

FOURTEENTH ANNUAL REPORT.

The Annual Meeting of the Managers and supporters of this excellent institution was held on Monday, the 9th February, 1874. The chair was occupied by his Worship the Mayor; and among those present were the Lord Bishop of Toronto, the Hon. G. W. Allan, Prof. Wilson, Rev. Prof. Gregg, Rev. J. M. King, Messrs. Hague, McMurchy, Gillespie, and others. After an opening prayer by the Rev. J. M. King, His Worship made a few appropriate remarks, and then called upon the Hon. G. W. Allan, who read the annual report on behalf of the Secretary, as follows:

ANNUAL REPORT.

In preparing the fourteenth Annual Report of the "Boys' Home," the Lady Managers feel that the steady prosperity which has accompanied their labors during the past year leaves them little to record but their deep gratitude to Almighty God for his continued blessing on their work. The health of the boys has been excellent throughout the past year, and though the average number of inmates during that time has never been less than sixty, no epidemic of any kind has visited the Institution. There are at present sixty-six boys in the "Home," in age varying from five to thirteen years. During the year 1873, sixty-two boys have been admitted, of whom seven were orphans, and thirty had but one parent living. During the same period thirty-nine boys were removed by their parents, twelve absconded, and five were sent out on trial to farmers; five were also duly apprenticed during the past year to those with whom they were on trial, making a total of thirty-five boys who are earning their own living, and in most cases giving satisfaction to their employers. The sums of money paid, as by agreement, for these boys during the past year amount to \$193, which has been de-

posed in a Savings bank at interest, for their benefit when their term of service shall have expired, and the total sum now at interest, which has been accumulating for the same purpose since the year 1864, amounts in all to \$1,219.

The numbers, both of boys sent out on trial, and those apprenticed during the year 1873, are small compared with former years, but this is to be accounted for from the fact that the greater part of the inmates of the "Home" during the past year have been of too tender an age to be sent out, though the demand for boys by farmers have been as great as ever. Letters are occasionally received from some of these absent children of the "Home," a few extracts from which may not prove uninteresting, and will tend to show that, though years have passed since they were sent to service, they have not forgotten the kind friends they left behind them in the "Boys' Home." A boy of fifteen writes: "I want to know how you all are. I hope you are all in good health. I have got a happy home. I thank the Lord for it. It is a good change. I have plenty to eat and to wear, not hard work and a good father and mother. I have three coats this winter, three flannel shirts and two pairs of socks. I have not grown very much since I came, but I have grown very stout and fat. I want to know how all the boys are. I send my best respects to Mrs. Munro and all the ladies of the 'Home,' and I am, your humble servant,—JAMES.

Another, who will, in a short time, end his term of service, writes: "I am well, and I hope this will find you the same. I thank you for your kindness in writing to me, and telling me that my brother is well. I hope to pay him a visit when he gets settled and we get through with our hurry

"Yours respectfully, CHARLES."

P.S.—"I go to church and Sabbath School every Sabbath day."

The new system of having the boys all taught in the house by a female teacher, engaged expressly for that purpose has proved highly satisfactory, and the progress made even by some of the youngest children is surprising and very gratifying.

Mrs. Munro still holds the position of Matron in the Institution, and by her continued good management and untiring energy in the fulfilment of her duties, merits the warm approbation of the Managers.

Attention is drawn to the Treasurer's annual financial statement, which will be found, as usual, annexed.

The Committee now turn to the pleasing duty of rendering thanks to all those who, during the past year, have remembered the "Home" with their accustomed liberality and kindness; and foremost among their many friends they would offer their hearty thanks to Dr. Thorburn, whose services have been, as ever, granted freely to the inmates of the Home. To Mr. Samuel Platt they are also much indebted for the handsome donation of \$100, with kindly promises of continued assistance. To the butchers, bakers and others, who have kept the larder of the "Home" well stocked throughout the past year, the Managers cannot too warmly make grateful acknowledgements of their donations, which have saved them the very large outlays they would otherwise have been called on to make.

The Committee also offered their thanks to the Editors of *The Mail and Leader* for gratuitous insertion of matters relating to the Institution during the past year.

In conclusion the Managers would express their hope that this slight review of the work of the past year will prove satisfactory to their many friends and the public generally, and that it will bespeak from them the same encouragement and systematic support that they have ever met with since their humble effort was begun, with much hope and truthfulness, in the autumn of 1859.

MEDICAL OFFICER'S REPORT.

Dr. Thorburn, the medical officer, then made his annual report, which stated that he had much pleasure in informing the Lady Managers of the Home that the health of the inmates during the past year had been remarkably good. There were at that time seventy boys in the institution, many of whom, before admission, had been weakened by disease and poverty—but cleanliness and wholesome diet soon after admission made a great improvement in their appearance and vigour. He could not, however, allow the opportunity to pass without urging upon the Directors the necessity of renewing their efforts to obtain proper drainage to the building. If they did not get this, their future health reports might not be so satisfactory.

The public were indebted to the philanthropic ladies who

devoted so much of their time to the poor boys, and to Mrs. Munro, the excellent matron, for her motherly care of them.

The Rev. Mr. King then moved the following resolution:—“That the Report now read be adopted and printed for the information of subscribers to the Charity, and that the following ladies be a Board of Directors and managers for the ensuing year, viz.:—Lady Patronesses—Mrs. Howland and Mrs. Draper. Directresses—Mesdames McCutcheon, Dunlop, Hodgins, Gzowski, Cozens, Davidson, Ryerson, and Grasett. Secretary—Mrs. Sutherland Taylor. Treasurer—Mrs. R. Gilmore. Managers—Mesdames Baldwin, Beard, Buchanan, Crombie, Cosens, Dunlop, Davidson, Freeland, Grasett, Gamble, Gzowski, Gilmore, Miss Gordon, Mesdames H. Gooderham, Hodgins, S. Heward, Kay, Leslie, Lyman, Leys, McCutcheon, McCulloch, McLean, Misses Michie and Mitchell, Mesdames Manning, Ryerson, Rutherford, Taylor, Wilson, and Miss E. Wilson. Solicitor—Mr. Christopher Robinson. Medical Officer—Jas. Thorburn, M.D., Matron—Mrs. Munro.”

