*The Missionary Committee to the Friends of Primitive Methodist Missions
in Canada West :*

THE Primitive Methodist Church is an original Body, not founded in schism, but similar in the history of its origin to Christianity in its rise through the ministry of the Apostles—the development of Protestantism through Luther and Cranmer—the glorious work of Methodism through the agency of Wesley and Whitfield. This Denomination sprung up, in the providence of God, in a revival of religion, and was extended and consolidated through the labours of the brothers Bourne, Clowes, Steel, Nixon, and others.

From ten persons, who formed the first class in 1810, up to June last, there were in the whole Connexion :

The year before last was the Jubilee year of the Connexion ; and powerful efforts are being made to make the occasion worthy of the success of the Body during the last fifty years !

This Branch of the Parent Body in Canada first made its appearance in 1829. In Toronto a class was formed, and the work became gradually established. At the last Conference, held in Brampton, we had in Canada :

All who have any knowledge of our operations, will be aware that our Missions are entirely sustained by voluntary offerings. We have no grants from the government ; neither have we many rich, to give their large donations. From this Report, which is in the hands of all the subscribers, it will be seen that nearly the whole revenue has been raised in comparatively small sums. Our Ministers and Membership have subscribed liberally, and the Sabbath Scholars, especially at Brampton and Toronto, have shown an example which, we trust, will be followed by all the other Sabbath Schools.

In relation to real usefulness, our Missionaries have given undoubted evidence : their Quarterly Reports have been closely examined by the Missionary Committee, and generally approved. Several of the Missionaries have been truly laborious, especially in chapel building, and in other special efforts to extend the enterprise. Their success in the conversion of sinners, and in building up and enlarging the Church of God,

have been duly reported in the "Christian Journal" newspaper. Every matter of interest that relates to the work of God in Canada is published weekly in that paper, that the friends of religion and of missions may know what is going on from time to time, through the length and breadth of the land.

From the printed Report, which we have drawn up, and which has been sanctioned, (and which the Ministers will give a copy to all who desire,) a more detailed account is given of the Society in its origin, progress, and present state of our Connexional Missions.

Let us, then, once more generously respond, by our prayers and contributions to the Primitive Methodist Missionary Society. Let us remember that an Institution of greater philanthropy does not exist: it carries along with it the distribution of the Bible, the dissemination of Religious Tracts, the cause of Temperance Reform, and the enlargement of Sabbath School efforts, especially in the far distant and back settlements of this country.

We would now close these statements by giving you a pithy extract from the printed Report of the Parent Body in England:—"Let us, Brethren and Sisters, continue in this cause to work and pray—pray and work—pray and give—give and pray; and in working, work with our might; in giving, give to the fullest extent of our ability; and in praying, pray in faith. Then, when we have to give an account of our stewardship, the Great Master may acknowledge us as those who have been found faithful."

The following is a brief summary of each Mission Station:—

1. KINGSTON.—This is one of the oldest Missions in the Eastern division of our work. In relation to its connexion with the Missionary Fund, it would have been a matter of thankfulness had it been removed from our list, and become a self-sustaining circuit by this time. We are glad however to record that there has been some progress, and that attention is being directed to a new chapel, which is of importance to the Mission. This Mission, although still requiring assistance, has been of great utility as a sort of centre of operations in missioning a large area of country, and is the parent of several Missions around. We feel sanguine of success for the future, and our brethren have the earnest prayers and sympathies of the church in relation to the special efforts they are making in the name of our common Lord.

2. COLLINSBY (BATH ROAD.)—This is a Mission which has been made from Kingston, and since the erection of the neat chapel, an increasing stability has been given to the enterprize. There are many earnest friends on this station, who have laboured long, and who fully believe God will give them to see far greater things than they have ever yet witnessed. Our beloved brother Rev. William Gledhill (now returned to England) has been stationed the past year on this Mission, and he was made a great blessing to the neighbourhood. The circumstances of his departure were truly affecting: to many it resembled the farewell of St. Paul to the church of Ephesus. May the seed sown by our devoted brother spring up, and his successor realize a glorious harvest.

