The amount—\$489.25—was ordered to be paid, and the several Presbyteries were instructed to furnish the Committee in March next with a detailed statement of the amounts actually paid the several missionaries for travelling expenses.

REDUCED SALARIES.—It was agreed to recommend to the Assembly's Home Mission Committee, that in making grants next Spring to augmented congregations in the Province of Manitoba they proceed on the basis of a total salary of \$900 per annum instead of \$950 as heretofore, and that in the North West Territories the grants to augmented charges be based on a salary of \$50 per annum less than at present.

PRESBYTERY OF COLUMBIA.—An interesting report was submitted from the Rev. P. McF. McLeod, now convener of the Presbytery's Home Mission Committee.

Mr. Greenless had left the Province without entering on the work assigned him.

The Rev. A. Young had gone to Northfield and East and North Wellington in July and reported the prospect as most hopeful. Churches are likely to be erected at once in North Wellington and Northfield. The Executive is of opinion that Mr. Young should reside in the bounds of the field assigned him, and regret their inability to grant the application for a special grant of \$200 made on his behalf by the Presbytery's Home Mission Committee. The appointment of the Rev. E. A. McElmon to Surrey was confirmed. It was agreed to grant \$300 to Mr. Whidden for services rendered in Kettle River. The Executive expressed their gratification in learning that at Victoria West a new Church has just been opened and that New Westminster West is to be disjoined in January next from New Westminster East with a view to becoming a self-supporting charge.

REV. A. FINDLAY'S REPORT.—The Rev. A. Findlay laid on the table an intesesting report of his work for the past half-year. The report was received, and it was resolved to publish the substance of it in the *Presbyterian Record*. Mr. Findlay's expenses (197.52) were ordered to be paid.

MRS. NICHOLL'S BEQUESTS.—It was unanimously agreed to recommend to the Home Mission Committee at its meeting next March, that of the \$10,000 received from Mrs. Nicholl's estate for Home Missions the sum of \$4,000 be used for augmentation purposes; and that of the \$10,000 received for Home Missions in the North-West the sum of \$2,000 be used for augmented congregations in the Synod of Manitoba and the North-West.

MR. W. CREAM'S BEQUEST.—The Convener reported that he had received a copy of a protest served upon the executors of the estate of the late Mr. W. Cream of Quebec by the heirs, to the effect that as there was a community of property between Mr. Cream and his wife, he had no power to will that portion of his estate bequeathed to the Home, French and Foreign Mission funds of the Church, and restraining the executors from paying said bequests. The matter was referred to Drs. Cochrane and Warden, with instructions to take legal advice and such action as may be necessary, after consultation with the other Mission Boards.

MR. P. J. McRae's Bequest.—A communication was read affecting a bequest of \$1000 to the Home Mission fund from the late Mr. Peter J. McRae of Kenyon. It was referred for such action as may be necessary to Drs. Cochrane and Warden.

Young Peoples' Home Mission Societies:—In regard to the establishment of Young Peoples Home Mission Societies sanctioned by last General Assembly, the Committee earnestly request the representative of the Home Mission Committee in each Presbytery to take steps at the earliest date to have a Young Peoples' Society organized in every Congregation within the bounds.

SALARY OF 2ND YEAR THEOLOGICAL STUDENTS:—The following resolution was adopted:

That Students who have completed their second year in Theology and who accept appointments for a period of at least one year under the regulation of last General Assembly respecting an extra mural session, shall receive, until they have passed their examination in the extra mural session, the salary given to unordained men laboring continuously for one year in a field.

Under this regulation Mr. Alexander MacGregor was appointed for one year to the Synod of Manitoba and North West.

Augmentation Grants.—The Committee find that owing to the unusually large number of congregations, especially in the North West, that have been transferred since the meeting of Assembly from the list of Mission Stations to that of Augmented charges, the expenditure for the current year will be considerably in excess even of the estimate then made. In view of this fact the Committee, to prevent disappointment to the pastors of these charges, feels constrained to indicate the probability that in March next payments will be made on a reduced scale for the current half year, in accordance with the resolution of the Home Mission Committee at its meeting in March last, which is as follows:—

It was resolved to notify Presbyteries and missionaries that while the grants made are the amounts which, in the judgment of the Committee, are necessary for the efficient working of the fields, this Committee can only disburse the money placed at its disposal by the Church, and carnestly appeals to Presbyteries to adopt means to secure largely increased contributions on behalf of the Fund from the congregations within their bounds.

The Committee however expresses the hope that in response to the appeal of the Moderator of the General Assembly, the contributions may be such as to meet the requirements of the year.
