PROCEEDINGS
OR
Annual Meeting of the Society.

The TWENTY-SEVENTH ANNUAL MEETING of the MISSIONARY SOCIETY of the W. M. CHURCH IN CANADA, was held in the New Wesleyan Church, Kingston, on Monday Evening, the 9th day of June, 1852, Rev. ENOCH WOOD in the Chair. The Meeting was opened with singing and prayer, and a statement of the financial condition of the Society having been made, the following Resolutions were adopted:—

REPORT.

With the encouraging evidence of the Divine favour resting upon the plans and labours of the Society, as manifested by an increase in the number of Church members in the Missionary department of the Wesleyan Methodist Conference, Canada West, the Annual Report is presented to the friends and supporters of the institution. There have been seasons when the means to carry on aggressive operations were less than the openings for usefulness, or competent labourers to go forth and "preach the gospel!" Without being overburdened by an overflowing income, there has been wanting a suitable supply of men to occupy all the places where the settlers were desirous of being supplied with the ordinances of grace by Wesleyan Missionaries. The Church needs to pray that the Lord of the harvest would raise up and send forth more labourers.

At least sixty-four Missions have been supplied with faithful and laborious Ministers during the past year: fifty-one of these are Domestic, and thirteen Indian Missions. Forty thousand immortal beings have been regularly supplied with "the word" from the lips of a living spiritual ministry, eight thousand eight hundred and fifty of whom are members of our communion. From the accounts forwarded of the religious state of the work, the following selection is made for the information of those who have generously contributed to the funds appropriated for the spread of the faith.

INDIAN MISSIONS.

In addition to the interesting Report of the Superintendent of the Muncey Mission, the Board of Management have pleasure in placing upon record the opinion of the Hon. Colonel Bruc, Superintendent General of Indian Affairs, after a personal visit and examination of the Alderville and Mount Elgin Industrial Schools. Such a testimony must be appreciated by the older members of the Church especially, who have long taken a lively interest in the civil elevation of the Indian character, as well as in his spiritual regeneration.

MUNCEY.

"The close of another ecclesiastical year reminds me of the duty of furnishing, for the information of the friends and supporters of the Missionary Society, another report on the state and prospects of the Mission, on which, in connexion with brother Sunday, among the Ojebways ; Sickles, among the Oneidas ; and Halfmoon, among the Munceys. I have been labouring during the two last past years—years of unusual toil and anxiety.

"As this is a purely Missionary field, so our work has been purely Missionary work, the work of distributing, as the almoners of heaven, '*the Bread of Life*' among the famishing—'*the Sovereign Balm*' among the morally diseased—and the "*Robes of Righteousness*," to hide the shame of their nakedness, among the destitute ; a work rendered increasingly arduous, because these gifts are not desired by the mass of those to whom they are presented ; requiring to be shewed their necessities, and to have the importance of these gifts made convincingly known. Their vitiated taste renders *the Bread of Life* distasteful ; the torpid character of their disease causes them to look with strange indifference on the only suitable remedy ; and their long degraded state, and the protracted use of their own evil habits, lead them to turn away from the '*white raiments*,' though so costly and so necessary.

"And yet the work cannot be abandoned. The command is imperative, spoken by Him who could say, when giving it, '*All power is given unto me, in heaven and in earth, go ye therefore ;*' and who still says, '*occupy till I come.*' These commands which have constantly im-

pressed us with the thought, that the work, like the agents employed, is not our own; joined with the 'love of Christ, which constraineth us,' have caused us 'to labour on, and offer all our works to Him.'

"In addition to the ordinary means of grace, regularly kept up among the three distinct bands, in their own language, we spent a whole week together at a camp-meeting; which was attended by large numbers from the three nations, and a considerable number of pagans, who had been invited, and were provided for, while on the ground, by the Christian Indians, who did all they could to prolong the stay of their unconverted friends. The pagans remained on the ground for several days, accompanied by their head Chief, with their faces blacked, seated by themselves at a respectful distance, apparently fearing to come too close to the Christians while engaged in prayer, yet listening to the words of the Great Spirit. Brother Sunday, who has secured their confidence, spoke faithfully and affectionately to them. When they retired they seemed thoughtful, and from what we heard afterwards, we were led to hope that the word had found a lodgement in their hearts; and, indeed, had it not been for the continued efforts which are made by the low dealers in intoxicating drink, whose zeal in furnishing the Indians with the soul-and-body destroying poison is worthy of a better cause, and whose success is lamentably great, we have reason to believe that they would long ere this have been brought to God, and that we should not have to mourn over so many backsliders, and so many who are 'led captive by the devil at his will.'

"The Indians cannot go to a store, or pass along the highway, without meeting some of those who for *three-half pennies* will break the law of the land, and thus expose themselves to fine or imprisonment; rob the Church of its trophies; hang Heaven in mourning, and send a soul to hell!

"While the Indians depend on the chase, and on the sale of their brooms and baskets to the white settlers, for the means of their subsistence, they will continue to be exposed to the temptations thus thrown in their way. We have, therefore, done all we could to induce them to cultivate their lands, as a means of support, and thus be less from home—less exposed to the temptations "which so easily beset them"—more regularly enjoy the means of grace established among them, without which they will never be prosperous.

"This advice they seemed quite disposed to take, and had done well in sowing grain and planting corn; but in consequence of the high waters in the River Thames, all the corn and grain on the flats were destroyed, and many lost their all; this drove them again from home, and their children with them, taking many of the day-scholars again from the school. Nevertheless, the attendance on the means of grace has been pretty general; and hence, their religious state, all things considered, is quite encouraging; for, although some have fallen by the hand of the enemy, others have been reclaimed, and some converted to God, whose faithfulness has caused us to rejoice and be thankful.

"The work has been particularly prosperous among the Oneidas, where there has been a large accession to the congregation, making our large Chapel quite too small for the assembly of attentive hearers. Besides several who are occasional attendants at the class-meetings, there are between 25 and 30 who have given evidence of conversion to God during the year, and are added to the Church, among whom we are happy to number some who give promise of great usefulness in the cause of God.

"After making the usual deductions for deaths—of which there have been many triumphant ones—removals and expulsions, we are enabled, with thankfulness to God, to report an increase of members another year.

SABBATH SCHOOLS.—In addition to the one taught in the Institution, numbering between 50 and 60 regular attendants, and which is still in a very encouraging state, there has been one recently established among the Munceys, and superintended by C. Halfmoon, into which the Catechism translated by him into Muncey, and recently published by the Society, has been introduced, and from which much good will no doubt arise.

THE BIBLE AND CATECHUMEN CLASS, composed of the more advanced youths of the Mount Elgin Institution, and others residing near by, mentioned in my last year's Report, has made very satisfactory progress during the year. Some of the children committed to memory the whole of numbers I. and II. of our excellent Catechism. Every possible means has been used to enable them to comprehend their truth; and many prayers offered to God that the seed thus sown may produce fruit, that shall be seen many days hence.

THE THREE DAY SCHOOLS have been kept regularly open, and every means in our power used to secure a regular attendance of children; and though the attendance of Ojebway children has not been as general and as regular, as we could have desired, owing to the absence of the families, as before mentioned, yet the attendance of the Oneida children, at the Oneida School, has been much better than on any previous year, to the number of from 28 to 30. Of these 10 are reading in the New Testament, and the remainder in the First Class Book; some few are writing.

THE MOUNT ELGIN INDUSTRIAL SCHOOL, for the benefit of Indian youth, established at this place, mentioned in my last year's Report, to which for further particulars I beg to refer, has received, as required, my principal attention, from an increased conviction of the truth of the concluding sentence in my last year's Report, that '*Your Manual Labour Schools is the last effort in connexion with your heaven-owned Missionary labours, to save from utter extinction the remnant of a once noble, but now deeply degraded race.*'

"Hence, the education of these youths has been regarded by me as a work of no ordinary character; an education solemnly important in its connection with the future, with unborn periods of time; *time that shall*

belong to and be occupied by others, and with eternity itself. These youths are to form a *class* whose history is to be a most important *epoch* in the history of the nations to which they belong ; whose origin is wrapt up in such impenetrable mystery. From this class is to spring a generation, who will either perpetuate the manners and customs of their ancestors, or being intellectually, morally and religiously *elevated*, take their stand among the improved, intelligent nations of the earth, act their part in the great drama of the world's doing ; or through want of the necessary qualifications, to take their place and perform their part, be despised and pushed off the stage of action and cease to be !

