Repair It as a Local. The Mayor thinks that the question of repairing the bridge as a local improvement might be worthy of consideration.

The Corporation Council says that the city has no legal responsibility in the matter, as the bridge is outside the city limits. All that can be done at present, Mr. Fuller adds, is to warn people of the danger they run every time they cross the structure.

An Unsanitary Slip. The Medical Health Officer has again drawn attention to the bridge on the Berkeley-street slip. Some time ago he reported that sludge was blocking the mouth of the sewer, and that it was dredged. This was not done and he has written the City Engineer about the matter.

Mayor to Go to Detroit. Mayor Howard leaves in a day or so for Detroit to attend the celebration there of the founding of the city. He will afterwards go to New Brunswick and will be absent for about 10 days. When he returns he will commence the investigation into the charges made against the Works Department in the report.

Garbage Collection Semi-Weekly. Next week sanitary arrangements for garbage will be made through the city. It will last for two months, and 10 extra carts, which will cost about \$1800, will be required to do the work.