3. PORTLAND.—This Mission is one of the off-shoots of Kingston, and has become of considerable extent, embracing a large tract of country, over which the Missionaries have now long and rather rough journeys. During the last year a handsome and commodious chapel has been erected in Sydenham, where the Superintendent resides; another at Storrington, &c. Our friends, anxious for the extension of the work and the salvation of souls, detached a part of this Mission, to form the centre of a new one: this measure, however, did not succeed, and now the Mission is one Station, as formerly. We cannot suppose that every arrangement for the enlargement of God's work will, in every particular case, succeed: there will be partial failures, but our friends deserve the highest credit for their self-denying labours in making attempts to enlarge their borders, although in this case they were compelled to succumb. We prefer a failure occasionally in these enterprizes to that inaction and indifference which shelters itself in the chimera of "building up." There can be no *real* building up without *materials*, and these must be had in going out to gather them, labouring with all prudence and persevering energy.

4. NAPANEE.—Another Branch from the Parent Stock—the Kingston Mission. Although this is called Napanee Mission, yet we have no hold of the village of Napanee itself. Various attempts have been made in connection with the Missionary residing in the place, but Primitive Methodism has not taken root here; yet the cause has spread, and in many places, over a large extent of country, the work of God has been established. Of late, the Superintendent has changed the parsonage from Napanee to Roblin, and with this change he has been enabled to work his appointments in a more effective manner. Many souls have been saved on the station the past year, and an increase has been reported.

Thus the brethren, encouraged by these gracious signs, have urged strongly on the Committee the appointment of a second Missionary; but whilst the Committee have attended to the pressure of prior claims, the Napanee appeals have not been disregarded nor lost sight of. Were the funds equal to the entering on new ground, and the multiplying our Missionaries on *old*, it would afford the brethren concerned unfeigned joy.

5. ORANGEVILLE.—The Primitive Methodist people were among the first that entered this part of the country, and the work was carried over an extensive area of territory; and if mission effort was needed it was here, as the settlers were wide apart and very poor, and difficult to reach in their solitary “clearings.” Our interest in the village has not advanced equal with other churches, nor with the progress of the village. Here a new chapel was erected, but some *one* or more blundered, as it was found that to the chapel there was no right of way, and this difficulty, with a few *failures* of Missionaries, has kept our work in abeyance. We hope a remedy will be soon found here, in a new chapel with a pathway to reach it, that our cause in Orangeville may prosper in proportion to the *out* preaching appointments on this Mission.

6. GUELPH.—The late Rev. Matthew Nichol, and others of kindred soul, laboured first in this locality, and away into the “Queen’s Bush,” with great success: very many souls were converted, and a large number of preaching appointments taken up, which still continue, with less or more success. The Guelph Chapel, opened many years ago, has never been well adapted; and efforts have been made during the last year—a plot of land has been purchased, and it is hoped the Primitive Methodist Mission in Guelph will take a fresh start in the race of improvement.

7. GALT.—From this place, in the beginning of our Mission labours, a large extent of country was taken up, and appointments established in adjoining Townships; and although a large proportion of the original settlers were Scotch immigrants, and consequently Presbyterian, yet many others received the Primitive Methodist Missionaries, and many were saved. Several glorious revivals of religion have occurred on this mission, and many of those converted have migrated to other Townships, who have, in their turn, been overtaken by the Missionary; thus the work of God has gone on multiplying itself, and is still growing, “ever likely to prevail.”

8. BLENHEIM.—This Mission occupies an important section of country. Here the land is fertile, and the people thriving in proportion. Since the

neat and commodious chapel was erected in the village of Drumbo, the head of the Mission, the good work has steadily progressed. The cause at different periods has fluctuated; there have been several causes of trouble, and untoward circumstances, which have checked the onward movements. Some brethren, who were great and influential, took offence, and were "given to change," which threw discouragement into the ranks, and for a while there was decline; but the *faithful* ones have learned experience, self-reliance, and trust in the Lord, and of late there has been a reaction. The quarterly Reports to the Committee have announced increased attendance of congregations, conversions of sinners, and a revival of the spirit of mission enterprize.

9. PEEL AND WELLESLEY.—This is a strong Mission, and we trust rapidly coming up to be self-sustaining. The quarterly Reports during the year have always encouraged the Committee; the supporters of Canadian Missions will see in this Mission proof to stimulate their liberality. Here congregations have been gathered,—Sabbath Schools formed,—Temperance efforts sustained,—and all these precious advantages realized from a living Christianity preached, and developed in action by hundreds of families. Had not these mission efforts been put forth in the Townships embraced in this Mission, it is not difficult to conceive the degradation and wretchedness that would have existed; but now the wilderness is rapidly becoming like Eden, and the desert like the garden of the Lord.

