



Mr. 6. A. Howland ou Cuba.

Before Lodge Commercial, S.O.E.B.S., Mr. O. A. Howland lectured on Saturday night on Cuba. The paper was a very exhaustive one, but treating, as it did, of almost every phase the question presents, it proved most interesting. The lecturer considered that if the President's original message was taken as a casus belli in Spain, the United States would be exonerated. He treated of the attitude of Grover Cleveland on the Venezuelan Commission as opposed to the forced stand of McKinley in delivering the ultimatum, of the great import to Canada of the conflict, which he considered, after a victorious navai battle had been bought, and the States gaining a footing in the Philippines, would best end for the Yankees by their relinquishing any claim on Cuba.

"McKinley," said he, "should have made the Maine question the most important element at the outset, and forced Spain to answer as to whether through Congress an enquiry should be made by her in America. If her answer was negative the United States would be exonerated." Mr. O. A. Howland on Cuba.



The phenomenal appreciation of Wednesday, Thursday and Friday in the price of wheat on the world's markets was followed by further sensational gains yesterday (Saturday). At Chicago May wheat sold at \$1.70 and closed at \$1.67, while the July line innished at \$1.06%. These figures represent advances in the two respective lines of 17c and 5%c for the day; 40%c and 11%c for the week and 6ic and 20%c for the past six weeks. On other American markets May wheat, during the day's session, rose in sympathy as follows: 16%c at New York, 18c at Toledo, 20c at Detroit and 18c at Duluth. In Liverpool the net appreciation for the session was 30 in the May line and 4% in July. Paris reached 55 to 75 centimes.

The chief factor in the strength of the cereal is the unusual and unexpected large European demand, which has caused France and Italy to remove their large Import duties on breadstuffs. The French inpost is equivalent to 38 cents a bushel and the Italian rather less. Both are practically prohibitive, and their suspension opens to America two rich markets that have been in effect closed hitherto. The scarcity of food in Spain, it is expected, will lead to a suspension of the duty in that country also, and there is moreover some talk of Germany and Austria following suit. On top of all this is the news that Russia, North America's greatest European rival in feeding the world, finds her grain supply so short that exports have been forbidden. All this means handsome profits to holders of grain in Canada and the United States, and while Leiter and other big operators who have control of quantities of the cereal stand to make the most money, farmers in this country who have more or less grain in store will also share in the winnings.