"Hence, I have asked myself the question, What should that education be, which will qualify them for the great purposes of their being ? And while the common and plain answer seems to be, that it should be *moral*, *religious*, *intellectual*, and *social* ; yet to make it available, it must, in the fullest sense of the word, be *practical*. But, in giving such an education, we meet with *many obstructions*, which are to be removed before this education can be imparted. We do not get them before they have been educated in all that is evil ; until *immorality* and *irreligion* have gained a complete ascendancy, and habits and practices the most demoralizing and enervating have been formed, controlling every power or faculty of body and soul. The removal of these obstructions, the disengaging of these faculties, is a work of time, and a work which God alone, through his 'sanctifying word, which is truth,' can accomplish. Hence, every effort is made to make them *believingly* and practically acquainted with his word. To this we go with them for our authority for every prohibition, as well as every duty, moral, religious, intellectual, and civil, enforced and required to be performed. From this we derive our authority for teaching, among other important lessons, the duty of '*being diligent in business*', while fervent in spirit, serving the Lord'—*to labour six days*, as well as to '*remember the seventh day to keep it holy*'—'*that if any will not work, neither shall he eat*' ; and after the manner of the Apostle, '*we command and exhort, by our Lord Jesus Christ, that with quietness they work and eat their own bread*' ; and that *diligence in whatever vocation*, either as mechanics, husbandmen, or professional men, and in *whatever clime or place* they may be providentially appointed, is absolutely necessary to secure to them the divine applause, '*well done good and faithful servants.*' On these means and God's blessings we rely for success.

"There is an increasing desire, on the part of those Indians best acquainted with the workings of the Institution, to have their children admitted, and had we room to receive them, and means to support them, they could be received by scores. Scarcely a week passes by but we are compelled to see them go away, followed by the poor little sorrowful, yet interestingly looking, disappointed applicants. The improved appearance of the children in the Institution, creates in the minds of their old associates desire to be like them ; and when I see the mortality which prevails among them, arising from their ignorance and consequent vice and poverty, and the diminution of their race, I cannot

refrain saying, would to God that the means of support and instruction were equal to the calls for aid ! What is done must be done for them now or they are gone!"

"INDIAN DEPARTMENT,
"Quebec, 19th June, 1852.

SIR,

"I am directed to acknowledge the receipt of your letter of the 5th ult., enclosing the Annual Reports of the Rev. Superintendents of the Alnwick and Mount Elgin Schools. The Governor General has postponed his remarks on this important subject until my return from Western Canada, whither I proceeded chiefly for the purpose of visiting these Institutions.

"His Excellency desires me now to state, that both from the perusal of these documents, and the results which I have communicated to him of my late personal observations, he derives a favourable impression of the progress of this interesting experiment. There seems to be good reason to hope that the effort to unite intellectual and industrial education, and to wean the Indian children from the peculiar habits and pursuits of their race, may, if prosecuted with the zeal and judgment, which have characterized the labours of the Rev. Messrs. Rose and Case, be attended with success.

"The proficiency of the children in the several branches of common education, was, in my opinion, very creditable. The Teachers at Alnwick, both of them pupils of the Normal School at Toronto, seemed to be extremely efficient, and I was much struck with the marked devotion of those at Mount Elgin to their task. It is obvious that great care should be taken in the elementary instruction of the scholars, and that they should not be hurried too rapidly into the higher departments of study. Their ignorance of the English language places them at a great disadvantage as compared with White children, although their progress, notwithstanding that drawback, is certainly very surprising.

"The system pursued with respect to the industrial education is apparently very judicious, and the results are highly encouraging. That department is admirably conducted at Mount Elgin, and the Society has been particularly fortunate in finding a Superintendent and Schoolmaster, who are able and willing to take an active part in the out-door operations, as their presence and example must necessarily produce a powerful effect upon the children. The farm also is most conveniently situated, lying in a compact form round the School; whereas part of the land belonging to the other Institution is removed some distance from it. In both cases, however, I saw abundant evidences of the industry of the scholars, and the Society have provided these establishments with liberal supplies of live stock for consumption and use.

from the benevolent care and attention bestowed upon them by Mrs. Case and Mrs. Rose, and the excellent training which the girls receive at their hands, in the various household and domestic duties.

"The chief impediments to the satisfactory working of the Schools seem to be—first, the unwillingness of the Northern Tribes to send their children to Alnwick—second, the irregular and, as I regret to learn, the gradual diminishing attendance of Day Scholars. I trust, however, that experience may suggest remedies for these evils.

"In conclusion, His Excellency desires me earnestly to call your attention to the importance of diminishing, as much as possible, the cost of the maintenance of the boarders, and thus enabling the Department to add to their number. He is fully sensible that the Society is as anxious as he can be upon this point, and he observes with pleasure, that for the current year, you propose to raise the number at Mount Elgin from 33 to 36; he will only therefore express the hope, that advantage will be taken of the increasing amount of land under cultivation, and availability of the gratuitous labour of the scholars, and that the farm produce may soon form an important item in the support of these Institutions. His Excellency is likewise desirous that strict justice should be done to subscribing Tribes, and that the proportion of boarders to which such is entitled be rigidly maintained. I enclose a form of Return, which the Superintendent of each School is requested to furnish quarterly to this office, through the Local Superintendent of Indians, upon the receipt of which the usual warrant, in advance to the Wesleyan Society for the ensuing quarter, will issue.

N E W C R E D I T .

"We have on this Mission four classes, containing 72 Members. During the year 6 have removed, 3 have died, 5 have been expelled, and 2 admitted, which make a decrease of 12 in our numbers. The Day School has been kept for six or seven months of the year, and has prospered beyond our expectations. More than ordinary pains have been taken to induce as numerous and as regular attendance as possible, and a gratifying proficiency in their studies has been the result. Our new Church is nearly completed, and will be ready for dedication soon after

Conference. It is a neat building, 30 by 40, with a gallery on one end. It has a spire attached to it, the basement of which is 12 feet square, the upper part is tinned, and the remainder, with the whole of the building, is being painted white. It stands upon a beautiful rising ground, which gives it an imposing appearance. This Mission has suffered much from various causes which must be noticed. The agitation which has continued for several years between the Commissioners of Indian Lands and the squatters, who are scattered over different parts of the reservation,—the former using legal means to have them removed, and the latter employing a variety of methods to retain possession of the lots they have settled upon, and to evade the vigilance of the Law Officers. The Indians have been more or less drawn into this warfare, and their minds have been disturbed and discouraged; consequently they have almost ceased making any improvements on their lots, assigning as a reason: 'We know not whether we shall be able to hold our land—we may be driven off to make room for the White man.'

"Another sad consequence of this discouragement is, they have not cultivated their small improvements; hence they do not raise grain, &c., to supply their wants, and necessity compels them to be absent from their homes the chief part of the year. Some go to the old Credit, some to Muncey, some to Owen's Sonnd, others go to different parts of the country for the purposes of hunting, fishing, making baskets, &c., which keep them from the means of grace, and cause them to commingle with people who are unfriendly to religion, and who frequently lead them into scenes of drunkenness and debauchery. They never will make encouraging progress in farming or religion, unless they can be persuaded to relinquish their roaming habits, stay at home, give due attention to their agricultural interests, and the means employed for their spiritual welfare.

"Throughout this Conference year they have never been all at home at one time. A large number of them has been absent ten months out of twelve. Some have not returned yet, and perhaps never will. They have sustained a heavy temporal loss in the burning of their excellent Saw Mill some time in July last. This was done by some heartless incendiary. Sickness has prevailed to an alarming extent among them, and death has cut down many of the young and some of the old. The principal part of them has now returned; they have commenced their farming operations with considerable zeal and activity, which seem to indicate that new life has been by some means infused into them; how long it will continue, and the effects it will produce, time will tell."

and owing to a variety of causes, the school has been but little attended to. Since Conference 6 adults and 6 children have departed this life. Three of the former were members of our Church. One of those died unexpectedly, but we trust died well. The other two, one of them a youth, who had but recently returned from the Alderville Manual Labour School, died of lingering sickness, affording us the opportunity of frequently visiting them. They both died in the triumph of faith.

“We trust, also, there was hope in the death of a young man of the Roman Catholic persuasion, whom we visited and endeavoured to instruct. Whilst we have rejoiced in the blameless walk of some of our members, over the inconsistencies of others we have had to mourn; and it has been our painful duty to expel 3. The members at present in full standing are 53, and 2 on trial. Beside 3 expulsions, we have had 1 removal, and, as before mentioned, 3 deaths.”

BEAUSOLIEL AND FRENCH RIVER.

“In a community where all, or nearly all, are members of some Christian denomination, there can be but little variation from year to year, or any thing new or striking to record. The transition from a state of barbarism to one of civilization is so slow and gradual, that the advancement made is not so apparent to the casual observer as to the Missionary, who, residing with them, can daily mark their varied progress.

“But the change from heathenism to Christianity is a work that is much sooner accomplished, because it is more especially the work of the Triune Deity. Let the Indian be convinced that heathenism is utterly worthless, let him feel that he is a sinner, and as such exposed to the wrath of God; or, as he expresses it in his simple manner, ‘very sick in his heart’ he at once throws off his blanket, his covering of self-righteousness, and takes hold of the promises with a simplicity and strength of faith, that at once brings the good physician to his aid; the healing balm is applied, and he becomes a new creature in Christ Jesus; and the man who has patience, strongly blended with persevering grace and willing, with the great Apostle of the Gentiles, to become all things to all men that he may win them to Christ, may find enough among the simple and degraded natives of our forests, to fill his heart and hands in his labour of love.

