Coming to the sources of tubercular infection, he mentioned the various theories that it was congenital, due to dust or moist sputum, and said that while there was truth in all of them, the commonest source was house contagion from tubercular surroundings. In diagnosing latent forms of the disease, he said that the X-ray was the most important means of discovering it.
Finally he spoke on the subject of the Sub