Hon. Mr. Allan seconded the resolution in a few well-chosen remarks.

The Bishop of Toronto then moved:—“That the continued success and prosperity that have accompanied the labours of the managers during the past year call forth feelings of deep gratitude to the Giver of all good and fervent prayers for continued guidance and support in the time to come.”

The resolution was seconded by Mr. McMurchy, and declared carried.

Prof. Wilson then moved, “That the renewed evidence of the good work effected by the Boys’ Home during the past year, and the increasing number of claimants on the charitable services of the Institution, constitute urgent claims on the liberality of all who recognise the duty of caring for the deserted and orphaned children of this community.” In moving the resolution, Prof. Wilson referred to the trouble and inconvenience caused by the neglect of persons who subscribe to the institution to send in their subscriptions, thereby putting the ladies to the extra trouble of making a second call to collect the same. Such subscriptions if given freely seemed to carry with them a double blessing.

The motion, which was seconded by Rev. Prof. Gregg, was declared carried.

A vote of thanks was passed to the Mayor for discharging the duties of Chairman, and the proceedings were brought to a close by the Bishop of Toronto pronouncing the benediction, and the children of the Home singing a hymn.

OBJECT OF THE BOYS' HOME.

Duties of the Board of Management and Officers.

The Institution is open to the boys of the ages mentioned in second Rule of the Regulations, the claims of admission being the utter friendlessness of the applicant, or being a child of drunken and dissolute parents; the object of this Institution being the prevention of juvenile crime, by training these poor outcasts in the nurture and admonition of the Lord.

The management is vested in a Committee of Ladies, chosen from the Subscribers, at the Annual General Meeting, in September of each year; said Committee to consist of thirty members, from among whom eight shall be chosen as Directresses; and among them there shall be a first and second Directress, Treasurer, and Secretary.

The first Directress, or in her absence one other Directress, shall preside at the monthly meetings, audit and sign the act counts presented for that purpose by the Treasurer, propose and declare the resolutions, and sign the minutes of each preceding meeting.

The Treasurer shall receive and keep an account of all moneys belonging to the Institution, as also the earnings of all the boys, a separate account of which must be kept with each. All the accounts must be presented each month, at the meeting of the Managers, for the signature of the first Directress, or in her absence, the Lady presiding.

The Secretary shall conduct all the correspondence of the Society; keep a list of the names, ages, and peculiar circumstances, as far as practicable, of all the boys, in a book provided for that purpose; attend at each monthly meeting, take the names of those present, minute the proceedings in a book, which must be read at each ensuing meeting, and be signed by the presiding Lady.

Two members of the Committee, in rotation, shall visit the "Home" daily each week; inspect the house; ascertain from

the Matron the conduct of the boys, and enter a report at the weekly meeting on the Monday.

The Weekly or Finance Committee shall consist of the Directress, Treasurer, Secretary and two of the Committee, who shall have been appointed to purchase or otherwise obtain the necessary clothing for the boys. Five shall form a quorum, and their order shall be sufficient authority to the Treasurer to advance the money requisite for the above purpose, or such things as may be considered necessary for the "Home."

The General Committee shall meet on the second Monday in the month, at three o'clock p. m.. Each meeting shall be opened with prayer. The minutes of the preceding meeting having been read and signed, the vouchers of the Treasurer produced and signed, the Secretary shall inform the meeting of any correspondence that has taken place during the last month, and the first Directress shall put before the meeting such resolutions as may be put into her hands, take the votes, and declare the decision. Seven shall form a quorum; and when a tie arises, the presiding Lady shall give the casting vote. All admissions that have taken place during the past month shall either be ratified or disallowed, at the discretion of the meeting.

As soon as the meeting is opened, all conversation not addressed to the presiding Lady, shall be pronounced by her to be out of order, and stopped.

RULES AND REGULATIONS OF THE

BOYS' HOME

I. The Matron shall be competent to take charge of all the boys; to conduct the household affairs generally; to admit applicants with the doctor's certificate, subject to the approval of the Weekly Committee; and she shall daily see to the personal cleanliness of each boy, and every morning and evening conduct family prayer.

II. Boys from the ages of 5 to 14 are admitted as inmates, and none shall be placed in a permanent situation until he has been one year in the Institution. This rule may be suspended under peculiar circumstances, at the discretion of the Managers.

III. The boys shall rise at six a. m. from 30th April to 30th September, and at seven a. m. from October to 1st May; the time for going to rest being from six to eight p. m. Their meals to be at regular hours—Breakfast at eight a. m., Dinner at twelve, and Tea at half-past five p.m. Grace to be said before and after meals, by one of the elder boys; and all hours not occupied by such meals, or by instruction, to be employed, under the supervision of the Matron, in bodily exercise, house cleaning, or in play.

IV. All the boys shall regularly attend Sunday School, and also Divine Service, in a Protestant church, every Sunday, in charge of the Matron; and in the afternoon receive such religious instruction as can be given by the Matron, or any visiting friend to the Institution.

V. The charge for each boy of parents, or friends, who are able to pay, shall be \$2.00 per month, unless an exceptional case shall occur. If more than one boy of the same parent or friend gains admittance, a reduction shall be made, as approved of by the ladies of the Weekly Committee.

VI. Prompt and implicit obedience must be given to the orders of the Matron.