“With strangers, the Indians are very reserved, but to those with whom they are acquainted and in whom they have confidence, they are open and communicative. On this Mission many are the subjects of regenerating grace, and as a natural consequence, they are acquiring and enjoying many of the comforts of civilization. But the past year has

been one of severe trial to this people; the almost total failure of their crops on this dry and barren Island last year; the exceeding high winds during the fishing season in the fall; the length and severity of the winter, together with considerable sickness, have put their faith and patience to the test; but that religion which proves a source of comfort to the white man in the hour of trial, has sustained our people through their various afflictions, and although very poor this spring, they offer what little they can do with as cheerful a countenance as ever.

"The Camp-meeting held on this Mission last September, was a time of quickening. Several were converted—the children of Methodist parents and backsliders were reclaimed. Last winter we had a protracted service for several evenings, and although the weather was stormy and the cold intense, there was a good attendance during the whole of the exercises, and many received good.

"We have to record the death of but one of our members since our last Report;—the oldest son of our head Chief. He had been at the Alderville school for two years or more. He came home last Summer in rather delicate health, and when the other children returned to school he was too unwell to accompany them; it soon appeared that he had the consumption; he was confined to his room, and the most of the time to his bed, during the long and dreary winter. As long as he was able, he delighted in reading his Testament and found great comfort in prayer. He was a most patient sufferer; not a complaint or a murmuring word escaped his lips during his long and painful illness. On Tuesday, the 11th May, his spirit left its tenement of clay, and I trust has gone to that realm of eternal bliss, 'Where sorrow and sighing never come, and pain is feared and felt no more.'

"I have visited French River: the members there, though few have been kept on their way principally through the labours of Solomon James, your excellent Teacher and Local Preacher, who, though an Indian brother, is a good and faithful man. They are still looking to your Society for help. In view of the labours and mercies of the past year, I feel that I have cause to thank God and take courage."

The gathering together for public worship is very encouraging where profound attention is paid to the word, which is accompanied with the enlightening, quickening, and saving influences of the Holy Ghost. Many tears are seen rolling down the aged cheek, and many voices of praise and thanksgiving are heard in the house of God, and so powerfully has the gospel of Christ triumphed over Pagan superstition, that

an old man who was a professed conjurer for many years gave up his medicine bag, with its contents, which were consumed in the fire. At our last Quarterly-meeting, which was a time long to be remembered, the old man said, 'He felt something he never experienced before ; he felt happy in his heart ; he hoped when the Lord would call him away he would be ready.'

" All the privileges of the sanctuary are more strictly and devotedly attended, and prove seasons of refreshment from the presence of the Lord ; who, according to his promise, is 'in the midst of them,' and they are enabled to say,

*'Thy presence makes my paradise,
And where Thou art is heaven.'*

" The older members of the Society adorn the doctrine of God their Saviour, by a holy walk and godly conversation ; those who have been lately converted and added to the Church give satisfactory evidence of a change of heart, and during the whole year *few* cases of immorality have occurred.

" The Indians have paid but little attention to agriculture ; their main dependance being fishing and hunting ; they are, however, beginning to see and feel the importance of cultivating the soil, and imitating the whites in having farms to themselves ; they have, therefore, petitioned Government to have their land surveyed into lots of 100 acres each.

" The Day School has been in operation the greater part of the year, and some little progress has been made.

" The Sabbath School, being well attended, is very interesting ; 11 can read the Holy Scriptures, and some others, 30 and 40 years of age, are anxiously learning their letters, with the hope of one day being able to read the word of God for themselves. There are about 50 children and adults in attendance."

S T . C L A I R .

The following report from Bro. Herkimer, Indian Missionary, is given with one or two slight corrections as he forwarded it, retaining the simplicity of his own language. Several visits have been paid to some pagan Indians on Walpole Island, but not with such success as to justify any additional outlay at present in keeping up regular appointments. The Mission of the Society is to the heathen portion of the aborigines. As the Board cannot form a favourable opinion of the motives or labours of those who seek to divide the Church, where communities are small and incapable of understanding theological distinctions of little import-

ance when contrasted with the saving doctrines of grace; neither would they compromise their own consistency by their agents invading the ground which has been *successfully cultivated* by other labourers. In the vast territory to the North and West ample fields invite the zeal and benevolence of all who long for the salvation of these wandering tribes:—

"I am joyful that the God of Misions comforteth us; myself and family, as well as Brother Salt and family, have enjoyed through the year an almost uninterrupted state of good health; for which we desire to give thanks to God from whom all our mercies flow. There has been but few cases of sickness. Two have died during the year. I visited them occasionally when they were sick, and one of them said to me,—'I am not afraid to die: I am going home where Jesus is. Tell the Missionaries I thank them for showing me the way to heaven: tell them I'll meet them in heaven,' and she closed her eyes in death. She was a pious sister. 13 adults have been baptized. I rejoice that this Mission is prospering. 35 have been taken into the Society. Altogether there are 175. The last Quarterly-meeting we had was very good: there were a great many spoke in the Love-feast; every speaker spoke of the present enjoyment of the love of God; every one said it is good for us to be here: one fault was we did not keep our Love-feast long enough. So you see as dark as the night may be, there are yet a few stars to cheer the gloom of the traveller and labourer in the Indian work."

G A R D E N R I V E R.

This new enterprize has fully answered the expectations of the Board in recommending the appointment of a Missionary and Teacher to the Conference. The place is centrally situated for diffusing the light of the Gospel to distant tribes and bands of pagan Indians. We invite the attention of our readers to the speech, immediately following the report, illustrative of the ardent desire for knowledge, and a continuation of the means of grace. The Missionary was on the eve of departing for the Conference when the address was made.

"On the 2nd of last August we commenced our labours amongst this people, and though at first we had many opposing influences to contend with, yet the Gospel has triumphed. Souls to the number of twenty have been converted, and gathered into the church of God. Buildings

for missionary purposes have been erected. A school has been started under promising circumstances. Temperance has received a share of attention; and families who heretofore have been proverbial for their dissipated habits, have for the last ten months totally abstained. The work is still onward. Individuals either married into, or belonging to other bands, have been converted, and are now, in their intercourse with these friends, helping to spread the influences of the Gospel. To God be all the praise!

"In connection with our Indian work, we have visited the Bruce Mines monthly. Here we have witnessed the power of the Gospel in the salvation of souls. A class numbering seventeen persons was formed, and an influence of the happiest character exerted. As a proof of their gratitude for the attention received, the miners contributed the sum of \$50—20 of which was to meet the expenses of travelling to and from the Mines, and 30 for the Missionary Fund.

"In conclusion, we are truly thankful to the Great Head of the Church for the degree of success which has attended the labours of the past year. Our destination was the north shore, a circuit extending from French River, to Fort William, a distance of 600 miles; a coast dotted with camps of a once mighty race; a people willing to receive the Gospel; a people who, in both a temporal as well as spiritual point of view, must perish without it." *G. M. McDougall.*

INDIAN SPEECH.

The Speech made by Ojeh Nah, one of the Chiefs of the Garden River Band, in a General Council, prior to the Missionary's leaving for Conference.

"Black Coat, I want to say a few words. I want to say them strong. We want you to repeat them to the Big Black Coat, and Black Coats assembled in Council. The Indians down South have Fathers and Mothers. We are Orphans. The Great Spirit has done a great deal for them; he has given them a rich country. He has also sent them Missionaries who have been parents to them. The Great Woman Chief has been a Mother to them. She has assisted their Missionary in building large Schools amongst them, and in teaching them how to work. They are not poor, they have plenty of kind friends. Not so with us, we are Orphans: we who live on the North Shore of Huron and Superior. The Great Spirit has not given us a rich country; the Missionary has not taught us the White man's religion; no teacher has been sent us, nor School House built for us. We are poor. We have no kind Great Fathers or Mother to protect us; we are worse than our forefathers were many years ago. Our forests were full of wild animals, deer, bear, beaver, &c.; but the White man came and induced us to kill off all our furs. He brought his steamboats and large nets, and drove the fish from our shores. We are poor, and we are becoming

more so every year. Now, we want you to say to the Big Black Coats, that we ask them to help us. We want them very much ; we want our sons and daughters to understand paper and to learn to work. Tell them that we live in a very large country, and that there are a great many of us. Tell them about this place, that it lies between Huron and Superior ; that the land is good ; that we raise good potatoes, oats, turnips, &c., and all sell for great price ; but that the Indian knows little about making gardens. Tell them we ask for a School, like the one some of us saw at Alnwick, when we went to Moneyau (Montreal), three years ago. We are willing to give some of the best of our land for a farm, and assist in building the houses ; but we must have the White man to teach us the way."

