## PURE WATER FOR TORONTO.

An Underground River To Supply Us With a Pure, Cool and Unadulterated Article. The York County Waterworks (Ltd.) will make a definite proposition at the next meeting of the council to supply the city with pure water taken from the allege underground river to the north of the city limits. It is proposed to start with a supply of five million gallons in about three supply of five million gallons in about three months' time; to increase the supply from time to time within two years until enough is given; to deliver the water at Cottingham-street, to increase the pressure down town from about 65 to 125. 
