

The Boston woman's suit for recovery was yesterday said at the offices of the board to hold the record as regards minimum value sought to be recovered from the Treasury Department. It seems that Miss Goodwin sent a spoon to a relative who resides in St. John's, Newfoundland, with the request that if the article failed to match other spoons in the possession of the recipient, it should be returned to Boston. As the spoon was not satisfactory it was returned to Miss Goodwin. Upon reaching Bangor, Me., the collector of customs took possession of the spoon and declined to surrender it to the owner until 65 cents duty had been paid.

In an opinion written by General appraiser Hay, it is held that the collector was within his rights in exacting duty on the spoon.