A L D E R V I L L E .

"This Mission continues favourably its wonted progress in the several departments of *religious* and domestic improvements. The funds are mostly in advance ; the schools, both *Sabbath* and *Industrial*, are imparting useful knowledge. In all the Societies, both *White* and *Indian*, there appear delightful evidences of pure religion. The number of natives in Society is 68, and are regularly met in five classes by native Leaders. The Indian population, with few exceptions, attend religious services—no traits of paganism remain—mostly free from the influence of intoxicating liquors.

"To the neighbouring White settlements which are increasing around us we have free access ; among whom we have religious societies and Sabbath Schools ; our sphere of labours is enlarging, and our prospects of usefulness increasing. We have to repeat that the Alderville Mission has been from the beginning, and still is, a most important one, both to the new and increasing White population as well as to the Indian settlement. Its influence is felt on the morals of the people ; their social comforts, religious privileges, and establishment of schools, all which have been faithfully performed and encouraged by the Missionaries of the Station, and which are gratefully acknowledged by the people.

"In conclusion, I have but to say that the conversion of the Mississaugah Indians of Bay Quinty stands as another distinguished monument of the triumph of the Christian religion. Twenty-four years ago they were a most degraded and suffering people ; wandering about without house or field, depending for a precarious subsistence on the chase, and slaves to the influence of intoxicating spirits. Their presents from the Government, and annuity for lands sold, were ample for every want, but they were squandered in scenes of dissipation, and in a few weeks after the *distribution*, destitute and suffering from cold. Not one of them could read—none sang a song of Zion—their worship was the sun, the thunder, the great waters ; but mostly of *Mah-che-muneto*, the Evil

Spirit. Their numbers diminishing, they were fast wasting away. Degraded and suffering as they then were, by the Gospel they are become a happy Christian, and, to considerable extent, a useful people. They are settled on 3,600 acres of land, laid out in farms, 500 acres of which are under cultivation. Each family is provided with a comfortable dwelling; they have horses, oxen, cows, and farming utensils, and a saw-mill; both *Sabbath, Day, and Industrial Schools*; buildings for which were erected (assisted by other tribes) at the expense of the Indian funds; one-fourth of their annuity only being applied, by *their consent*, for this purpose. In the Church, every Sabbath, their devotions are conducted both in English and Indian; many read, and sing, and pray in both languages. Warriors, once pagan, are become School Teachers, Interpreters, and Ministers of the Gospel, whose labours have extended to other tribes on the shores of St. Clair, Lake Huron, Lake Superior, Hudson's Bay, and State of Michigan. Other youth are now training in the Industrial School for further services to the Indians of our wilderness. Friends of Missions! Do you regret the part you have taken in the Indian Missions?"

S A U G E E N.

"Doubtless you are aware that this Mission at present contains not only the Indian settlement of the north-eastern bank of the Saugeen River, but also the white settlements adjoining. In the former there is one preaching place, a comparatively neat church; and in the latter three, where the services are performed in private houses. In the Indian part of the Mission there are 87 church members, and among the whites about 15, making a total of 102 in church fellowship."

"There are several circumstances connected with this Mission of a discouraging character to the missionary; the principal of which are, first, the fact that the Indians, in their hunting excursions, are absent from their homes the greater part of the year, so that there is little opportunity for their being benefited by the labours of the missionary; second, the prevalence of drunkenness amongst the Indians, there being no magistrates in the adjoining settlement, by whose interference the law prohibiting the sale of intoxicating drinks to the Indian race might be put in force; third, the existence of a party in the Indian village, professing to belong to the neighbouring Congregational Mission. The proximity of this party makes the exercise of discipline difficult: for as soon as any of our people come under church censure, the usual proceeding is to join the adverse party, instead of humbling themselves, and reuniting with their brethren, as doubtless would be the case in most instances, were it not for the facility afforded them of uniting with another body. But the encouragements must not be overlooked; and these are, the growing piety and steadfastness of many of our people. The strenuous efforts made by several individuals to plant corn, potatoes,

and other vegetables—in one instance the ground being ploughed (through the want of oxen) by harnessing ten or twelve Indians to the plough, while the chief guided that useful implement.

"There seems also to be a willingness on the part of some of the Indians, to locate themselves on farms, were there sufficient facilities afforded them for that purpose; and indeed until they give up their migratory habits, and cultivate the soil for their support, there can be little hope entertained of their Christianization or civilization.

"There are but few white settlers comparatively in these parts, yet from the slow but continual flow of emigration from other parts of Canada, the few will become many. At present it is rather difficult to visit them, as will appear from the fact, that the missionary, in filling his appointments, has to walk fifteen or sixteen miles on one Lord's day, and over twenty on another, through a *trackless* forest and clouds of mosquitoes."

G R A N D R I V E R .

The Conference has appointed an additional Missionary to the *Grand River*, and the Board of Management have sanctioned an appeal to them for the support of another day-school. Brother Sickles is labouring under Rev. Wm. Ryerson's direction amongst the Mohawks, with very encouraging success. Many applications have been made during the year, to the resident Missionary, for religious instruction and comfort, by those not belonging to the Wesleyan Church, in affliction and prospective dissolution. To meet the wish of the Pagan Indians to have their children educated, this addition has been made to the school department; a movement indicative of their desire for truth in preference to the "lying vanities" by which too many of them are controlled, though in the midst of a Christian community.

R I C E A N D M U D L A K E S .

From these Missions no report has been forwarded; but the General Superintendent has gathered pleasing testimony of the stability and consistency of the members. Some very favourable tokens of spiritual life and prosperity have recently gladdened the heart of the devoted

Missionary who has these interesting people now under his charge: being enabled to address them in their own language upon the mysteries of the kingdom of God, he possesses great advantage over those who are obliged to speak through the medium of an interpreter. In agriculture, temperance, industry and religion, the Rice Lake Indians cannot be surpassed by any other portions of their people in Canada West.

The Missionary Society is under great obligations to the Committee of the Toronto Bible Society, for a large and valuable present of translations of portions of the Holy Scriptures in the Ojibeway tongue. These will be highly valued, and diligently read by the converted Indians on the different Missions occupied by the Society's Missionaries. The excellency of the gift was enhanced by the courteous and generous spirit shewn in the communications to the Board in making this liberal donation, by the excellent Secretary of that institution, J. S. Howard, Esq. Translations of the whole Bible are much needed; especially with the prospect of extending the mission-field to the north-west territory of the Hudson's Bay Company.

In addition to the Missionaries employed, the Society sustains sixteen teachers, and remunerates nine interpreters.

DOMESTIC MISSIONS.

The esteemed Chairman of the Barrie District, in reporting the state of the Mission under his immediate pastoral care, takes occasion to observe—
“While extensive movements have of late taken place in the civilized world, changing the aspect of nations, and while the great missionary enterprise has been extending its benign and salutary influence, we have

been permitted to witness in this remote section, by the same agency, many brought into a state of happy reconciliation with God. Bread has for years been cast upon the waters, and it now returns with abundant increase. Many have partaken here of the water of life, who we believe will live for ever.

"Sinners during the year have been converted, believers have been established, Sabbath schools have multiplied, houses for public worship have been erected, and a goodly number have been added to the church. Not only on this Mission, but throughout the entire district, the "Spirit has been poured out from on high;" and as this work is emphatically Missionary in its character, to hear of its prosperity and extension must be highly gratifying to our friends who so liberally contribute year after year towards carrying it on.

"Two years ago, when I was appointed to this District, there were within its boundaries ten Missions: there are now seventeen. One of these, recently formed, is on the north shore of Lake Huron, or more properly at the foot of Lake Superior. Having lately, accompanied by Rev. P. Jones, paid a visit to that remote but interesting field of labour, I would observe, that the Mission, although in its infancy, presents aspects of a most pleasing and encouraging character. There are hundreds of Indians in the immediate vicinity, and our esteemed and laborious Missionary, Rev. G. McDugall, has obtained the confidence of the great majority of them, and is eminently successful in reclaiming from vice, and making them sober and industrious. He has already succeeded in forming a class of thirty. We should by all means have what the Indians greatly desire, and what the chiefs in council pressed me to promise them, a *model farm*, at this station; and a church of suitable dimensions ought to be immediately erected. There are great openings for Missionary labour on the north shore of Lake Superior. Having recently visited Lake Superior, for the purpose of observation and inquiry, I have no doubt but should the funds of the Society admit, there might be several successful Missions established in that far-off and hitherto neglected region. I saw a Pagan chief, from the head of Lake Superior, who manifested not only a willingness, but a desire, to have Missionaries sent among his people. There are tens of thousands of Indians between Manitoulin Island and the Red River, and ought it to be told in a Protestant country there is only one Protestant Missionary among all these Indians. The poor people are left to the instruction (if instruction it may be called) of Jesuit priests, and hundreds of them have embraced Christianity in name, knowing nothing of the power of godliness.