10. MINTO.—This Mission has of late been made from Peel and Wellesley. At first the work took a wide sweep, and the spirit of union, zeal, and enterprize animated the Missionary and the Brethren, like the beating of the heart of one man. We regret however to say, (as it is necessary that the Missionary subscribers should know,) that during the past year the Missionary and some of the officials have not acted in harmony, and the work of God has been much *hindered*. A Deputation was sent from the Missionary Committee, to inquire and report, and the matters were taken up by the Conference, which meeting was much troubled in relation to the state of the Mission. As a young man of peace and of ability has now been appointed to the Mission, we may hope the waste places will be repaired, and God's work conducted in the true spirit of Primitive Methodism and the Gospel of Jesus Christ.

11. WALPOLE.—On this Mission we have a small band of faithful labourers, originally from Etobicoke Circuit, &c., who in the beginning made many personal sacrifices to extend our interest in this and the

neighbouring Townships, and God gave them their heart's desire. Many good congregations are now gathered and churches formed. During the past year there has been peace, and a steady growth in all the departments of the Mission.

12. GRAND RIVER.—This Mission was made off from Walpole, and on it there are some good Societies. At York, the head of the Mission, a neat chapel has been erected, and shortly after its opening a blessed revival of religion broke out. Brother William Bee and the Brethren were greatly encouraged in the work of the Lord prospering in their hands. The revival exercised a happy influence in all the surrounding vicinity. May it still continue to spread in Jesus's all conquering name.

13. WALSINGHAM.—This is a Mission originally made from Hamilton Circuit, and after considerable fluctuation, we trust there is now stability, and a more encouraging state of things. Lately a commodious chapel has been erected in a central position; and it is hoped by the Committee, considering the weight upon the Mission Fund, that the affairs of this Station will ere long be such, that it will become independent of foreign assistance.

14. BRANT.—The progress of this Mission has not equalled the sanguine hopes of the Connexion. The *failure* of a Missionary some time ago was a severe drawback. The country is one that requires the attention of Missionary Societies, and the Primitive Methodist Conference have ever responded to the necessity of Missionary labours in Brant and connecting Townships. The past year has been successful in souls converted, and an increase of the membership. May our Brother on the Station, with the Official Friends, have greater prosperity.

15. LONDON.—The advantages of this Mission are not to be measured merely in relation to the city, but to the several Mission Stations which it has been the parent, and to which it still exercises a gracious influence upon. The last Conference divided off from London the Caradoc part, and we trust the interest in the city and the several off-shoots will still grow and flourish abundantly.

16. BOSANQUET.—This Mission, which was commenced in an entirely "new country," has prospered steadily. We have had no cause of trouble from the beginning, and the good work blessedly increases, as the membership shows. We have two young and zealous Missionaries now employed on this Station, and every aspect of this Mission is pleasing.

17. STRATFORD.—This Mission, but recently taken up, and extended over a large tract of country, has opened favorably. The success of the last year has not equalled that of the former. May our good Lord especially aid our respected Brother who has been appointed to this field by the late Conference.

18. MACGILLIVRAY.—This Mission, formerly a part of London, has prospered, and is just divided into two Stations. We trust the division which makes Stanley a separate Mission will be advantageous, and that the work will still roll on. A very interesting sketch of the MacGillivray Mission was given in a late issue of the "Christian Journal." May many such accounts of success be forthcoming, for the columns of our religious newspaper.

19. PLYMPTON.—This is a new Station but lately formed. There has not been that rapid enlargement which has characterized our fresh Missions in general, but we are looking anxiously, and praying that the fresh Missionary appointed may have many souls to his ministry before the connexional year closes.

20. CHATHAM.—Similar observations apply to this Station as the preceding one. The Committee has felt much anxiety and hope in relation to both Stations, and the friends of our Missions have their attention particularly directed to this and the preceding Station, and are looking and believing for those glorious results which they have seen as the fruit of Missionary labour on other Stations. We trust this year will revive the confidence of our subscribers and Committee in relation to our Western Stations.

21. BRANTFORD AND PARIS.—This Mission is situated in a section the most cultivated and superior of any in Canada. God has blessed the labours of his servants at many of the preaching Stations of this Mission; and notwithstanding an untoward event which took place during the past year, the Mission has maintained an unshaken attitude, and there is an increase of members. May the coming year be eminently blessed on this important Station.

22. OSPREY.—This is an extensive Mission, and truly Mission ground, which requires no ordinary physical strength to work. We are glad that the Brother devotes the whole of his force to the labours of this Mission, and that a goodly increase of members have been reported for the year.
