London, Mar. 13&—The high water mark in naval expenditures which has been reached in the estimates for 1914-15, as brought forward in the House of Commons last night, is causing keen disappeintment and concern to Liberal economists and Pacifists. An account for the year just ending is a supplementary vote of £2,740, 000, bring the new estimates to the prodigious figure of £51,550,000, or £257,750,000.

The plans of the First Lord of the Admiralty, Mr. Churchill, are viewed with suspicion all the more because of the meagre nature of the information and explanatory statements he has afforded. And not only is more money but more men demanded, the human increase to be 5,000, while the building programme will be composed of four battleships, four light cruisers and twelve destroyers. This programme is not more than what will adequately maintain the sixty per cent standard of superiority.