"Shall I suggest that an effort be immediately made to carry the gospel to the north shore of Lake Superior. All that is wanted is a few faithful self-denying men, whose hearts God has touched, and means to sustain them for a few years in their work of faith and labour of love. The men are at hand. The means will, I am sure, be forthcoming, for our Christian friends in Canada were never appealed to for assistance of this kind in vain. Let us make an effort, and the work will be accom-

“ Is it asked, who are the men ? I answer, for one, here am I ; send me. And I know of others who would gladly join in the hallowed work of breaking the chains that sin has forged from every Pagan heart in British North America.

“ *Hitherto* to the march of the *Methodist Missionary Society* has been onward ; and as we have always been the first in the field in this country, so we will continue to penetrate into the wigwams of the neglected children of our northern forests, thousands of whom are by their very condition—while they sink down into a cheerless grave, with a more cheerless prospect beyond—saying, ‘No man careth for my soul.’

“ The work among the new settlers, as the reports of the brethren will doubtless shew, presents a most gratifying aspect. Several townships have recently been surveyed. The hardy emigrant has penetrated into the wilderness ; miles of unbroken forest have fallen by the hand of civilization ; roads are being made ; and your missionaries have gladdened the hearts of hundreds of the settlers by finding them, and in their solitary shanties preaching unto them Jesus.

“ The most interesting Missionary meeting we held last winter was in a *shanty*, where for several weeks a most successful revival had been in progress, and where scores had been brought to God. And it may not be out of place to observe, that some of the finest land in Western Canada is now open for sale in the vast country on the south-eastern shore of Lake Huron, on or near the Saugeen river. The country is well watered, and the soil of the finest quality. New settlements are constantly forming, and the demand for additional labourers presses upon us. To supply every remote settlement in this back country with the ministry of the word, is our constant aim, and we anticipate seeing the day when this wilderness shall become a fruitful field.”

C O O K S T O W N .

“ During the past year, the great Head of the Church has favoured us with a degree of spiritual as well as temporal prosperity.

“ The friends of our beloved Zion have (considering their circumstances) contributed most liberally towards the erection of a comfortable parsonage, situated on the town line between Essa and Innisfil, about three quarters of a mile north of the Cookstown post-office. It is surrounded with a beautiful country of verdant hills and fertile vales. Convenient to the parsonage, there is in the course of erection a commodious church, thirty-two feet wide by forty feet long, to be completed by the first of August, ready for dedication to the service of the Redeemer. Friend of sinners, may it never be said of this church that Ichabod is written upon thy walls.

"But let us not look at the 'things that are seen, for they are temporal, but at the things that are not seen, for the things that are not seen are spiritual;' they are therefore eternal. 'The heavens that now are, and the earth, together with the work of men's hands, will eventually pass away; but the spiritual building of God is a house not made with hands, eternal in the heavens.'

"'The Lord has been with us' during the past year, and the 'God of Jacob has been our refuge.'

"Many of the members of our church on this mission are deeply pious, and highly spiritual in their devotional exercises.

"Our quarterly meetings have been seasons of spiritual delight to the people of God, and of deep solemnity to the unconverted.

"During the year we have received on trial, 19; fully admitted, 18; remaining on trial, 1; total membership, 98. Increase, over and above the first quarter's return, 22.

"There are four Sabbath Schools within the bounds of this Mission, connected with our congregations. May He who hath said 'Feed my lambs,' crown these nurseries of piety, and auxiliaries to the church of God, with his presence and his blessing."

"Up to last Conference, a portion of this field of labour has been connected with the Barrie Mission, and enjoyed the labours of Wesleyan Methodist Missionaries, who first published to them the Gospel of the grace of God. The moral soil is not in general very genial to Methodism, though there are several who are warmly attached to it as the church of their affection and choice.

"The severity of the past winter was somewhat unfavourable to our prosperity; the snow was so unusually deep, and the people so scattered, that the congregations were several times prevented from attending the house of God, and protracted services (with two exceptions) could not be engaged in. But still our hearts have been cheered by the Divine presence, and by beholding his arm made bare in saving poor returning sinners, several of whom have joined us during the past Conference year.

I cannot but feel truly grateful to Almighty God, for his infinite goodness in so graciously patronizing a weak and unworthy instrumentality to the edification of his dear people; and also for his special interposition in saving sinners as brands, smoking brands, from everlasting burning. Surely the Lord is good, and his great goodness is clearly known and powerfully felt, through the ever-blessed and glorious Gospel of Jesus Christ. While the Holy Spirit has been poured out from on high, refreshing our people in Toronto and other frontier places, I have been pleased to find that the interior of our country has been visited, and the people of the woods have been refreshed by the same Divine influence. During my travels the past winter, on the Barrie, or what may be called the *back district*, I was delighted, and my heart melted, in listening to the simple tale of many who had been brought to God—brought to taste and feel that God in Christ is truly love. While called upon to plead the cause of Missions, how cheered was I to learn, that several hundreds, through this new country, had lately been converted to God. The reflection struck my mind then, as it does now, that we do not appeal to the people for Missionary money to make an experiment; the experiment has long ago been made, success has resulted, and thus our missions present the most encouraging aspect. If ever the light of the Divine countenance was lifted up upon any human undertaking, I may safely say that it is shining at this time, with all its vitalizing and cheering influence on our Missionary field. Let not our contributors to this blessed work grow weary in well doing. Could they only witness the peace and enjoyment of the lonely bushman, the comfort and delight of hundreds of scattered settlers, though occupying their lonely eots and humble shanties; I say, could our noble-hearted contributors only witness the happiness of these people, conveyed through the instrumentality of our Gospel Missionaries, I am sure that many would double their subscriptions to the Missionary fund.

But while success has attended our labours on the Owen Sound Mission, we have not been without severe trials; indeed we have had to wade through many difficulties during the year. By reason of multiplied and complicated grievances, our people had become proverbial for their trouble. My esteemed Chairman rendered me his very efficient services at different periods, and greatly contributed in restoring peace and order. We have now peace in all our borders.

In regard to the *spiritual state* of our work, it is very promising. A good feeling prevails. Our prayer and class meetings in town and country are well attended, and they are truly refreshing seasons. Our congregations are excellent, and the greatest attention is paid to the gospel message. Methodism here never occupied that position, or exerted that degree of influence, that it does at present. When I first came, there were scarcely a dozen members in town that met in class; and we have now about 40, all prompt in their attendance. In the beginning of the year I found about 70 named on the Circuit record;

our yearly schedule shows that we received 44 ; dropped or removed 16 ; number returned 103 : making a net increase of 33.

"The *financial state* of the Mission is improving. In all, they have paid towards the support of their preacher £23 15s. ; this includes cash, produce, and store pay. They have raised over £16 towards the Mission Fund, about £6 for parsonage furniture, and about £1 10s. for other connectional funds. The friends in town have incurred heavy responsibilities in the erection of a fine stone church, 32 feet by 42. It is to be completed this fall. The ladies also are rendering assistance in its completion, by the formation of the 'Owen Sound Wesleyan Bazaar.' It is very desirable that the Church be finished soon, as it will relieve from the payment of *rent* for the building at present occupied.

"With regard to the *temporal state* of the people, I wish to observe, that all of them being newly settled, they are not able to do much for the support of the Gospel. They must either receive large assistance from the Missionary Fund, or be left without the means of grace. Help them a few years, and they will grow more able ; these new settlements will yet become flourishing and wealthy circuits. Self-interest and love to our fellow man, are motives sufficient to urge the church to sustain the work among these settlers of the forest. These people will help to make laws for Canada—they will help to choose the law-makers. What indeed would be the future destiny of the country, if they are not supplied with the Gospel ? Our written constitution and books of statute law are of little use without the Gospel. The country's good would be sacrificed, morals corrupted, opinions and principles vitiated, if left without the Gospel. A low state of principle would send its reeking corruption into our schools, courts of justice, and parliament, if left without the Gospel. I plead with your Committee, that these new settlers have the Gospel ; that they may rejoice under it, and continue to enjoy it until they themselves are able to support their ministers.

"In conclusion, I may add a few remarks on the *future prospects* of our work in these parts. My anticipations are bright, my faith is strong in reference to the progress of our work in this northern region. Hitherto the work has not been properly followed up, from the want of sufficient sustenance from your funds. From the village of Arthur, extending north forty miles, there has not been a single appointment of a Wesleyan minister ; the ground has been unoccupied by us. Some of the people made repeated applications to me for help, or for a Missionary, and their case was brought up at the Barrie District meeting. The result is, a *new mission* is formed called the 'Durham Mission,' and I am glad that so useful and so devoted a man as Brother Reid is appointed to it. The work will be hard, but God will be his support. There is also a large tract of country between Durham Village and Owen Sound ; the settlements are extending west towards Lake Huron. This is to form the Derby Mission. The Missionary should be sent there immediately. I have often admired the liberality of your Committee towards the Indian Missions, but I have often felt to demur at your strict economy towards the men who work so hard on the domestic missions."

