THE STRIKE IS NOT YET OVER

DABS OFFER TO CALL IT OFF IS REUSED.

The Managers Refuse to Have Anything to Do With the Strike. The Federated Labor Will Not Assist—The Disposition of the Riotous Mob in California—Two Men Shot Down.

CHICAGO, July 13.—Eugene V. Debs, who ordered the great railroad strike, made one more ineffectual attempt looking to a settlement today. He drew up a proposition to the general managers agreeing to have the men return to work at once provided they are reinstated without prejudice. The proposition was taken to Mayor Hopkins, who presented it to Chairman S. J. John of the General Managers Association. The association was not in session, but after individual conferences had been consulted it was returned to Mayor Hopkins without answer and with information that no communication or reply to the proposition would be received or considered by the Managers' Association. The refusal of the general managers to consider the proposition was a decided setback to the union.

Compensates Refused Assistance. Early in the day the action of President Cleveland had been hailed by the labor men as a victory for them. They claimed that they had obtained for the first time a recognition of the principle of arbitration by the residents of the United States. The strike leaders then looked for a settlement. They had only the alternatives of unconditional surrender or a fight to the bitter end. The latter and claim the strike is as strong as ever in spite of what the railroad managers say.

Authorities Apprehensive. They claim to be able to make it still more effective. They declare that today's action of the managers will solidify their ranks. They say that many who have been out for several days will be brought in half a dozen hours. The danger, they believe, is not in the strike itself, but in the resort to violence by some of the more excitable of the strikers or by the mob which has gathered among them in authority. The guard-line was today extended into the street, and was now allowed on the streets in front of the building. It is said United States secret service detectives are extending the lines to guard against the use of dynamite.

The Managers May Be Induced. The railroads operated their principal passenger trains today, and moved some freight. Meetings were held in the afternoon by the federal grand jury officials instructing the grand jury to investigate the strike. It Means War to the Death. President Debs was asked by a reporter if he had said the strike was off. He replied: "That statement is a pure fabrication and has caused harm to our cause. I told you that the strike had been called off, but nothing could be said to indicate that the strike was off. I am in favor of doing to end this strike. I am stronger today than ever, and the danger to the country from this time will be organized labor to make a strike of the whole country."

Strikes of all the A.R.U. men employed on the Chicago, Milwaukee and St. Paul and the Chicago and North-western railroads threatened. It was ordered to return to work. The case will be summary dismissed today from the service of the Northwestern Company of 33 union strikers and seven engineers, one fireman and seven brakemen on the St. Paul road.

The Commission Has No Power to Arbitrate. WASHINGTON, July 13.—The commission appointed by President Cleveland will have power to investigate and report only, not to arbitrate. The arbitration proposed by the union is a written contract of both parties to the controversy, and then provide for the selection of one person by the railroad company, one person by the employees, and two to select a third, who are to be constituted a board of arbitration. It contains defined duties and powers.

Turkey Continues to Shake. CONSTANTINOPLE, July 13.—The shock of earthquakes which was felt in this city at 4:15 Thursday afternoon equalled in severity any of the seismic manifestations which preceded it, and affected a large area of territory. The greatest damage was done in Adrianople and Imit, respectively 137 and 56 miles from this city. The one in a northwesterly direction and the other southwesterly. Crops Suffering From Drouth. MONTICELLO, N.Y., July 13.—The uncommonly dry weather which is prevailing in Sullivan County has injured the crops. Hay harvesters find less than a half crop, and that in some sections is pronounced to be almost worthless. The only crop which promises anything like its former quantity is corn. Harvesting has not yet begun. For the last two weeks to lay the dust, and the heat the greater part of that time has been intense and the thermometer registering from 85 to 90 degrees.


