POSTAGE RATES ON LETTERS AND PAPERS.

Letters addressed to places in Canada and United States—2 cents per ounce or fraction thereof.

The United Kingdom, Aden, Ascension, Bahama Islands, Barbadoes, Bermuda, British Central Africa, British East Africa, British Guiana, British Honduras, British India, British North Borneo (including Labuan), Cape of Good Hope, Ceylon, Cyprus, Falkland Islands, Fiji, Gambia, Gibraltar, Gold Coast Colony, Hong Kong, Jamaica, Lahore, Lagos, Leeward Islands, Malay States, Mauritius, Malta, Natal, Newfoundland, Niger Coast Protectorate, Niger Company's Territories, Sarawak, Seychelles, Sierra Leone, Straits Settlements, St. Helena, Tobago, Trinidad, Turk's Island, Uganda, Windward Islands and Zanzibar, 2 cents per half ounce or fraction thereof.

All letters to countries not mentioned above—5 cents per half ounce or fraction thereof.

Registration of Letters—

Newfoundland.5c. each letter	To the United Kingdom.5c. each letter

These registration fees are, of course, in addition to the postage and must be prepaid by registration stamp.

Parcel Post.—The following rates are for the transmission of Parcels in Canada:—

Not exceeding $\frac{1}{4}$ lb. 6cts.	Not exceeding $\frac{3}{4}$ lb. 18cts.
Not exceeding $\frac{1}{2}$ lb. 12cts.	Not exceeding 1 lb. 24cts.
Each additional 4 oz., 6 cts.	

Parcels for Canada 6cts. for 4 oz., and must not exceed 5 lbs. in weight nor 2 feet in length by 1 foot in width or depth. They may be registered for a fee of 5 cents.

Parcels for the United Kingdom must be prepaid 16 cents for the first pound and 12 cents for each additional pound, and must not exceed 11 pounds in weight, nor 2 feet in length or 1 foot in width or depth. A Customs Declaration of the contents and value of each parcel addressed to the United Kingdom must be filled up at the Post Office by the sender. Parcels for the United Kingdom are forwarded by Canadian Steamers only.

Money Orders to Canada—All Money Order Post Offices in Ontario, Quebec, New Brunswick, Nova Scotia, Prince Edward's Island, Manitoba and British Columbia, are authorized to draw Money Orders on each other for any sum up to \$100, and for as many orders of \$100 each as the applicant may require, upon the following terms, viz.,—

THE QUEEN AND THE ROYAL FAMILY.

THE QUEEN—**VICTORIA**, of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, Queen, Defender of the Faith, Empress of India. Her Majesty was born at Kensington Palace, May 24th, 1819; succeeded to the throne, June 20th, 1837, on the death of her Uncle, King William IV.; was crowned June 28th, 1838; and married February 10, 1840, to His late Royal Highness Prince Albert, **PRINCE CONSORT**, who was born August 26th, 1819, and died December 14, 1861. Her Majesty is the only child of His late Royal Highness Edward Duke of Kent, son of King George III. The children of Her Majesty are:—

Her Imperial Majesty Victoria Adelaide Mary Louisa, **PRINCESS ROYAL**, Empress Frederick of Germany, born November 21, 1840, and married January 25, 1858, to Frederick, Crown Prince of Prussia, afterwards (March to June, 1888) second German Emperor, who died June 15, 1888, and has issue four sons, the eldest William, the present German Emperor, and four daughters.

His Royal Highness Albert Edward, **PRINCE OF WALES**, born November 9, 1841; married March 18th, 1863, Alexandria of Denmark (Princess of Wales) born December 1, 1844, and has issue: *Albert Victor*, Duke of Clarence and Avondale, born January 8, 1864, died January 14, 1892; George Frederick Earnest Albert, Duke of York, born June 3, 1865, married July 6, 1893, to Princess Victoria Mary (May) of Teck, and has issue a son Edward A. C. G. A. P. D., born June 23, 1894, the third in direct line of succession to the throne, Albert F. A. G., born December 14, 1895, and Victoria Alexandra Alice Mary, born April 25, 1897; Louisa Victoria Alexandra Dagmar, born February 20, 1867, married July 27, 1889, to Alexander, Duke of Fife; Victoria Alexandra Olga Mary, born July 6, 1868; Maud Charlotte Mary Victoria, born November 26, 1869, married July 22, 1896, to Prince Charles, second son of Crown Prince of Denmark; and *Alexander*, born April 6, died April 7, 1871.

Her Royal Highness *Alice Maud Mary*, born April 25, 1843, married July 1, 1862, to Prince Frederick Louis of Hesse (afterwards Louis IV., Grand Duke of Hesse), and died December 14, 1878; having had issue two sons, one the present Grand Duke of Hesse, and one accidentally killed, also five daughters, one of whom married November 26, 1894, the Czar of Russia, Nicholas II.

His Royal Highness Alfred Ernest Albert, Duke of Edinburgh, born August 6, 1844, succeeded his uncle, the elder brother of Prince Albert, as Duke of Saxe-Cobourg-Gotha, August 23, 1893, married Her Imperial Highness the Grand Duchess Marie, of Russia, January 23, 1874, and has issue two sons and three daughters.

Her Royal Highness Helena Augusta Victoria, born May 25, 1846; married to H. R. H. Prince Frederick Christian Charles Augustus of Schleswig-Holstein-Sonderburgh-Augustenburg, July 5, 1866, and has issue, three sons and two daughters.

Her Royal Highness Louisa Caroline Alberta, born March 18, 1848; married March 21, 1871, to the Marquis of Lorne, eldest son of the Duke of Argyll.

His Royal Highness Arthur William Patrick Albert, Duke of Connaught, born May 1, 1850; married March 13th, 1879, to Princess Louise Margaret, daughter of the late Prince Frederick Charles of Prussia, and has issue one son and two daughters.

His Royal Highness *Leopold George Duncan Albert*, Duke of Albany, born April 7, 1853; married April 27, 1882, to Princess Helen of Weldeck, and died March 28, 1884, having had issue one son and two daughters.

Her Royal Highness Beatrix Mary Victoria Feodora, born April 14, 1857; married July 23, 1885, to Prince Henry of Battenburg, who died January 20, 1896; and has issue three sons and one daughter.

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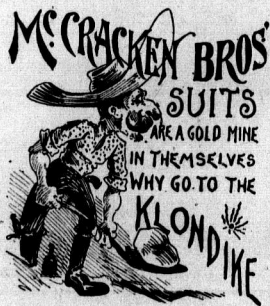
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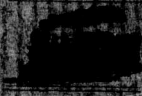
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
