FIFTY-FIFTH ANNUAL REPORT
OF THE
COMMITTEE OF MANAGEMENT
OF THE
St. George's Society
OF THE
CITY OF TORONTO,
FOR THE YEAR 1889.

THE year for which they were elected having passed away, it becomes the duty of the Committee of Management to present to the Members this their Annual Report of the operations of the Society for the year 1889; the Treasurer's Statement of Receipts and Expenditures, with the Auditor's Report thereon, and certified Statement of the Investments of the Society.

RELIEF.

There have been 839 Applicants relieved during the year. The falling off in the numbers is attributable to the circumstance of the establishment by the City, at the House of Industry, of a cleanly, comfortable place, where single men are provided with nights' lodgings; and also to the remarkable mildness of the winter.

The number of families relieved (mostly new comers) has been about the same as previous years.

The cost of the relief given has amounted to \$819.11, which has been distributed in Provisions, Passages, and occasionally money.

Every service that was practicable has been rendered to suitable applicants.

Orders have been given for graves in the burial lots in St. James's Cemetery for nine adults and four children.

The last instalment of one hundred dollars was duly paid on the lots, and the Society now holds the deed for them.

FINANCIAL.

The Treasurer's Annual Statement, duly audited, will be presented herewith.

The financial position of the Society is good. The accounts are well paid up to the beginning of the year.

supporters of the Society. Ordinary members, 338; and so also as far as is known, five have died during the year, viz., Messrs. W. E. Brabant, E. Nurse, S. Lobb, all filling respectable positions in the community; Dr. S. Krauss, a young, but very rising member in his profession; and Mr. J. G. Howard, one of the founders of the Society, and yearly a liberal contributor to its funds, and a most generous benefactor to the City at large.

ANNIVERSARIES, ENTERTAINMENT, &C.

Continuing the long established usage, the first Anniversary Service was held in St. James's Cathedral, on Sunday, the 21st of April. The Rev. J. C. Roper preached a scholarly and appropriate Sermon. There was a large attendance: our brethren, the Sons of England, as usual, occupying a prominent position.

The second Service was held in the Carlton Street Methodist Church, on Sunday, the 24th September. The Rev. Coverdale Watson preaching a very excellent Sermon.

The Musical portion of the Services were rendered very efficiently by the Choirs, under the direction of Mr. W. E. Haslem and Mr. J. C. Arlidge. The Churches, as is always the case, were most freely and courteously granted for the occasions, and which was duly acknowledged at the time.

DINNER.

The Walker House was again selected as the place for the Annual Dinner. The President took the Chair, with the Vice-Presidents in the Vice-Chairs. One hundred and eight gentlemen were present, and a very agreeable and enjoyable evening was spent. The speeches and songs being pertinent and harmonious. The menu was in accordance with the established reputation of the Walker House.

EXCURSION.

Owing chiefly to the Garden Party that was given by Mr. and Mrs. Perceval Ridout on behalf of the Building Fund, there was no Excursion this year; but two Cricket Matches were played between members of the Society and members of Kent Lodge of the Sons of England; in the first of which the Society men were victorious, and the second the men of Kent gained the victory. Very sociable, pleasant afternoons were spent on each occasion.

NORTH AMERICAN ST. GEORGE'S UNION.

The Meeting of St. George's Union of North America was held in Hamilton this year, from August 20th to the 23rd. The President, Vice-President D. Plews, Vice-President H. K. Cockin, Past-President J. H. Mason, Past-President H. Symons, and the Secretary were present from this Society. The Hamilton people made it a great occasion, gave elegant entertainments, had a great display of fire works, illuminations, trade's processions, bicycle matches, a drive round the City, in fact, a perfect caraval, so that there was no lack of entertainment and amusement.

CONCERT.

A most successful Concert was given in the Pavilion in the Horticultural Gardens, on the evening of November 7th (Thanksgiving Day). Mr. E. W. Schuch was engaged as the conductor; and the whole performance was very satisfactory, as also were the net results, which amounted to \$181.23.

