Sir,—You give prominence in your issue of Saturday to a letter from the pen of Rev. Dr. Dewar upon remedial legislation.

Petersburg, Feb. 22. This brief, but comprehensive letter should be submitted to Sir Richard Oastwright and Hon. David Mills.

The quality of charity, like mercy, is not strained. It is not charity unless it be impartial. One thing that can be said for Catholic charity is that it is not confined exclusively to Catholic objects.

In Halifax a year ago the good people of that city got into the habit of calling him by the name of P. P., the fashion having been set by a certain eminent Ontario politician, who, being used to the atmosphere of Ottawa, and unaccustomed to the French language thought the name was French.

The orators at Massey Hall on Saturday evening were very glib in prating of British freedom. Yet none of them cared to say that the remedial policy after all was but a halting disposition to follow British precedents in protecting the religion of the minority in primary education.

"The impropriety of making any arrangements which will probably safeguard the rights of the minority in the matter of religious education in the towns of the South and West of Ireland.

We have received from the office of the Registrar General for Ontario the report of births, marriages and deaths for the year ending December 31, 1894.

Dr. Bryce, the Deputy Registrar-General, figures out a decrease of 1.4 per 1,000 of the population for the statistical year. This is a deplorable fact, but it is a fact which has been recorded every year of the past decade.

The remark is not entirely accurate. Drained by emigration as Ireland is of the flower of her population the Irish statistics for the last quarter show the birth-rate to be 0.8 over the average for ten years.

The most natural cause to which a decreasing birth-rate may be attributed is fewer marriages. This is not the apparent cause in Ontario, although

the marriage-rate is also very low. The marriages in our cities increased during 1894 by 171, and the total decrease was but 184, showing a practically steady rate for the whole of the province, whilst there has been little or no fluctuation in the decennial period.

Is it possible in a young province like Ontario, with its scattered settlements, and largely agricultural industries, that the wear and tear of life can be so serious as to affect the natural growth of the population? It would be absurd to think so, for the struggle for bread cannot be a circumstance in a country like ours when compared with England.

Our birth-rate is indeed miserable, and Dr. Bryce in considering it does not overlook the social conspiracy against nature and morality to which "attention has been called in some 'untries.'"

Our Ontario statistics give us each year a table showing the marriages by denominations in the Province. Would it be objectionable if they took similar pains with the statistics of births?

The marriage rate is supposed to be a pretty good barometer of the prosperity of a people. In a country like Canada, where divorce is practically an insignificant evil, people get married when they can afford to do so.

"This year Dr. Bryce tells us it is 'abnormally low, and that the birth-rate in relation to those marriages which take place is proportionately still lower.'"

According to these figures Roman Catholics and Anglicans have contributed more liberally to the marriage rate than any of the other classes.

A Mandament Scare. A session of our separated brethren here in Ontario have not, we venture to say, come through such another week since the days of their infancy when they first heard the horrible story of the Three Bears.

It all began with the unfortunate notion of Father Lacombe, the aged and saintly missionary to the Indians, that when he was in the civilized East he could do as other men, priests and ministers included, do.

Father Lacombe is, as we have said, a saintly man, but he is no politician or he would have known that the conception of true liberty among those who talk the most about liberty in these parts is not that all men are equally free to communicate their opinions to politicians.

and that is hitting below the belt. In the language of The Globe, The Hamilton Spectator and other guardians of our free institutions, it is subservive of the independence of parliament.

Still it must not be supposed that the opposite view has been entirely abandoned as a matter of safe public opinion. Notwithstanding the comprehensive arguments of political journals we imagine that priests and ministers will go on writing letters to politicians, cabinet ministers, governors general and others, and that our free constitution will be none the worse for it a hundred years hence.

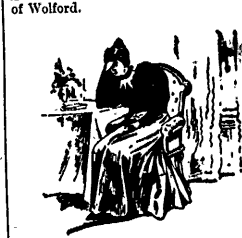
