We were discussing the reason for his failure the other day. There are only two butcher shops in our section of the town and it really seems as if there ought to be trade enough to support them both more than comfortably.

Molly, the little stenographer lady, advanced the suggestion that it might be because he always cut off a pound or so more than you asked for. Her mother, she said, was always scolding because he did that.

"But the other man does that, too," someone protested, "and he seems to be getting along all right."

Train of Pullman Cars

Collide With Passenger Train on Pennsylvania Railroad—8 People Killed Outright and 20 Seriously Injured.

Upper Sandusky, Ohio, Dec. 24.—In a collision between passenger train No. 15 and an express on the Penna. Railroad at Attica, Ohio, eight miles east of her to-day, at 2 a.m., eight people were killed outright and 20 seriously injured.

The wreck occurred on a curve, and the two trains crashed into each other head on.

Engineer Kreggs, of Fort Wayne, Ind., of the express train, and fireman Miller, of Crestline, Ohio, were killed.

The express consisted of all Pullman cars, and was running from New York to Chicago.