CHRISTMAS DISTRIBUTION.

The Christmas Distribution this year was, as heretofore, on a large scale. Generous contributions were received. It was made in a store on Church Street, very kindly lent by W. J. Macdonnell, Esq. The collections made by the Committee

and Stewards amounted to \$916.50, and the expenditure to \$912. 797 families, consisting of 4,232 individuals, received one of the most liberal supplies ever given by the Society. 7,400 pounds of beef were purchased, besides which many very liberal donations of meat were received. 1,225 loaves of bread, over 800 quarter pounds of tea, and the same number of pounds of sugar being distributed.

REPORT OF THE BUILDING COMMITTEE.

In the early part of the year the Building Committee proceeded to secure further subscriptions, and to collect the amounts already subscribed, and the result enabled them to complete the purchase on the first of June when the contract matured. This was done by payment of two thousand five hundred dollars—half of the purchase money—and giving a mortgage for the balance, payable in five years, with interest at six per cent., with the privilege of paying it off at any time. To enable this to be done the deed was taken in the names of the gentlemen who assumed the trust, namely, Messrs. Spooner, Plews, Stockwell, and H. Symons, and the mortgage was executed by them, both instruments being duly registered. The Trustees thereupon executed and delivered to the Managing Committee a deed to the Society subject to the mortgage, and it now remains for the Annual Meeting to authorize its acceptance and registration.

The canvass among the members for subscriptions has to this extent been very satisfactory, the amounts being liberal and freely given; but it became apparent to the Building Committee that the balance of the money to clear the land could not be procured for some time unless some special means were adopted. All the members must recognize how important it is for the welfare of the Society that it should at the earliest moment secure accommodation at once adequate to the Society's wants, and consistent with its dignity. The present quarters are altogether unsuitable, and tend very much to diminish the Society's influence, and creates a general lack of interest in the objects for which we became associated. Recognizing this, the Building Committee enlarged its numbers, and invited the co-operation of a number of the members. The Committee then unanimously agreed that it would be desirable to obtain the services of Past President J.

Herbert Mason as its Chairman, well knowing the enthusiasm which he has always felt for anything which tended to advance the Society. The position was tendered to Mr. Mason, and he, at the Committee's request, promised to consider and suggest a means for attaining the desired end. This promise has been fulfilled, and at a recent special meeting Mr. Mason submitted his views, which were, that the Society should complete the purchase of the land, and hold it free from any debt. Upon this being done, then to erect a building of somewhat larger dimensions than had been contemplated, to include a large room suitable for entertainments, a lodge room, possibly a couple of stores, besides providing rooms for the Society's business, and Secretary's residence. In this way a revenue could be raised, and the work carried out through the means of a Joint Stock Company to be formed exclusively from the Society's membership.

A mutual arrangement could be made between the Society and the Company so as to ensure the Society's use of its premises, and to provide for the retention of the control over the Company's affairs by the Society's members who may become shareholders.

The meeting concurred with Mr. Mason in considering that the undertaking could be accomplished in this way, and recommended this Committee so to report, which they now do, at the same time expressing their concurrence, and recommending that a Special Committee be appointed, authorized to deal generally with the subject.

Stockwell, and Harry Symons, acted as Trustees on behalf of the Society, and having executed a mortgage for \$2,500 (the balance of the purchase money), to be payable in five years with interest at six per cent., a deed was executed and delivered to them for and on behalf of the Society ;

And whereas, the said Trustees have also executed and delivered to the Managing Committee a deed of the said lot, subject to the said mortgage ; and it being desirable that the same shall be accepted and the Trustees relieved ;

It is Resolved, That the Managing Committee be, and they are hereby authorized to accept such conveyance, and cause the same to be registered, and the Trustees are hereby discharged from their trust in the premises ;

And it is further Resolved, That the said Trustees be requested to place to the Society's credit the balance of the funds collected by them and the late Building Committee towards such purchase, and that the same be in future administered by the Managing Committee.
