The adjourned Annual Meeting of the Society was held in the County Court House, at 7 o'clock, on Tuesday the 10th day of August, 1854.

The Society was called to order by the President, Mr. Justice Street, who thereupon addressed the meeting, detailing fully the proceedings of the Society for the past year, the state of its funds, the great benefit to be derived from the Province from the Society if cheerfully supported, and the prospects of the Society for the coming year.

The Treasurer's accounts having been examined and admitted, it was

Resolved,—That George Botsford and John Babbit, Esquires, be a Committee to examine the same.

The Corresponding Secretary being called upon by the President, recapitulated the proceedings to the Executive Committee, relative to the importation of Stud horses, under the authority of the Legislature passed at their last meeting.

Resolved,—That the Executive Committee be requested to publish the whole or such parts of the Report embracing such parts of the same as may seem desirable, with such complimentary remarks as they may think general. And that the thanks of the Society be given to Mr. Cumming, for their report of his proceedings in the purchase of Horses for the Society.

Mr. Kerr, from the Committee appointed to report on the Quarterly meeting in April last, reported "as to any alteration and improvement to be made in the Constitution of the Society," and made his Report.

Resolved,—That the report be accepted.

Resolved,—That the salary of the Corresponding Secretary for this year be at least equal to that of the Recording Secretary £10.

The Society then proceeded to the election of Office bearers for the present year, which was chosen as follows :—

the Province from the Society if cheerfully and
actively supported, and the prospects of the So-
ciety for the coming year.

The Treasurer's accounts having been sub-
mitted and read,

Resolved,—That George Botsford and S. W.
Harris, Esquires, be a Committee to Audit the

Corresponding Secretary being called
upon by the President, recapitulated his report
of the Executive Committee, relative to the im-
provement of Stud horses, under the resolution
of the Legislature passed at their last session.

Resolved,—That the Executive Committee be
authorized to publish the whole or such parts of
their report embracing such parts of Mr. Cum-
mings as they may think generally use-
ful, and that the thanks of the Society be given
to Mr. Cummings, for their report of his proceed-
ings in the purchase of Horses for the Province,
and from the Committee appointed at
their meeting in April last to report
on the alteration and improvement that may
be made in the Constitution of the Society, &c."

Resolved.—That the report be accepted.

pectively, there are now in the County of York,
and what additional Mills of either sort required,
or may be set up and encouraged in such County
with advantage, together with suitable and con-
venient sites therefor.

2nd. What Household and Domestic Manu-
factures are now principally attended to in the
County, (such as carding, spinning, and weaving
of Cotton, Flax, and Wool, for wearing apparel,
carpetting, straw hats, straw bonnets, knitting,
needle work, &c., &c.,) and the probable amounts
thereof respectively, and how the descriptions
thereof may be best encouraged, increased, and
made profitable in such County.

3rd. What Manufactories respectively, there
are now in operation in the country, and what
additional manufactories, (such as

1st. Woolen Manufactories for all descrip-
tions of Woolens required for Home use.

2nd. Cotton Manufactories for the same, and
exportation.

3rd. Iron Furnaces, for the manufacture of Iron
in its various conditions, Castings, Stoves, &c.

4th. Salt Manufactories.

5th. Paper Manufactories, for making wrap-
ping, writing, sheathing, Printing Paper, &c.,
and Paper Hangings.

6th. Hat, Cap, and Bonnet Manufactories.

7th. Soap and Candle Manufactories.

8th. Tanneries.

9th. Leather Manufactories, for Boots, Shoes,
Harness, Saddles, Whips, Trunks, &c., &c.

10th. Potteries of all sorts for Home use.

11th. Brick and Lime Kilns.

12th. Hardware and Cutlery, Manufactories
for all kinds of iron vessels, implements and
edge tools.

13th. Rope Manufactories or Rope Walks.

II. *Resolved*,—That the thanks of this Society, and the public at large, are jointly due to the several members of the Executive Committee for the faithful manner in which they have performed their duties to this Society.

III. *Resolved*,—That the Corresponding Secretary do, without delay, address a letter to the Vice-Presidents and general Committees of this Society, the County Agricultural and other Societies, as also influential individuals to be named by him, in each County throughout the Province, to the number of ten or more, informing them that this Society must stop its operations unless with their aid, enquiring whether in the opinion of such Societies and individuals, the reports of this Society are of any use to them, whether the Society does or can in any way be made to usefully operate in their County, if so whether they will give anything towards raising the annual grant for printing the reports, and other purposes, will consent to personally assist in collecting subscriptions, and aid this Society in carrying on its work in each County, and whether they will name any subject or subjects this Society ought to attend to, and will give their help for having it done, and that the Corresponding Secretary do keep a record of his doings and report the same to this Society at the meeting in April next.

Resolved, That the several Committees appointed for the like purpose in each of the other Counties respectively, be continued and requested to proceed forthwith in making their reports.

Resolved,—That Dr. Robb, Robert Fulton, John A. Beckwith and Robert Jardine, Esquires, be a special Committee to report to this Society at the general meeting in April next on the reports of the various Agricultural Societies returned to the Secretary's office in 1854, such Committee to review and give an abstract of such reports, with any remarks that may be deemed useful.

Resolved,—That John Gregory, John A. Beckwith, Dr. Robb, E. Simonds, R. Jardine, Col. Maclauchlan, and S. J. G. Layton, be a special Committee to enquire and report to this Society at its meeting in April next, how the annual reports of the various County and District Agricultural Societies may be hereafter collected and brought together, so that from the combination of all, an idea of the actual progress of the Province in Agricultural improvement, may be periodically given to the public.

Resolved,—That Dr. Robb and R. Jardine, Esq., be a special Committee to enquire and report to this Society at the meeting in April next on the application of Machinery to Agriculture.

Resolved,—That the Hon. Judge Wilmot, the Rev. William Shore, John T. Smith and David S. Kerr, Esquires, be a Special Committee to enquire and report to this Society at the meeting in April next, upon the utility and best modes of establishing a Woolen Factory in the County of York.

Resolved,—That the Hon. Judge Wilmot, the Rev. Mr. Churchill and Wm. Carman, Esquire, be a special Committee to enquire and report to this Society at its meeting in April next, on the subject of Horticulture and its advantages.

Resolved,—That Edward Wilmot, Esq., Hon. Judge Wilmot, Dr. Robb and J. Simpson, Esq., be a special Committee to enquire and report to this Society at its meeting in April next, on the advantages of Bee Culture.