"I thank the God of Missions for spiritual prosperity ; I thank the managers of Missions for competent supplies ; and I thank my Missionary brethren for kind co-operation.

"Great has been the success of the church in the wilderness. In the townships of Albion, Mono, and Mulmur, my acquaintance and countrymen have been made anew in scores of families. Most likely thousands have heard the word with joy, and about 160 of them embraced the truth as it is in Jesus, and then closed in with the Wesleyan Communion.

"Although our local staff in this place is not strong, strong is the arm of the mighty God of Jacob ! Never did we see omnipotent mercy so marvelously displayed, nor a poor people so greatly blessed.

"It is a fact, that our best friends and supporters do not see the gracious results of the Gospel in these back places ; yet heaven and glory will shew that their *pounds, shillings and pence* have not been uselessly lavished, nor their prayers to the Saviour presented in vain.

"It will most likely be the fault of the *soil*, and not the *occupants*, if this field do not yet rise from the dust in manifested benevolence for the favours received. There are more than *three hundred* professing the religion of Jesus Christ on this Mission now."

SABBATH SCHOOL REPORT.

"In both of the Sabbath schools there has been a number of the teachers and scholars made truly happy in the Lord : they are meeting in class, and walking consistently.

"Throughout the year, I made it a point of duty to attend the school every Sabbath, at nine o'clock, to impart information, hear hymns and verses, and always close with a word of advice and prayer. This secured the attendance of both the parents and children, and brought them under the sacred influence of that religion which they afterwards embraced to the glory of God.

"We have made efforts to enlarge the library, by the addition of fifty new volumes. These books are exerting a salutary influence on the morals of both parents and children, and begetting in them a Missionary as well as a Methodistic spirit.

"We greatly felt the want of the little prizes this season, to encourage the juvenile class ; yet they have been called into successful operation, and are bringing in their little annual offerings to the cause of the Lord.

The great increase of attendance has shown to the friends the necessity of larger houses and better accommodations, and preparations are making to build in two places on the Mission."

"In October, 1851, I commenced my labours on this Mission, which embraces parts of four townships, viz., Sunnidale, Nottawasaga, Ospro, and Melancthon; and although it is of some years' standing, yet, to say the truth, when I arrived I found it in rather a distracted condition. There are now five appointments on the Mission, the congregations generally good. There are three classes. Total number of members, 18."

S T. V I N C E N T.

"Another year has rolled round, and therefore the Missionary Board justly expect a report of its doings on the Mission bearing the above name. My colleague and myself entered upon our labour at the close of the Conference in June last. We found the Mission in a prosperous state. Our good Brother Reid stands deservedly high in the estimation of the people amongst whom he laboured the two last Conference years. During the year we have held three 'protracted meetings,' and although we cannot say they resulted in the conversion of souls, yet we can say, that they had a tendency to 'revive' and strengthen our membership, and of reclaiming some who had wandered out of the way, and of establishing the wavering. We are not surprised that our 'protracted meetings' did not result in a general out-pouring of the Spirit, as protracted meetings were held by Brother Reid, during his stay on the Mission, from the 'Dan' to the 'Beersheba' of it. The experience of thirty-six years has taught us, that after a time of general sowing, we may expect a time of 'weeding,' and of 'sifting'; as the seed of the kingdom does not all fall upon good ground, 'but some by the wayside, and the fowls come and devour them up; some fall upon stony places, where they have not earth: and forthwith they spring up, because they have no deepness of earth; and when the sun is up they are scorched; and because they have no root they wither away. And some fall among thorns, and the thorns spring up and choke them.' Only the seed that falls on good ground is productive. We have been under the necessity of dropping a number left us on the class-books, or we should have had a considerable increase in our membership. We have considerable competition on this Mission, as there are *nine* denominations of professed Christians within its limits beside ourselves; hence, on so new a Mission, it is difficult to succeed to the extent that some might imagine.

" This Mission is very hard to work ; the roads are extremely bad the greater part of the year. We have fifteen regular appointments each every four weeks, to meet which we have to travel from 140 to 160 miles each tour, over all but impassable roads. My excellent colleague lost a horse during the year, in consequence of the hard travelling, and can therefore corroborate these statements.

" We have 196 members on the Mission at the close of the ecclesiastical year, being an increase of 6. Our average number of hearers is about 400. We have but one church on the Mission, and that unfinished. We worship principally in private houses. We require another church very much for general purposes ; and we also require a new parsonage, which should be built at Meaford, the only village on the Mission, as it is a central position. But the people appear too much embarrassed in their circumstances to do either the one or the other : they are deeply immersed in debt, and it will be some time before they can liquidate their debts, unless produce be a better price than at present. I believe the friends on the Mission are willing to do what they can in a pecuniary way, but they cannot do much without means. How to raise funds is the question.

" The Mission requires the labour of two Missionaries : but we shall realize nothing by way of 'quartermage.' If they furnish the preachers with board, and fuel for their horses, they will do well."

P R O T O N.

" This Mission embraces a part of the townships of Proton, Melancthon, Artemesia, Glenelg, and Holland.

" There are some unpleasant things connected with this field of moral culture :—a long winter, bad roads, and the want of pasture for a horse.

" The Missionary here is obliged to travel on foot the most part of the year ; not altogether in consequence of the badness of the roads, but because there has been nothing in many places to sustain his horse. In reference to the Missionary, the people are kind, and do what they can to render him comfortable.

" There are many sound zealous Methodists on this Mission, who glory in the cross.

" During the past Conference year, the good Lord crowned the efforts put forth with his saving and sanctifying presence. Many here bless God for the Gospel and a Missionary. This Mission is yet in its infancy, nevertheless it presents a most healthy and encouraging aspect. During the past Conference year, there has been an increase of 106 members.

"How appropriate in reference to us in this section is the language of Holy Writ, 'The wilderness and solitary places have become glad, and the desert buds and blossoms as the rose.'

K I N C A R D I N E.

"It was with mingled feelings that I entered on the labours of this Mission. The badness of the roads, the newness of the place, and only a few members, were calculated to depress the spirits of a Missionary. In reference to this field of moral culture, the Missionary finds himself surrounded with a people of a noble spirit, who are willing to do all they can, to render him comfortable in body and mind. This Mission embraces the townships of Kinocardine, Kinloss, and Huron.

"The past Conference year has been a year of peace and prosperity. Our congregations are good. The moral aspect of the Mission is truly encouraging."

D E V O N S H I R E.

"The work on this Mission, as stated in last year's Report, extends to parts of five townships: that is to say, Stephen, Usborne, Biddulph, McGillivray, Tuckersmith and Hay. It is bounded on the south by the London Circuit, on the west by the unsettled parts of McGillivray, Stephen and Hay, and east by an unsettled part of Usborne, and the Blanshard or St. Mary's Circuit, with Goderich Circuit at the north. But perhaps it will be more satisfactory to give a detailed statement of the particular nature and character of the work in connection with each township separately. I begin with Stephen.

"In this township we have three appointments, one chapel, and another in contemplation, 53 members divided into three classes, respectable congregations, and a growing influence.

"In Usborne we have also three appointments, and calls for a fourth and fifth. We have 21 members resident in the township, some of whom are connected with the classes in Stephen, and the residences of others are so separated by distance, that we find it difficult to organize as yet. The congregations are good, and a good influence prevailing.

"In Biddulph we have two appointments, and one class of 13 members. We preach in three different places. The congregations during the past year have been but middling. A strong current of Episcopacy was set in motion about this time last year, and it has carried away a few of our casual hearers, though it has not in the least diminished our real strength and influence. The members and other friends are really

"In McGillivray, we have two appointments, besides one which has been given up as hopeless, at least for a season : another has been asked for since the opening of spring. We have ten members on the books, resident in the township ; but owing to the want of an efficient leader, together with the distance between the residences of the members, we can scarcely say that we are organized at all. But we have good congregations—some devoted friends—some fresh openings ; and the people who are coming in here, were among our most faithful supporters in the older circuits.

"In Tuckersmith and Hay, we have two appointments and thirteen members. The prospect in the former is not very encouraging ; in the latter it is much more so. During the past winter, the health of the Missionary has been rather delicate ; but he attended *all his regular work*, but could engage in nothing special : and this, with the severity of the winter, and the uncomfortable state of many of the houses in which we worship, made the congregations sometimes rather thin ; but as the spring opened, they have greatly increased, and the Divine presence was in many instances sensibly felt. Our last quarterly meeting was a season of considerable power and comfort.

"I hesitate not to say, that in all our appointments, with efficient labour, the prospect is good."

S T. M A R Y'S.

