic of Egypt.

Mr. Brault [B.A., Laval University, 1963; LL.L, Laval University, 1966] joined the Trade Commissioner Service in 1966. He has served abroad in Tel Aviv; as Assistant Trade Commissioner in Johannesburg from 1969 to 1973; as Counsellor (Commercial) in Paris from 1976 to 1978; and as Counsellor (Economics) in Paris from 1978 to 1981.
