**SON'S REPLY SAID TO BE SATIS-

The War Vessels Will Return to Their

LONDON, Jan. 10.—It is semi-officially stated that Lord Salisbury regards the reply of the British government to the latest British note relative to the Anglo-Franco dispute concerning territory in East Africa as affording the basis for an amicable settlement of the trouble. All the political groups in the House of Commons are of the opinion that the Serpa Pinto incident will not retard the two governments in reaching a satisfactory agreement.

Peace Assured.
LONDON, Jan. 10.—It is reported from Gibraltar that the British fleet will on Tuesday resume the original program of operations in the Mediterranean. From this it is inferred that the dispute with Portugal is settled.

The Prohibition Resolved.
LONDON, Jan. 10.—The Portuguese Government has forbidden the reception at Oulissiana near the mouth of the Zambezi of all British dispatches intended for England, but not intended to pass through the Portuguese post office. This prohibition is now removed. It is denied that Denmark has offered to mediate between England and Portugal.

THE PLANK ROAD.
Colder Weather—Frees a Slight Improve-
ment in the Road.

NEW YORK, Jan. 10.—Special telegrams to Bradstreet's note the temporary appearance of colder weather, followed at important western cities by a moderately improved distribution of clothing, boots and shoes and grocery staples. The gain is not large. Leather and lumber are quiet, and cattle and wool, with freer receipts, tend to weakness at western centers. Mercantile collections generally are slow, and the immediate outlook is not for material improvement. At the West Indian, corn is moving with freedom, but South American products are shipped with less freedom, notably cotton. Hog products have been more active, with firm or steady prices, and in some instances slight improvement by tight money last week and this week.