"Your Missionary has endeavoured to prosecute with fidelity his work on this Mission during the year ; and feels grateful to the Head of the Church to be able to say, that the cause of God is advancing ; not rapidly, however, but gradually. The means of grace are generally well attended, and we have realized seasons of spiritual joy. One of our members died in great peace, viz., Dinah Dukey, the wife of R. Dukey, one of our useful official members. Thirteen members have removed to other parts ; expelled, 4 ; dropped, several : but after all we have a small increase.

"This is a new country, and crops were injured very much by a severe storm of hail last summer ; and last winter being severe, our people, in common with others, have lost much cattle, and consequently are much embarrassed. We experience really hard times, and you must remember us in your prayers, as also to make a liberal appropriation."

G O D E R I C H.

"The people of God, on this Mission, have to contend with many difficulties, particularly from adverse parties, and from unfavourable circumstances. Yet, in the midst of all, we have cause for praise to the Great Head of the Church, for some tokens of good, and for a measure of prosperity. The Holy Spirit has generally accompanied the ministry of the word; some souls have been converted. The congregation in the town is much improved, and the prayer-meetings well attended, so that if we continue to advance as we have done for a few months past, we shall need a new church. A parsonage is much needed. We hope to do something towards it soon. If help in any way could be afforded, it would be thankfully accepted; and perhaps there are few cases in which pecuniary aid can be applied on so small a scale with greater advantage to our economy. The Mission is extensive and extending; so much so, that two men cannot do justice to the cause, especially in pastoral visitation and Sabbath preaching, in all such places as ought to have it. Our case loudly calls for help."

S T R A T H R O Y.

"Although the name and boundaries of this Mission were changed last Conference, yet the operations of the Missionary extend into as many townships as formerly, namely—five: and we cannot say that the change effected by the separation of Warwick, and the attachment of Delaware, London and Ekfrid, has been of any service to the Mission; such alteration having caused only a pecuniary incumbrance to those who have laboured thereon.

"Since our arrival here, we have had to pass through afflictions and difficulties, and to endure privations which we had not anticipated. Perhaps all these are necessary ingredients in the life of a Missionary. 'And why should a living man complain?' Yet here we can raise our Ebenezer; hitherto hath the Lord helped and supported us.

"During the year, one class has been formed, consisting of 11 members; 10 received from other circuits; 8 received on trial; 3 received into full connection; 5 dropped; 6 removed; and 3 put back on trial. Two Sabbath Schools have been organized; and three ten-dollar Sunday School Libraries obtained and paid for. So that amidst discouragements, we have some things to encourage and excite us to increased perseverance.

"By a persevering judicious administration of discipline, accompanying the preaching of the gospel, Methodism will obtain a stability and consistency, for the want of which, in this place, its progress has been greatly impeded, and its influence materially circumscribed."

W A R W I C K .

"On account of the length and badness of the roads, together with sickness in the preachers' families, this Mission (which was formerly a part of Adelaide Mission) was not regularly visited by your Missionaries during the last two years, in consequence of which it was in a very low state, both temporally and spiritually ; and although it is not in as flourishing a condition at present as we could wish, yet I think there has been considerable improvement in both.

"There were 14 admitted on trial during the past year ; 6 admitted from other circuits ; 4 removed ; 1 died, and 14 expelled and dropped. We have now 75 members. There are two Sunday Schools, which number about 50 scholars, with 8 teachers ; and a library, containing 106 volumes.

"This part of the country is settling very rapidly ; the population has nearly doubled in the last two years. It is likely soon to become a very good farming country ; and I have no doubt but it will in a few years repay the Missionary Society for all the money they have expended. Our congregations are generally good ; there has been a great increase in them during the year. The finances of the Mission are tolerable. The Stewards have paid all the expenses, horse-keeping, and board of your Missionary, and £21 12s. 11d. on his salary. We have raised £9 13s. 9d. Missionary money. We have got two church deeds executed, and on record. We have also bought one half acre in the village of Warwick, for the purpose of building a church on it ; it cost £12 10s. We feel very grateful to the Hon. M. Cameron, and Arthur J. Kingston, Esq., for their liberal subscription, which amounted to half the sum. The Governor in Council has been pleased to grant us a park lot, containing seven acres, for the site of a parsonage-house, grave-yard, &c. We have commenced to build ; the frame is up, and we have about enough lumber; but it will be some time before it is completed.

"May the God of the Missionary enterprise still continue to own the labours of his servants."

"It affords me much pleasure to be able to inform you, that the work committed to my trust during the past year is prospering. Unless much mistaken, we can see many signs of improvement. The members are united and encouraged ; congregations increasing ; the circuit expenses fully met ; and the connexional funds are all in advance of any preceding year. The contract for enlarging our church in Port Sarnia is taken, and the work is to be completed by the first of August next. Several

have been hopefully converted to God during the year. Twenty-five have been received by probation and 8 by letter. We have been under the painful necessity of dropping 12 for non-observance of our rules; and ten have removed to other circuits: so that our net increase is only eleven. It has been a year of toil and anxiety; but we dare not repine. Our path has been strewed with unnumbered marks of kindness, both from our Great Master, and the valued friends among whom our lot has been cast.

"Our field is extensive. Besides the work in town, which requires much attention, we have ten appointments in the country, only two or three of which could be taken on the Sabbath. We have taken up three new appointments, which are very promising. A class can soon be organized at Corunna. The country is rapidly improving, and with proper attention it will soon be a very important part of our work."

W A R D S V I L L E .

"We have nothing very special to record. It is to be feared that some amongst us 'have a name to live and are dead.' They are we think as we found them. There have been many invitations to attend Prayer meetings, &c., without much effect. Yet we have reason to believe we have not laboured in vain. The word of God has been regularly and faithfully preached at eight or nine places every two weeks. Other matters, in connection with evangelical labour, have been by no means neglected. From these we are encouraged in knowing a few cases of hopeful conversion, and of a little Divine quickening among some of the members.

"The congregations in Wardsville are greatly improved; and from the manner in which they listen to the word preached, and have given to our Missionary and other funds, and for the erection of a sanctuary in connection with us, the anxious Missionary is fondly led to hope, that they are 'a people prepared for the Lord.'

"The sanctuary referred to is altogether inclosed, and the building committee is only waiting a little to get in the promised adequate subscriptions, to pay the contractors, that they may be warranted in incurring further expense in completing the building for worship.

"While there is but little Wesleyan Methodism on the River Sydenham, we are not without some favourable indications at the principal appointment.

"The class of Indians, numbering 16, with their families, at Moravian Town, have been visited every fortnight during the year. These few poor aborigines have, I think, a decided claim on our sympathies and labours. From their being connected by marriage, and otherwise, with many Indians of some of our Missions, especially the comparatively contiguous one at Muncey Town, and from several other powerful causes,

Besides, we think the Wesleyan Methodist Church would fail in fully discharging the trust, which an all-wise Providence appears to have committed to it, for the purpose of Christianizing and civilizing the mass of the Indians of Canada West.

"The few Indians above referred to have, in a most praiseworthy manner, exerted themselves in erecting a small but neat frame Church, which at once accredits their piety and self-denial, and is an ornament to the locality. The Chairman of the District has kindly engaged to preach the dedicatory sermon in the course of three or four weeks."

BLENHEIM AND STRATFORD.

"This Mission was formed last Conference, of portions of the Dumfries Circuit and Stratford Mission. It includes, in its present form, parts of the townships of Blenheim, Wilmot, North and South Easthope, and Downie, and the town of Stratford.

In Blenheim, the head of the Mission, we have an interesting field of labour. With the assistance of our excellent staff of local preachers, we have service twice every Sabbath in the Blenheim Chapel. The congregation is large and attentive, and many of our people are truly pious and exemplary. In this congregation, there has been a number of conversions during the year. We have also an appointment in the western section of the township, besides three others in the township of

Wilmet, one of which has been recently taken up, and is chiefly kept up by the local brethren.

"Our enterprising friends have erected a comfortable little parsonage in Blenheim, which is occupied by the Mission family, and is not seriously burdened with debt. They have also resolved to build a chapel on the west quarter line, in a new village called Plattville. The contract is to be completed by the first of October. Progress seems to mark the operations of Methodism here; and we are looking forward to the not far distant day, when Blenheim will take her place among the regular circuits of our extensive work.

"In Stratford, our cause is subject to serious disadvantages. The Missionary, residing in Blenheim, a distance of twenty-four miles, cannot devote as much attention to the place as the importance of a rapidly improving country town demands. It seems not only desirable but necessary, in order to advance the interests of Methodism here, to adopt some plan by which regular service can be held in town every Sabbath. Our friends are kind, and the congregations respectable, and it is earnestly hoped that something may be done to promote more efficiently the cause of God in this part of the Mission. We have a small but pious class also in South Easthope, where we have been blessed with a small measure of success. The writer never met with a more affectionate people than he has found on this Mission generally: we have peace in our borders.

"I have received on trial thirty during the year. Our love-feast and communion seasons here have been times of great spiritual refreshing, and we have been enabled to say 'The best of all is, God is with us.'

