

U. S. GOVERNMENT HAS MADE NO MOVEMENT YET

Has so far Failed to Ratify the Treaty for the Protection of Fishing in International Waters.

Ottawa, July 10.—Last spring the Hoo. J. D. Hazen went to Washington and interviewed President Wilson at to the probabilities of the United States ratifying the treaty with Can ada as to the protection of fishing in international waters. The intimation was conveyed that the extra session of Congress was to deal only with the tariff, and no definite assurance was given as to the probable action of congress at its regular session.

The Canadian Parliament five year ago passed legislation concurring in the treaty. Ever since it has been held up awaiting similar action a Washington. Due allowance is made for the fact that the extra session ocongress is to deal exclusively with the tariff, but if, at the session starting in December, nothing is done and the Democratic administration follow the inactive precedent of the Republicans, it is wholly probable that Can ada will withdraw from the treaty and the extensive investigation and work necessitated by it will count for nought.