The attendance is good, especially in Elora. There are 200 members; and about forty conversions. There are three flourishing Sabbath Schools."

"Under circumstances of a very embarrassing nature, we entered upon the toil of the year that is now closing; but notwithstanding the difficulties with which we have been called to contend, God has been with us, owning and blessing the efforts of the weakest of his servants.

"During the year, we have had several seasons in which God has manifested his power to save. Our last quarterly meeting was one of those seasons. The labours of Brother Goodson (who kindly consented to attend) were owned in the salvation of several souls; and his visit will no doubt be remembered through the ages of eternity. We praise God, that after repairing the breaches made by removals, dropped, and withdrawn, we can record an increase of forty-five. To the Lord's name be all the glory. But while our numbers have increased, we are considerably behind last year in pecuniary matters, our friends having been called to suffer in their worldly affairs: the crops for the most part last year were a failure, and very few have enough to supply their own

wants. A number of our friends and best supporters have lost from fifty to one hundred dollars worth of cattle, and are now deprived of many of those things which are so necessary for the support and comfort of the backwoodsman ; but with delight have we heard them, while passing through their time of trial, using the soul-cheering language recorded in the third chapter of Habakkuk, verses 17 and 18. This Mission has a strong claim upon the sympathy, prayers, and support of the friends of the Mission cause ; and while they are enjoying comforts of a worldly nature, let them think of the back settler, and not deny him the ministrations of the word of life."

"The year ending June 1852, is the first during which this has appeared on the minutes as the head of a distinct Mission. Notwithstanding many circumstances to discourage, there have been some to present a cheering and satisfactory aspect. In the village itself, only six members, not meeting regularly in class, were returned ; now there are twenty, every Sabbath enjoying, in addition to public worship, those private means of grace which Methodism offers, and enjoins upon its adherents. H U N G E R F O R D .

" In furnishing a report of the state of the work on the Hungerford Mission, I have only to state, there is but little change since the close of last year. The Mission is in similar circumstances now, to what it was then, as to its religious state, numbers in society, &c. We have had during the year some little prosperity, though far from what we could wish ; but by death and removals, and exclusions from society, we have lost some. Looking over the list, we find the following particulars

respecting numbers:—19 have been reclaimed; 11 have been dropt; 9 removed; 2 have died; leaving 136, which is 2 less than were returned last year.

"There will be no falling off in the funds, except it be a trifle in the missionary. We feel here very sensibly the pressure in money matters; but many of our friends in this part do nobly to sustain the interests of our church. We occupy no more ground than we did last year; and I am well convinced that there is but little prospect of any enlargement of our borders in this direction. There is but one Sabbath School exclusively under our supervision. We still pray for the increasing prosperity of our Zion."

MADOC MISSION.

"This Mission has experienced various changes during the year. The boundaries have been circumscribed, about fifty of its members removed; and the only church on the mission was transferred to the Sidney circuit. Yet there has been no dissatisfaction amongst the members or friends, and I believe most of the changes have wrought together for its good. Aided by my excellent father in the gospel, Stephen Miles, who resides here, and is always ready for counsel or for labour, as far as his health will permit, and the help of a few Local brethren, we have been able to give them Sabbath preaching at all our principal appointments. If all our supernumerary and superannuated fathers and brethren possessed the same spirit, and acted in the same manner as he, in watching over the interests of our church from day to day, it could not be said that their labours were lost when they retired from the itinerant life. During the year we received 40 members on trial, and most of them are now enjoying full membership: 3 were dropt, and 1 died. In our ordinary labours we had sensible manifestations of the divine presence; and at all our quarterly meetings refreshing showers of divine grace descended. But it was in a few protracted meetings that the Lord made bare his arm, and caused the barren wilderness to blossom as the rose, in the salvation of precious souls, who are now happy in the divine favour, and a credit to the church. Although the field is small when compared with what it was last year, yet our funds are all in advance, except the mission fund, the deficiency in which is only a few dollars, and all this after being engaged in the erection of a parsonage house, which I think will be finished about the first of July. This mission is extending its boundaries north, as some fourteen or sixteen have located themselves in the Township of Tudor, and to these your Missionary has preached six times. During the day of his first visit he ministered the word of life to sixteen persons, baptized a child, and married a couple. I believe your missionary has been the only one that has visited them yet. Some of them are members of our church, and I think there is a prospect that we shall soon have a Wesleyan class

W I N C H E S T E R .

"This Mission lies north of the Matilda Circuit, and it embraces the Townships of Winchester, Finch, and a part of Williamsburgh. The village of Winchester is situated on the banks of the Nation River, about twenty miles from the great River St. Lawrence. The inhabitants are of Canadian origin. During the past Conference year we have enjoyed peace. In the fall and winter several protracted efforts have been made, which have resulted in the conviction and conversion of precious and immortal souls, from sin and spiritual death into the light and knowledge of the glory of God in the face of Jesus Christ; the quickening of the old members, the increase of our numbers, and the enlargement of Zion's borders. In the course of the year there have been admitted on probation, 34; removed, 9; dropped, 1; deaths, 2; received, 1: and a class of nine members has been given to the Matilda Circuit. After all deductions, there is an increase of 25 members on the mission.

"In reviewing my field of labour and care the past year, the toils and trials of a Methodist Preacher, through which I have passed, the long cross-ways over and through which I have rode, I see that a kind Providence has brought me safely through. There are some things to regret, and others for which I ought to be humble; but there are many more for which I ought to be thankful; especially for the seasonable drops of mercy that our Heavenly Father has shed upon some parts of his vineyard, which have caused his people to rejoice, and to put their trust in him who is the God and rock of their salvation.

"This is an important and interesting field for missionary enterprise and culture, and it much needs your sympathy and aid in a pecuniary way. The people are still looking to you for the Gospel and the continuance of a Missionary among them, that they may feast on the bread of life and enjoy the blessings of the kingdom of God. They are also praying that the spirit of love and liberality may be poured out upon the Church, that the necessary funds may be raised, and the treasury of the Lord filled. So that our domestic missions may be supported and extended wherever there is a providential opening, even until the wilderness of Canada becomes a fruitful field, and the desert rejoices and blossoms as the rose."

Seeing the cause generally languishing, it was thought best to drop three appointments that were considered of little or no importance to our church, and to form the rest into a two weeks mission. Since that the means of grace have been much better attended and our people more edified. Many of our most worthy members have moved, and are moving away to the fertile lands of the far West. Our congregations are good,—in some places large.”

G A T T I N E A U .

“This Mission extends into the Townships of Masham, Wakefield, Hull, and Templeton. Occasional visitations are made into more remote settlements up the river. The demoralizing influence of the trade is often a matter of pain to the Christian minister. This is not to be seen merely in those who make no profession of religion and regard not the day of the Lord, but

also in some who, for a season, made a creditable profession of the religion of Christ,—absence from the means of grace during the winter season, and placed in circumstances, in other respects, greatly unfriendly to their spiritual welfare. So general is the absence from home during the winter, as to prevent those special efforts so happily and successfully made in the fields of missionary labour. There are some worthy brethren here who love Methodism, and have shown themselves liberal in support of its institutions. The Society is much the same numerically and spiritually."

"This Mission lies about 150 miles to the north of Belleville, in what may be said to be the roughest part of Canada. It includes a part of ten Townships,—nineteen appointments; the most of which can only be attended once in four weeks. The finances are in advance of last year. The membership the same, although some have removed from the Circuit; some have been expelled; and one gone to the Church above, who was occasionally favoured with the ministry of the venerable Wesley."

Though we cannot record much increase, yet, blessed be God, we have no decrease numerically or financially, and peace prevails throughout. I hope for a still better improvement spiritually. I think this almost realized from the glorious aspect the mission presents, in being on the eve of a spiritual revolution, evidence of which is manifest in the penitential tear and sigh, believing act and life, admission of several into the holy fold, 'Church of the living God' the lively interest taken in Sabbath-School instruction, stricter attendance upon his sacred ordinances, and more profitable use of Divine means of grace, by which in healthful melody our Israel, in deep tones of piety in life attests, 'we obtain mercy and grace to help in time of need.' and in death, as valiant soldiers of the cross, as they pass off the field of triumph, breathe out victory! victory! 'victory through the blood of the Lamb!' 'hallelujah, the Lord God omnipotent reigneth!' Having no tabular schedule, I might just say, for the two years past, we have taken into Society 40; dropped 30; expelled 1; withdrawn, 1; removed, 6; deaths, 2; Sabbath Schools, 5; teachers, 25; scholars, 127; hearers, 1020. The Mission extends through Litel-field, Thorn, Clarendon, Bristol, Onslow, and a part of Aidly, a distance, by length of 50 miles, and in breadth 8 miles, a division of which has been recommended by Quarterly Conference to District Meeting, and by District Meeting to Conference.
